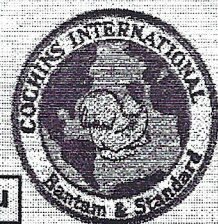






Report from the President's perch...

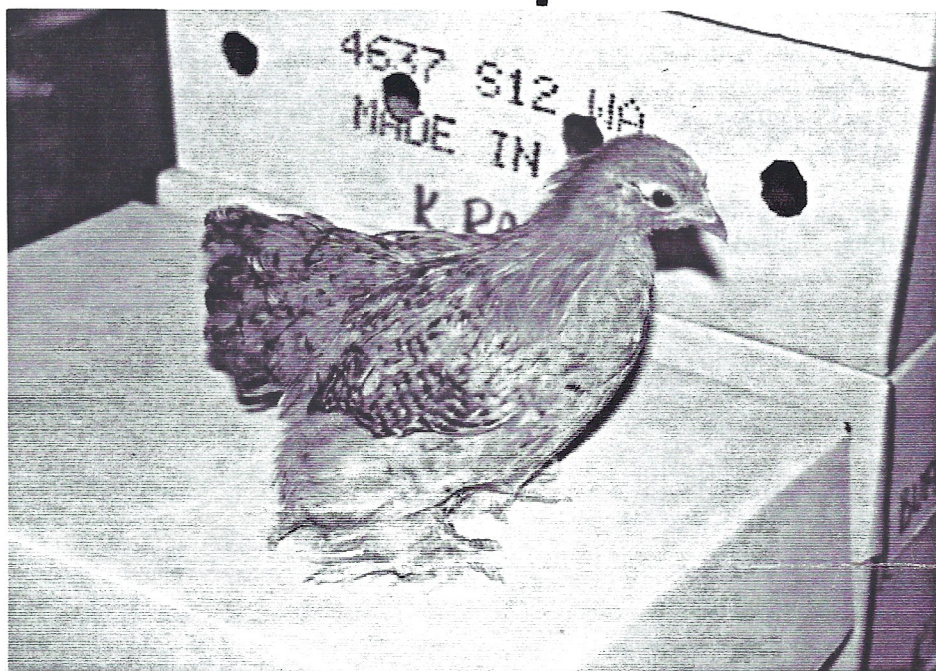

Dear Cochin International Members and Friends;

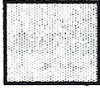

WANT TO INCREASE YOUR HATCHABILITY? KEEP TURNING!

I was having a problem with hatchability. This year I was only getting 75% to 85% hatching. I am usually at 95%. I remembered something a friend of mine told me one time. Don't take the eggs off of the turner on the 18th day. Better to wait until the 20th day. Whose my friend? Dr. John Skinner former Professor of Poultry Science at UW Madison. So I gave it a try. I kept them on the turner until someone pipped, then removed them to the hatching area. Last two batches have been 100%. I think that's great especially since I think hatchability decreases toward the end of the hatching period. Remember, that hen has been using up a lot of her reserves to lay all those eggs. Give it a try but be careful that no one hatches on the turner!

For those of you who have questions about the master points process.... I hope the following example clarifies!

Points are first awarded to both BV & RV of each color... but only if there is a minimum of 5 entries. One point is awarded for each multiple of 5. Therefore it *seems* Jim won:

Black bantam: 8 pts. for BV
8 pts. for RV
(44 divided by 5=8+)

Because Jim won both he is awarded 16 points for Black bantams. However, he also won BB and RB with the same 2

blacks. So the points awarded is really 42 not 16. (107 divided by 5=21, times 2 because he won both BB and RB). Unfortunately, we aren't finished yet! The BB black bantam pullet went on to be best overall cochin beating the standard BB. Sooooo.... Jim's final tally of points for his black bantam entry was:

Black p: 24 points earned

You do not add points for each "stage" win. You only receive the largest number won.

BV win: 44/5=8 canceled
 BB win: 107/5=21 canceled
 Overall win: 124/5=24 earned!

Black k: 21 points earned

RV win: 44/5=8 canceled
 BV win: 107/5=21 earned!

Jim ends up with a total of 45 points added to his master points black bantam total. Quite a win indeed.

White bantams:

BV: Wolfe 7 pts earned
 RV: Wolfe 7 pts earned

Blue bantams:

BV: Krueger 1 point earned
 RV: Krueger 1 point earned

Barred bantams:

BV: Fox 1 point earned
 RV: Krausse 1 point earned

Mottled, Sil. Laced, Part., and Frizzle. no points awarded.

Buff standards:

BV: Justice 3 points earned
 RV: Clark 3 points earned

Brian's buff standard pullet did not earn any additional points for BB standard because buff was the only color entered in standards.

Moral: To win lots of points you "gotta" win that BB or BV! Hope this helps understand the program. kr.

MONITORING TO CONTROL NORTHERN FOWL MITES

The northern fowl mite is a small, pinhead-sized mite that feeds on the blood of chickens and other birds. Its short life cycle of seven to ten days from egg to adult enables populations to build up rapidly. Large populations can reduce egg production by two to four percent; more in extreme cases. Heavy infestations can also reduce semen production in males, reducing hatchability in breeder flocks.

Northern fowl mites are commonly found in both commercial and small flocks. They are normally controlled through applications of insecticides onto the birds. Check your local feed mill or poultry supplier for insecticides that are currently approved, and follow the directions. It is important to maintain the correct concentration of the insecticide. A second application is usually recommended after ten days when the birds are infested. This application should kill any mites that hatched out of eggs on the birds after the effect of the first application had diminished. Mites may develop a tolerance to specific insecticides.

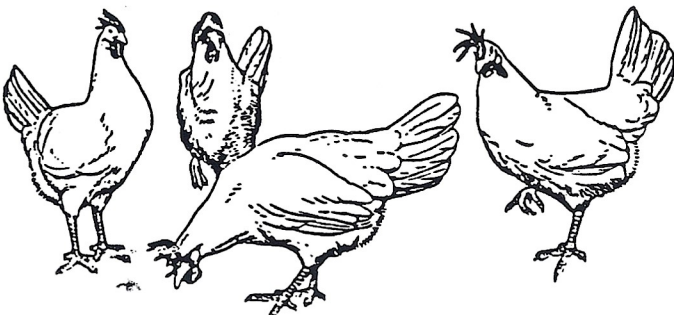
Monitoring the flock(s) for mites every two to three weeks will help prevent losses in egg production. Pick up birds randomly and quickly part feathers around the vent area. Look for small black moving specks on the skin and feathers. Heavy infestations are easily spotted by the large number of mites present and by damaged feathers. You may see them on eggs in the nests or at the cages.

Prevention is an important part of mite control programs. You should first be aware that mites can survive for long periods of time while off of the birds. About ten percent of the mites survived from eight to 34 days in a survival trial using temperatures ranging between 40 and 70 degrees F., and at 20 to 100% humidity. Some survived for up to 50 days. This potential for survival shows the need for good cleaning and proper control practices.

A number of steps can be taken to prevent getting mites in a new flock:

1. When poultry is in more than one facility on a farm, try to isolate new flocks from any currently infested houses. Reduce movement between houses as much as possible, and enter the infested house(s) last. Change or wash boots, gloves and coveralls before going into the clean areas. Moving egg flats can spread mites from house to house.
2. When an infested flock is being replaced, a full cleanout and insecticide treatment will be needed to prevent mite carry-over to the new birds. Make sure all trash and feathers are removed from the floors/cages and outside the building. Clean the building with pressure washing and disinfectant; then treat all surfaces with an approved fly control product.
3. Most movement of mites to new flocks is probably within the system, but wild birds and rodents are also potential sources. During the spring and summer, check the outside of the house for potential bird nesting sites, especially under ledges and near intake vents. Maintain a good rodent control program. Eliminate overgrowth of grass, weeds and brush from the area adjacent to houses to help reduce the rodent and wild bird problems.

News on Columbian Bantams:

In the last Newsletter my request for sources of Columbians didn't generate any response. I've concluded that Columbians are scarce to non-existent.

I had previously been in contact with Bruce Robinson, Springville, N.Y. who raised quite a good brood this past season. He brought a group to the N.E. Congress Show and I took two pair. They are the best Columbians that I have seen in the northeast. Type is good, above average for this variety, but the pattern needs work. Both sexes have excess black in the back and saddle. However, from the breeder's standpoint this is preferable to a deficiency of black. In my opinion it is simpler to reduce black than to enhance it.

Karl Rau (S. China, Maine) has also obtained Columbians from Bruce but he had previously produced some on his own through some judicious crossing. We plan to blend these birds and see if we can make this pattern viable.

For anyone interested in creating/improving this variety, I would suggest the following (emphasis on suggest). If no Columbians are available, try a White x Birchen cross, some whites carry the columbian factor and the birchen pattern has similarities to columbian. If mediocre Columbians are available, try one of these crosses: Columbian x Birchen (1st choice), Columbian x White (2nd choice), Columbian x Black (3rd choice).

If from any of these crosses you produce birds with white breasts, silver/gray backs and laced hackles, mate them together and a certain percentage of acceptable Columbians should result.

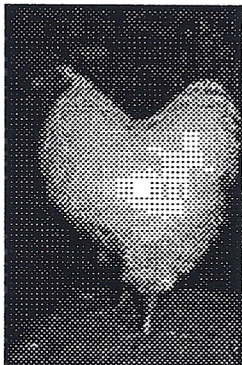
It's tempting to introduce Light Brahma, but it's a long pull to recover the thigh feathering and the soft tails of the Cochinchina. Maybe at a later time a Brahma could be introduced when it seems that type has been established. A Brahma would be useful to sharpen up the lacing on the hackles and male saddles.

I wouldn't spend any time trying to improve the type of mediocre birds by mating Columbian x Columbian. I've tried that scheme and it's a losing battle. If you could produce 300-400 chicks each year for 4-5, well maybe it would work but few of us have that sort of set-up.

If you have had any experiences trying to produce Columbians I would like to hear about your results. Sharing information is the only way to progress.

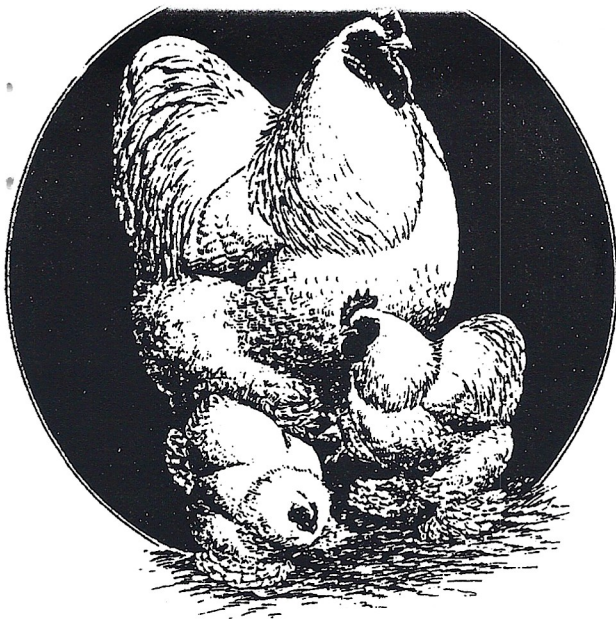

Dear Mr. Warnshuis,

Thank you for membership in Cochins Interenational. I am honored that you (Europeans) see U.S.A as the motherland of cochins. It is a popular breed in America, however the Old English Game Bantam is by far the most popular breed shown. I too was a member of the former World Cochin Family (for promotion of large fowl as well as bantams) as well as a member of the former U.S. Cochin Bantam Club, also defunct. The down fall of each organization was lack of cooperation, and lack of record keeping. The current club Cochins International promotes both bantams and standards world wide. We currently have over 225 members and are gaining members weekly. We have several seven U.S. districts, and an International District. Bernice MaClaren (RR 4 Stephens Bay, Bracebridge, ONT P1L-1X2) is the International Director. It would be great to have a Cochin International National Show in Europe. I encourage you to write the president of Cochins International - Mrs. Pat Lacey (W 5055 US Hwy 10, Neillsville, WI 54456) and request a National Show. Cochins International needs to know things like prize monies offered, trophies, building space, number of cochins shown etc. The shows that Cochins Internatioal (CI) promotes are Regional, District, and National. I have included information on each type of show. The overall parent clubs of poultry are goverened by the American Poultry Association (APA), and The American Bantam Association (ABA) and only certain colors are recognized. Each of these clubs have books which list recognized colors and I don't currently have the list. The books are: APA Standard, and ABA Standard. Also both APA and ABA both have small books for sale relating to all breeds of poultry, however most are outdated. The CI is currently asking for our members to submitt articles to write a new book on Cochins. Since our members are not writers we will have some review and edit all articles before printing in the Cochin Book. As I understand in Germany there are many more colors of birds than in the United States. One man you may contact is Mr. Heinz Josef Lorz, Scheffelstra 75, Offenbach 1M 6307A, West Germany. I am sending a list of our members so you may contact them to obtain eggs. I feel that you will have many problems obtaining eggs because all "good" cochin breeders artifically breed their birds so therefor fertile eggs are at a premium. As you know birds with good fluff have difficulty in breeding. I don't know of anyone who regularly sells cochin eggs for this reason.

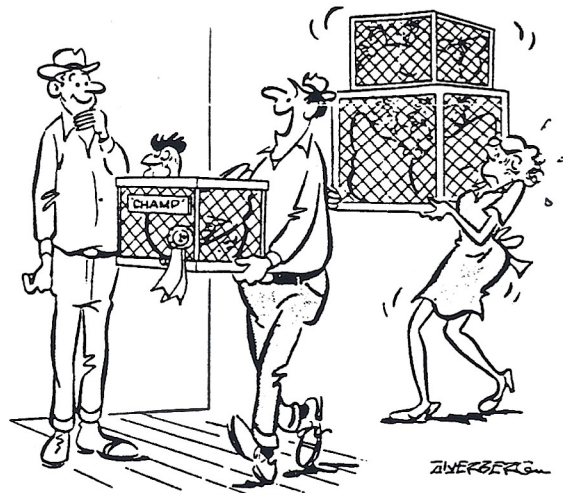

While most chickens are crammed into tiny cages and raised strictly for meat, Kay's cluckers are pampered like princesses so they score well at exhibitions.

First, they're dunked into a special shampoo that makes their feathers extra-fluffy. Then they're toweled off and finally blow-dried.

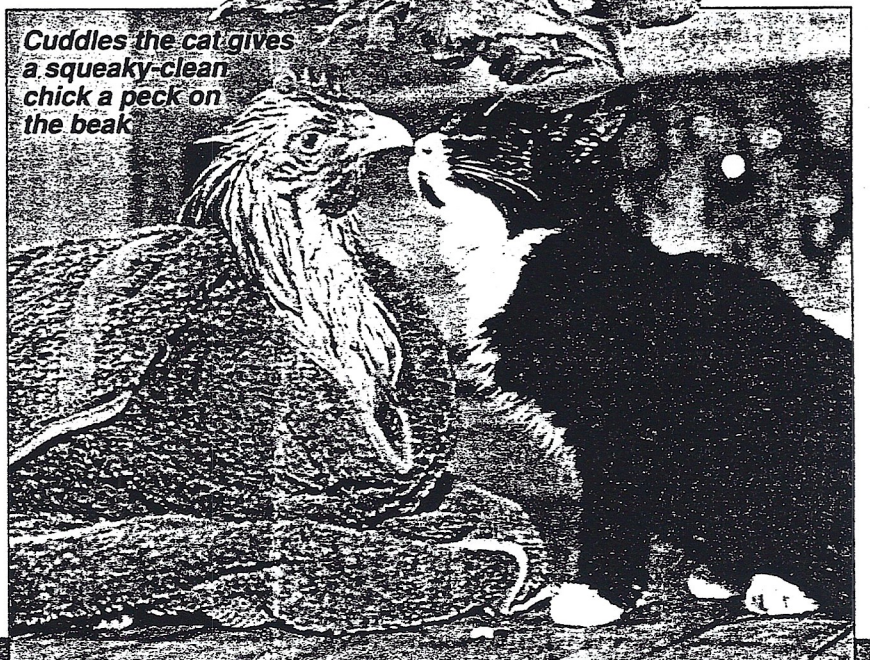
"After the first time, when the chickens are a little tense, they enjoy it more and more," says the 63-year-old farmer, from Skegness, England.

"The secret to stopping them from flapping around is to keep them upright. If you do that, they don't panic."

Even Kay's cat, Cuddles, gets into the act, giving the towel-wrapped fowls an affectionate peck on the beak.

Kay has a flock of about 20 Buff Cochran chickens, imported all the way from China because they're great show birds.

"Some of these birds are more rare than white rhinos," says Kay. "It's important to look after them well."
