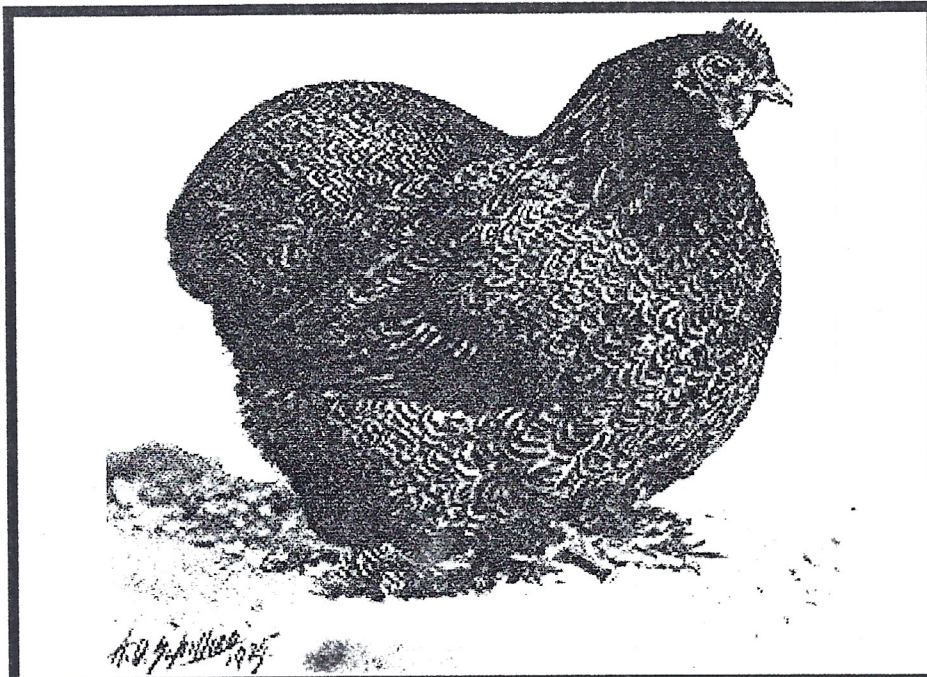

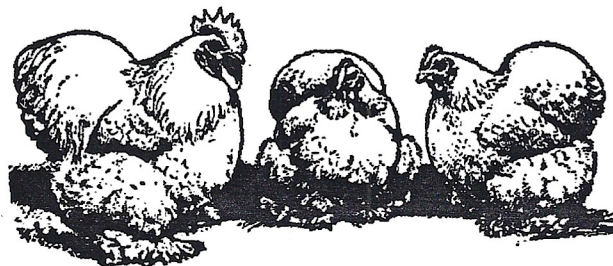

COCHINS INTERNATIONAL - CLUB HISTORY

In the fall of 1992 Keith LeGrand and Pat Lacey sent letters to the World Cochin Family and U.S. Cochin Bantam Club members about the formation of a totally new club since the U.S. Cochin Bantam Club owed moneys. Interested Cochin people met at Columbus in November to discuss the wants and needs of the newly formed club of Cochins International. Many items were discussed and the following were ranked in order of importance:

1. Newsletter 3 times a year.
2. Master Breeder program
3. Awards

Duration for officers is for one year and the following officers were elected: President – Craig Carroll, Vice-president – Keith LeGrand, Secretary/Treasurer – Elton Minnich, and Newsletter editor – Pat Lacey. Craig Carroll developed the Master Breeder system and Barb LeGrand first maintained the points. Officers may be re-elected. Dues were established at \$10.00 for Single, \$15.00 for Family, and \$7.50 for Junior membership. The club was not to send dues cards because the newsletter would be the “membership card.” The label gives the expiration date of dues. National meets, both eastern and western, were to be rotated and voted upon by officers, and district directors. Master breeder points: one point for every five birds shown with two or more exhibitors. Castlebury Plaque given for 500 Master Breeder Points, and certificates given for 100 Master Breeder points. Points are earned for best and reserve of variety for every 5 birds beaten (with your variety not factored twice). No points awarded for 3rd or 4th best. Point are lost if membership is not renewed by March 31st. Adjustments: if you let your membership lapse for one year due to illness, family problems, etc., you may buy back that one year. There has been some discussion that your points should stay with you forever. We can not afford to carry that kind of paperwork. That type of member need only update his membership for a large meet.

From your editor:

Well the New Year is upon us and with the new year comes new changes. For me it is going to be quite a big change. The Marine Corps has seen fit to select me for its Warrant Officer Program and with this promotion comes a change of duty station and 3 months of school at Quantico, VA. After that, I will be stationed in Cherry Point, NC, with the 2nd Marine Air Wing. How does this affect the Newsletter and Points you may be asking..... Well, It shouldn't have too much affect at all. I have purposefully put this newsletter out a little late and the next newsletter, which is due out in the May time frame, will be late as well. I will get to North Carolina sometime in June and once I get settled and unpacked, I will put together the “May” Newsletter. I should have it out about mid-summer. That's what I'm shooting for anyway. Pat and I have discussed this and the situation appears workable. I want to continue doing the Newsletter, and as it looks now, I should be able to. In the mean time, send in those articles and photos, and I'll do my best to include as much as possible in the “summer” newsletter.

I had a chance to attend the Central Florida Poultry Breeders' Association Show on Dec. 12th. Nice class of Cochin Bantams, with Blacks, Whites and Mottled well accounted for. Additionally, there was good amount of Cochin Frizzles shown with Doris Robinson having some dandies! They had about a dozen Black Large Fowl, along with some very typey whites and a nice mottled hen both of which belonged to John Thyssen. As I mentioned above Doris Robinson was there and I finally got to meet her in person and visit. I also got to visit with CI member John Thyssen. All in all, a very nice show. I think the best part of this hobby is visiting with your friends. I spent the Christmas holidays in Texas with my 3 children, and on the way up there I dropped in on Dennis Wollard and took a look at his birds and talked Cochins for a while. He really has some nice Buff standards, and is making progress with the Columbian Bantams (see photos on page 16).

Upon my return after Christmas I attended the Florida Sunshine Classic (Jan 9-10), in Lake City, FL. Great Show!! Although the Cochin class was relatively small it was well represented in quality birds. When I initially walked down the aisle I picked out a beauty of a Buff Cochin Bantam Pullet belonging to CI Member Terry Ingram. He also had some very nice whites, and new Member Betty Kearns had some good looking Black Bantams. The Buff Pullet took Best of Breed and went on to take Best Featherleg. Congrats Terry!! I was especially pleased considering my affinity for the Buffs! Betty Kearns took Reserve of Breed in the Bantams on a Black Hen. John Thyssen was again in attendance and his Large Buff Pullets were very typey, as well as his Large Blacks and Whites. He had Best of Breed on a Buff Pullet and Reserve of Breed on a Black Cockerel. John also showed a couple Silver Laced and a Golden Laced in Large Fowl. In his words “They need work,” but John, it was good to see that somebody is taking an interest in the different varieties. The different color patterns are what make the Breed interesting. Once again I had a great time at the show visiting with CI Members and fellow fanciers. Danny Padgett and his crew put on a very nice show. A Little Bantam History

W. B. Tegetmeier quaint little oriental dwarfs", (1877) referred to them as Pekin bantams did not break onto splash created by their large China Fowl who caused the farthertheless they have been an years and usually are in second or larity poll.

In 1910 Harrison Weir known at that time: " English size said to be compared to be geon"; Chinese Dwarf, shown as buff in colour (These could well Buff Pekins, which were to come distinct breed). French Dwarf, not being as small as the English Rosecomb." (H. Easom Smith, "The Cochin or Pekin kin in China, about the middle of the name 'Pekin' until comparawing to American influence, the Club catering for it obvious intention being to model which had in its turn once been fowl." (W. H. Silk, Bantams and

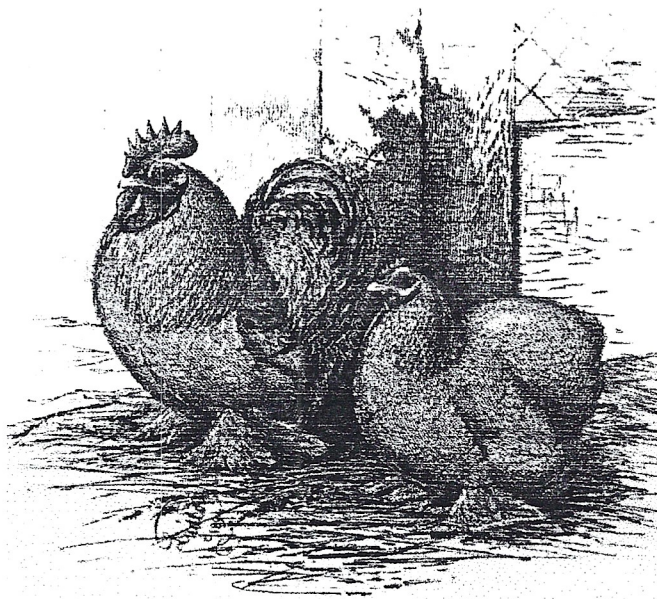
Mr. W. F. Entwisle was one of the original breeders of Pekin Bantams in England. In his famous book entitled, Bantams (1894) he wrote: "We think that it was in the year 1860 that the Emperor of China's Summer Palace in Peking, or Pekin, was captured by the allied British and French arms, and among the spoils then captured were some beautiful Buff Cochin Bantams, which were prized and cared for by a 'British Fancier', who was an officer then faithfully serving his Queen and country in China. This officer sent them home to a friend - - - they were bred in and in for nearly twenty years - - - gradually the constitution became weakened and sterility ensued." There is also the rumor that some of the early birds had five toes!

In 1884 Entwisle had bred down some bantams from the large fowl and also in that year he was able to import about a dozen birds from China, "which greatly improved our Buffs in size and shape, while our birds added vigor and stamina, the result being that now our Buffs are as hardy as any of our bantams. One of our cock birds, a cup winner here, which we lent for the breeding season, 1890, to a well-known poultry judge in the U.S.A., after we had hatched thirty chicks from him, stood the voyage out well, had a successful season as a stock bird out there, moulted well, and returned in time for our winter shows, looking none the worse for his voyaging twice across the Atlantic. He is breeding well this season, and walking his quartette of hens across the lawn in front of our window as we are now writing."

"Their first introduction into England was not until the year 1860 or 1861, and previous to that we believe that no fancier in the country had ever heard of them. These were all Buffs - the cocks had rather a rich darkish cinnamon, and the hens some shades lighter." (There are some writers who mention crosses with the Nankin in this early period to improve the buff color.) " Several years elapsed before Cochin Bantams of any other colour were heard of. These new ones were Black, brought over by an officer from China; the hens were excellent in every particular, but the cocks were none of them free from white, or straw color in the hackles, and several had brassy wings." The White-booted bantams were used to make the White variety and during the development of the White some Barred specimens appeared. Apparently the Booted Whites carried barring as is sometimes the case with white birds. A Cuckoo patterned bird was also imported from China about this time by a Mr. Leno. Entwisle produced the first Partridge from a cross of the Black and the Buff. Entwisle wrote; "thus by 1892 there were five varieties in England." (W. F. Entwisle)

"About the year 1885, we became aware of the fact that a few Buff Pekins were bred in the U.S. America, and at consid-

Letter from Jeff Ryan, Gray ME, (Four-In-Hand Farm)

Dear Tom,

Here are a few photos from the Ohio National and a brief overview of my experiences. Perhaps you can use it in the next newsletter.

First, what a great time! Cochin breeders from all over the country were there and class was large. I jotted down some numbers for the variety classes, but have tossed them out and now don't remember the exact numbers. However, I recall there were over 200 black bantams, 50 buffs, and almost 200 whites. There were good classes in blue and mottled, but short of that, not much else in the bantam class. In the large fowl class there were large classes in buff, black, mottled and white. We should extend our congratulations to Mark Petersen for his win in the buff bantam class with BV on a cock and in the large fowl class with Res. Asiatic on a buff cockerel. Tim Hooker took the whole ball of wax in bantams with a black cockerel that was a beauty, but a black langshan beat him for Ch. Featherleg.

The phenomenon that struck me the most was the immense size of the show; while one was on the floor of the show, it didn't seem that large. However, when one went to the mezzanine level of the show hall and looked down on the show, one was immediately impressed by the vastness of it! I tried to catch this in photo #4 enclosed. This was taken from one end of the Voinovich Building and looks to the opposite end; just row upon row of poultry, double tiered.

Photo #3 is the view looking down onto the large cochins and one can see some nice mottleds, blacks, and blues in the picture. Photo #2 is from the mezzanine looking down onto the bantams and one can get a taste of the large classes of whites and blacks from this picture.

Finally, I've enclosed a photo of my own buff bantam cock #359 that was second cock in the class. Naturally, I was pleased to have placed at all at a national level event!

Tom, in other news, new Cochins International Breeders Directories are done, and by the time you receive this, every paid member should have received his/her copy. I handed out almost 50 of them to members at the National and mailed the rest.

At the National, we had our annual meeting of CI, and it was well attended. Each of us introduced ourselves to the group, and it was nice to finally meet people from around North America (several of our Canadian members were present). You'll be getting a note about the minutes and about the slate of officers up for election this year from Pat or Dennis.

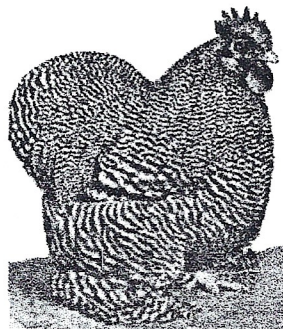

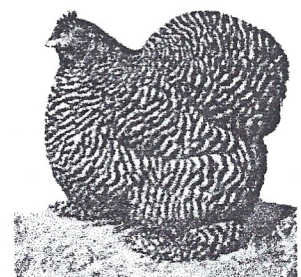

What are Big Cochins Good For?

Big Cochin fowl are in a class by themselves as they have certain merits that other breeds do not have. I would not advise anyone to use them in establishing stock for a commercial egg farm and this is the only exception I would make since Cochins are outstanding layers, but due to their nature, they do from time to time become "broody" and the lighter breeds of chickens during this period gain on Cochins in egg production. I would say "Cochins are an all-purpose profit fowl."

Big Cochins are ideal for back lot, town suburban homes, or small farms flocks since they do exceptionally well in very close confinement. In most cases, a three foot fence is plenty high enough unless you live in a "vermin" environment like I do in Pennsylvania and must now put fencing over the top because of hawks. Either trees for shade or a natural close-growing green hedge should be sufficient. Strictly due to their strong and healthy nature plus disposition, cochins do not require a lot of special care, to say, as other breeds do. They can miss a number of meals without showing any bad effects and once they start to lay, they keep right at it. A few get broody occasionally but if you put another active male in with them or change the location of the broody, they usually swing back into the laying mode.

Big Cochins grow as fast as any breed and faster than many, but due to their immense size, they build up a big frame in the first few months and then add their weight later in the growing period; in fact I have found that Cochins will keep on growing and developing for 18 months.

With the various colors of Buff, Black, White, Partridge, Golden Laced, Silver Laced, Blue, Red, Barred and Mottled (the latter colors being rare), combined with their immense fluff, plus their

pleasing personalities and typical method of strutting around, Cochins are pleasing to the eye of nearly everyone that appreciates a thing of rare beauty and nature.

I think Big Cochins could be termed as the "hobby chicken" that make money because anyone can make a hobby of almost anything, but they will find out that Big Cochins are ideal for this purpose, plus a revenue in return if you plan it right. By showing Cochins at local fairs or poultry shows, the matter of competition and sportsmanship gives an added pleasure to the hobby. At the same time, Big Cochins furnish the home with luscious big brown eggs, frying chickens, roasting chickens, and maybe sometimes, the Thanksgiving dinner is a stuffed 12 pound Cochin male (if you can think of the idea to kill just one of these beauties).

Big Cochins, with their different colors and their immense foot feathering do not scratch and dig up small shrubs and flowers as ordinary fowl will. They stay close to where you put them and don't wander off like other breeds.

What child or grown-up does not long for an animal or fowl to care for? As pets for children, they stand supreme. They are quick to learn from habit, and after being put to bed one or two nights, they expect little hands to continue with the process. Cochins are normally not too vicious, can be picked up and carried anywhere, can be wheeled around in doll carriages, and can be used in 4-H projects, like my boy Josh uses his Big Cochins for.

For a fancier like myself, the aristocratic Big Cochin is a beautiful bird entirely of curves, and no straight lines, which in itself makes them as modern and up to date as the "next tick of your watch." From the very moment these excessively fluffy balls of down, fluff trousers and all, emerge

from their shells, they cause constant speculation through

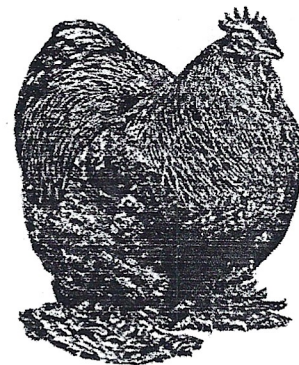
to maturity and the extraordinary generally happens. Their shuffling along the yard sends a thrill through me as a breeder. These wonderful balls of fluff and feather, as they appear on a green lawn or around shrubbery, startles me again as an observer and as a fancier still beautifies them by placing them on exhibition, the Big Cochin makes the flower garden of every poultry show.

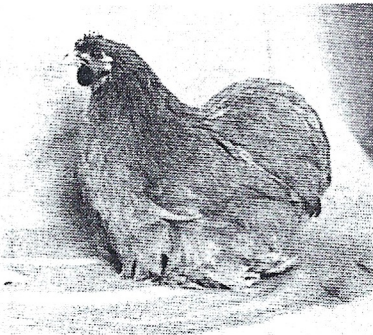
If you are lucky enough to obtain either eggs or baby chicks from a breeder, that would be a plus to see them grow up. If not, buying foundation stock of adult birds is your next step.

I either receive a phone call or a letter stating that people are interested in Big Cochins and if our prices are cheap they will buy. If "just ordinary chickens" are wanted they can be picked up anywhere; even the huckster can supply them at a dollar or two. Cochins are not ordinary chickens and they do not give just ordinary results; what they give in results is worth the slight added investment, I think.

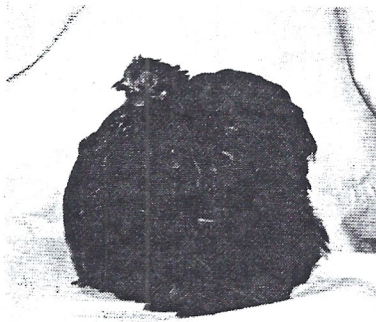
There are other merits I have not brought to your attention, but I am hoping that you will give Big Cochins an opportunity to meet whatever requirements you have in mind. The qualities of all the Big Cochins are the same. Color is a matter of choice.

In closing, I hope your Big Cochin investment is not "just another chance", but something that will be the best investment you can make in our poultry world.





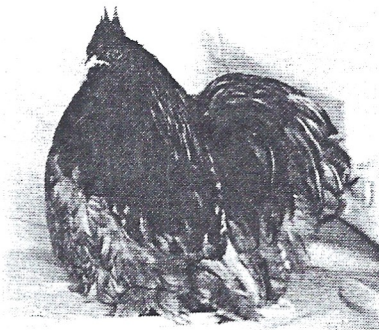
Champion of Show, Champion Cochinchin – Buff Pullet by Bob Hawes



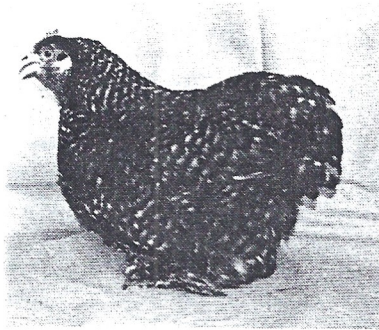

erable trouble and expense, we secured some of the best birds that could be sent from that country. These we found superior in colour to our pure Chinese, but deficient in foot and shank feather, and quite wrong in shape; they were longer in the neck and leg, and longer in back, and sloped from the shoulder down the back to the tail, which suddenly rose from a divided saddle. However for the sake of colour, we kept and bred from some of these Americans, and admit that they have been very helpful when bred with the better shaped and heavier cushioned birds we previously possessed." (W. F. Entwisle)

Lewis Wright (*The New Book of Poultry*), 1902, included the Mottle as a variety, bringing the total to six. He wrote, "at the Liverpool Show of 1899 there were exhibited in one class thirty-eight specimens of Buff Pekins - - - the best variety hen fell to a Black Pekin, which it was deemed was as near perfection as it was possible to attain."

In John Robinson's book, *Popular Breeds of Domestic Poultry*, 1924, he wrote that there is no good record of how the Pekins arrived in America, but gives the year of arrival as about 1880. They appear in show lists in 1883. At the New York Show of 1884 Buffs were shown by four exhibitors, "the principal entry being by John H. Diehl of Beverly, New Jersey, - - - who appears to be the person most likely to have imported them." Mr. Diehl is known to have had Black Cochins by 1888. (This account by Robinson on the history of Cochin Bantams is one of the best I have found.)



PEKIN OR COCHIN BANTAMS

It appears from the accompanying cover on *The Poultry World*, that Buff Cochins were in the US in 1877. But, as stated in the caption under the drawing, "Pekin or Cochin Bantams are quite rare - - ." It seems strange that Robinson, who was a great poultry historian, would have missed this article from 1877, although it is possible that the drawing originated in England.

The "Pekin or Cochin" bantam as a breed, was in the first American Standard of Excellence (1874) even before the birds themselves arrived here. This occurred because the early American standards accepted everything described in the English standards. Up until 1894 only the Buff variety was described in the APA Standards, but in that year the Black, White and Partridge varieties were added and also in that year the name "Pekin" was officially dropped.

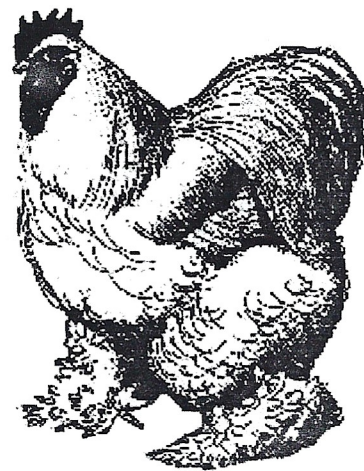
Once they became known the Buff was an extremely popular variety. One author stated, "More Buff Cochin Bantams were bred and shown in the years following 1895 than any other variety of bantam." So on both sides of the pond the Buff put in the first appearance, probably followed by the Black. I would be happy to hear of any other references on the history of this, our favorite chicken.

LESSON ON HOW TO BREED THE WHITE VARIETIES OF BANTAMS

(an ABA Bantam Culture Course printed around 1973, exact date unknown)

It is so that white varieties of Bantams have always been popular because, in the opinion of the unthinking Bantam Breeder, they do not present a problem in color breeding.

This notion can be confirmed at most shows where white varieties have been very indifferently feathered. The breeders, had they been more concerned with color, these cream whites, brassy whites, and tan-whites would never have existed in the show room. The way to get whiteness in the plumage of any variety is fundamentally the same.

In a mating from which the young stock are coming to maturity, some of them will be found to have plumage of definite cream color. This may be almost a butter yellow. These young bantams may be very disappointing but until a stay white strain has been developed, they are probably as good as anything their owner has bred. Examine the plumage right down to the skin, it will be found the creaminess starts from the quill and extends upwards throughout the feather. Known as sap, this creaminess will, in most cases work away with maturity and the bird will become reasonably white.

A second group of youngsters from the pen may be "brassy." This fault is obvious only in the cockerels, it being a rarity to find a "brassy" pullet. The weather beaten bird is not brassy but tanned by exposure. The brassiness is a birthright and the cockerel so distinguished is undesirable. Neither he nor his family will do the breeder of White Bantams any good. It will most likely be found that there is a noticeable absence of "sap" in his plumage. He may be fairly white in all his other parts but on top (his hackle, back, and shoulders) he will have a yellow tinge which is aptly and exactly described as "brass."

The trouble with this condition is that it can only be seen in the male and is thus sex-limited. But it must not be overlooked that the female relatives of a brassy cock will,

in turn, breed cockerels with this fault,

Breeders who condemn and scrap a defective male must be prepared to be equally harsh with related females or their culling of the male is pointless.

A weathered white male (or female) may or may not have been sappy as a youngster. While such weathering is a disfigurement and will put a bird out of reckoning for show purposes for some months, it is not permanent. When a weathered bird is given protective shade during the molt it will normally regain its white plumage.

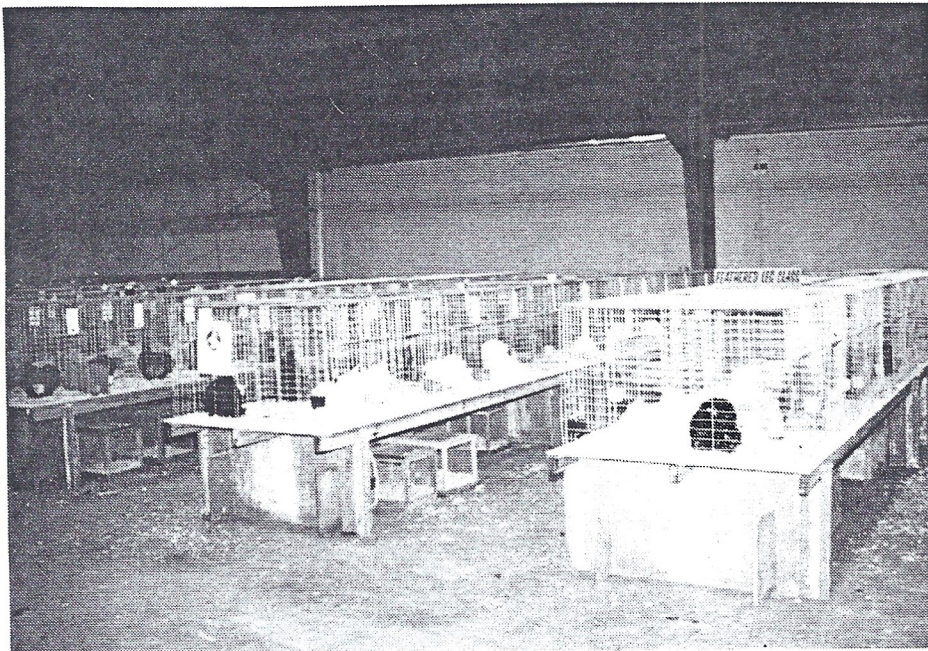
A fortunate breeder may find among his young stock a cockerel which is white throughout and stays white. Such a bird has a glistening, silvery-white top which speaks for itself. Once again, we are up against the problem of a factor being apparent only in one sex, but this time there is something definitely desirable on which to build.

It may be safely assumed that the dam of this bird has the pure-white, stay-white blood in her veins and one mating to fix color could be the pure white cockerel to his dam.

It is highly probable that advantages would be found by mating the cockerel's sire to his full sister (the sire's daughters).

The stay-white male often has his coverts, or some saddle feathers, ticked with black or gray. This is not an infallible rule and it is not to say that every white bird with colored feathers will be the better for it, but it does show that with white, as with any other variety, reasonable allowances must be made. Although not common in self-white breeds, any rusty or reddish feathers in a cockerel's shoulders should automatically spell his rejection when breeding show stock. This advice goes farther than the one issue of breeding for color.

Eradication of any fault can only be possible when the breeder decides that he will not blink at being quite ruthless about discarding any bird which shows the slightest trace of a fault in its makeup.
