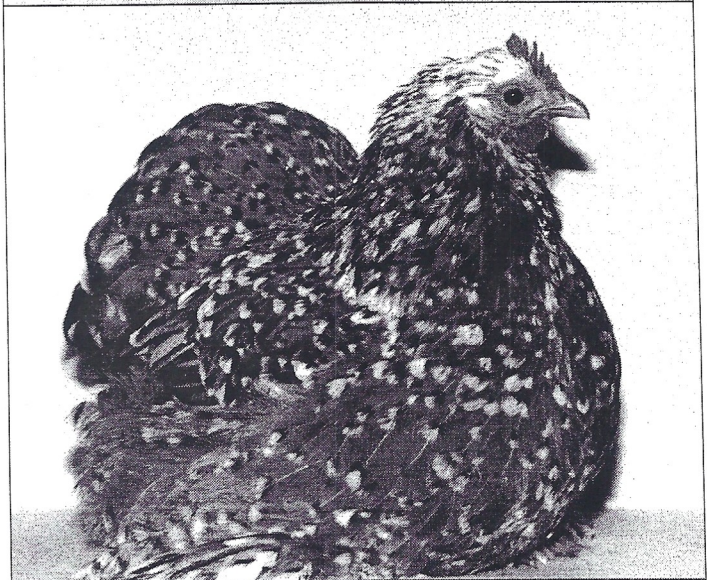
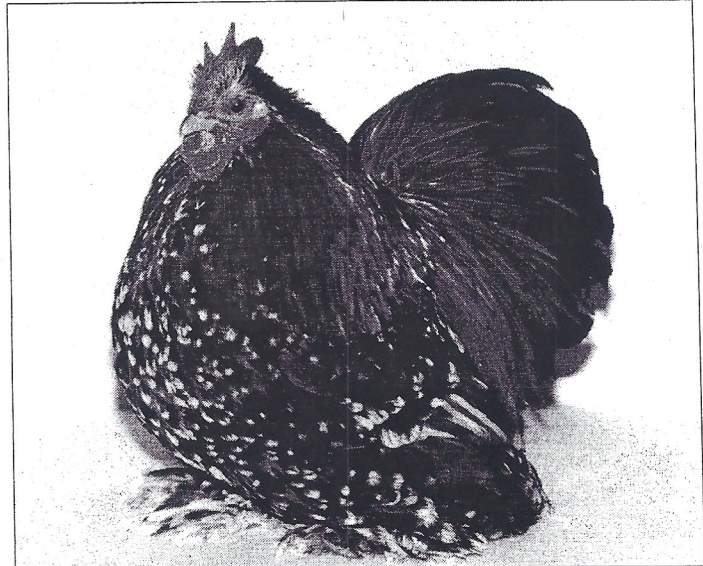
The votes are in and counted. Please be assured that all votes were counted. The Canada and International ballots were mailed a little earlier than the US ballots to allow for some extra travel time. One year I mailed ballots very early and members lost ballots, and this year I mailed the ballots later with a shorter turnaround time and received notes that they did not have time to respond by the deadline. There were no close races and again all ballots were counted - so be assured that your vote did count.

The officers for Cochins International, years 2005 -2006, include Tom Roebuck for President, and Bill Ziehm for Vice-president along with Dennis Wollard for Secretary-Treasurer. The District Directors include: Northeast I - Donna Lamb, Northeast II - Rich Barczewski, Southeast - Tim Baldwin, North Central - Kim Aldrich, West Central - Mark Peterson, Southwest - Bernita Miller, Pacific - Bill McGee, and Canada - Bernice MacLaren.

Thanks to everyone who voted, this shows support for the best breed club around. The detailed voting breakdown includes: Roebuck-62 votes, Ziehm-36, Ryan-12 (Bill Ryan did withdraw his name after the ballots were mailed), Yobst-13, Wollard-57, Lamb-10, Barczewski-7, Baldwin-7, Aldrich-9, Peterson-3, Miller-9, McGee-9, Helvey-2, and MacLaren-5.

The Grand Master Breeder Award passed with 48 votes for and 10 votes against. The Grand Master Breeder Award recognizes breeders with 1500 points in a single variety. The recipient will receive a one-time, full page ad in the APA or ABA yearbook of their choice and perpetual listing in club ads in both of these publications.

Thanks to all of these new officers for their time and dedication to the club. All members please feel free to volunteer your time and talents to the best breed club around. The news letter can always use additional articles, certainly more photos of the local shows-only if you send them, and articles for the upcoming book.

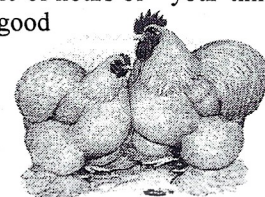

From Bird Shippers of America -

Transportation Update as of April 18, 2005

According to the U.S. Postal Service the following is transpiring:

1. American Air is back to about 60% of their network volume and the results are very encouraging. They're ramping up their transfer operation through Dallas/Fort Worth this week and will be fully ramped up in another 3 weeks - this will provide additional opportunities for the transport of lives.
2. A proposal from a cargo carrier for the transport of lives throughout the country has been received - rates are lane specific. It is being evaluated as to where they can best be utilized.
3. Northwest signed with Airborne. They will begin transporting mail out of their 5 hubs beginning May 14th. We hope they will expand to other hubs later. These 5 hubs are: Minneapolis, Detroit, Memphis, Los Angeles, & San Francisco.
4. US Air is in the first week of their test - results are encouraging as well. As they bring up more markets the options for the transport of lives will increase. They will start taking lives out of Syracuse on April 23rd.
5. Airborne doesn't accept lives today, however, they are reconsidering their position. The USPS is cautiously optimistic. If Airborne does accept lives it will open up a very large area for our transportation of lives.

Northeast I District Update:

Hello CI members.

I again want to thank NE1 for your confidence in me by electing me as the NE1 District Director. I thank **Jamie Matts** for all he did for the district during his tenure. I have a lot to learn and encourage all to contact me with any comments and concerns: lamb@psicorp.com - 978-374-2481.

I have placed regional meets for the spring shows at Central Maine Bird Fanciers, NE Bantam Club, Little Rhody, CT Poultry Breeders, Western NY, Finger Lakes Fancy Feather, Dutchess County Poultry Fanciers. The NE1 District Meet will be held at Central Maine Bird Fanciers on October 2, 2005. I will place the remaining fall shows in June. Please let me know if you are aware of other NE1 shows that I should be including. I've also been working with show secretaries to make sure all late show reports have been submitted so that we may get our well deserved points.

Thus far in 2005 there has been only one show in our district to report on; the Northeastern Poultry Congress held in January, 2005. There were a total of 75 Cochins (63 bantams, 12 standards). BB Bantam and Res. Featherleg went to a white pullet by **Bill Sirrine** and RB to a white cockerel by **Bruce Robinson**. In Standards BB and RB went to **Bill West** with two buff cockerels. One cockerel went on to Best Asiatic and Overall Champion Cochin - Congratulations to all our winners. **Elizabeth Clapp**, one of our junior members, now reports on the junior competition:

As a junior member of Cochins International, I was pleased to see the great turnout of junior Cochins at this year's Northeast Poultry Congress. I was lucky enough to be able to steward with Don Nelson as he judged over 20 junior cochins. Quite a few of the different varieties were exhibited, including some of the more unusual ones.

The list of entries is as follows:

Best of Breed went to **Sara Orłowski's** Blue Cochin Cockerel and Reserve of Breed went to her Black Cochin Cock. Sara's Blue Cochin Cockerel also went on to win Best Feather Leg and reserve junior bantam! Sara also won in the standard Cochin class with a Black Hen and Blue Cockerel. It was great to see all of these juniors showing an interest in Cochins, Congratulations to all of you!

Thanks Elizabeth, great report. Now for local news, like many states bearing down on the poultry enthusiast, Massachusetts is proposing state "Guidelines for Keeping Poultry" that they plan to send to all towns' Dept. of Health and the "poultry testing fees" in which they want to have all birds tested for AI as well as Pullorum and charging us up to \$2.75 per bird. Also in the works is a requirement to have birds tested 90 days prior to a show. That would be 3 times a year for the spring, fall and winter shows and at \$2.75 per bird, it can really add up. Needless to say, I feel that both of these proposals will harm the local exhibition poultry community as well as the local poultry clubs and fairs. I hope everyone is having a successful hatching season. I look forward to seeing you at the spring shows.

Northeast II District Update:

Things in the District are still up in shambles with three of the six states in the district now requiring A.I. testing. To date, Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania are all requiring that birds be A.I. tested within 10 days of entering the state. That leaves New Jersey with one show and Delaware with one show that don't require birds to be tested beyond the normal pullorum testing every year. I'm not aware of any shows in West Virginia. Obviously I'm concerned about this situation, but don't know what can be done. The State Veterinarian in Delaware is going to retire this summer and that may pose a problem for us in Delaware but we will be working with whomever is hired to see how we can move forward on this issue.

The National Poultry Improvement Plan is working to develop a testing program that may solve some of the problem. Some of us in Delaware have been taking advantage of the program by testing 30 birds every 90 days to be considered A.I. monitored and clean. The problem is to get all the other states to recognize the program and to accept these birds in addition to those tested within 10 days of entering the state. We seem to be one of the hotbeds when it comes to Avian Influenza requirements in the country.

On a brighter note, the Delmarva Poultry Fanciers show which was also the APA and ABA Joint Semi-Annual meet was a huge success and we had one of the best Cochin shows that I've attended in recent years. All totaled, there were 133 Cochin bantams and 29 large fowl shown. The weather was

lousy on Saturday but the show attracted 160 exhibitors from 22 states and Canada. Champion Featherleg and Reserve Champion Bantam was a black cochin hen by Tim and Sandy Baldwin. Reserve Champion Asiatic was a black Cochin cockerel by John DiNatale. It was really good to see some top quality cochins and to see them up on Champion Row. I've posted all the results on the Cochin Forum if you would like to see who won with the various varieties. All totaled there were 10 varieties of cochin bantams and 4 additional varieties of cochin frizzles shown along with four varieties of cochin large fowl.

We had a banner year hatching Black Cochin bantams. It seemed as though the fertility was good and according to the chick count nearly every egg hatched. Thanks to several 4-Her's that picked up chicks for their projects in 2005 I was able to keep the crowding down which I think is a chick's worst enemy. I do a lease type arrangement with the 4-Her's which works well for us, sometimes they bring all the chicks back when they are done showing them and sometimes we just pick out a couple of trio's. If you get an interested and hard working 4-Her it can be a great deal for both parties involved, I always try and talk them into showing at one or two fall shows so that they get some exposure to our wonderful hobby beyond the 4-H level. They're our future so please take the time to answer a question or just say you did a great job

Hi to all you busy Cochin folks! Between shows and hatching I doubt I'm not the only one behind on spring yard, garden, and vehicle maintenance, etc.

Since the last newsletter, I made acquaintance via the internet with a cochin (large fowl) breeder/hobbyist in Sweden. Her name is Helen Sjostrom and she presently has blue, black, partridge, blue partridge, white and barred in very limited numbers. Since she began with them in the year 2000, large fowl have become quite difficult to obtain in Sweden. Helen would enjoy hearing from large fowl breeders in the U.S. or abroad. Contact was also made with Sue Cross in France with the help of the National Frizzle Club of America (NFCOA). Sue has a collection of about 100 birds all raised organically; free range in a walled organic garden. She has pekings (bantam cochins) in Columbian, Birchen, Cuckoo and black - the latter a frizzle. She also has frizzles in other breeds, i.e., Sebrights, Polish, Barbee, Ancona, Ardeners. She plans to work on silver laced Polish in frizzle. Sue engages in an organic lifestyle; therefore, her chickens do as well. mation with cell phones to cover 24 provinces. His office consists of a 10 person team that shares a single internet line and loses its power each night at 7 p.m. He has an undergraduate medical degree and a master's degree in clinical tropical medicine and receives \$38 a month."

Other items of interest that pertain the "bird flu" are:

a. On 24 Mar 05 the Washington Post reported that an experimental vaccine for bird flu will be tested on humans. Trials will involve 450 healthy volunteers. At the time of this report, 46 of 69 people infected with the H5N1 bird flu in Southeast Asia have died since Jan 2004.

b. Also on 24 Mar 05 it was reported on the news that the University of Maryland will test a bird flu vaccine on several hundred volunteers. Volunteers will receive \$500 each.

c. On 2 Apr 05 the Washington Post reported that President Bush signed an executive order authorizing the government to impose a quarantine to deal with any outbreak of a particularly lethal variation of influenza found in Southeast Asia (H5N1).

In closing I would recommend that breeders take note of these actions, recognize the seriousness of the threat and begin thinking about the necessity of implementing good, bio-security practices if not already done.

Until next time, take care of those little "fuzz ball" hatchlings and enjoy your cochins!

The Importance of Shell Texture

By W. A. Atkinson
(Poultry Item May 1929)

There is no single factor that plays so important a part in the production of high quality eggs as the character of the shell texture. We may spend valued time and effort in breeding, housing, sanitation and feeding in order that the hen may produce the highest quality product and if we neglect to provide her with the proper materials to wrap that quality product up, our efforts may be fruitless. Nature's wisdom has endowed the hen with the ability to enclose her valued product in a double lined, sealed package to protect it and deliver it to mankind in as near its original quality as possible. She is willing to do her part but must have the aid of proper feeding to accomplish her willing desires. Thin, porous-shelled eggs cause rapid evaporation—eggs that shrink so rapidly that a four-day-old egg often looks as if it were two weeks or more old under the candle. The shell has a mottled appearance that is very forcibly discriminated against—discriminated against in a manner that makes itself keenly felt in the poultryman's pocket-book. A dozen such eggs will lose two to three ounces per dozen from the time they are packed to the time they arrive on the receiver's floor and appreciably more by the time they reach the consumer. The grading of the package is lowered—a 24 oz. per dozen egg may be only a 22 oz. per dozen egg when it is sold. The quality is lowered and the breakage increased, making a very unsatisfactory package from every point of view, despite what it might have been when originally packed.

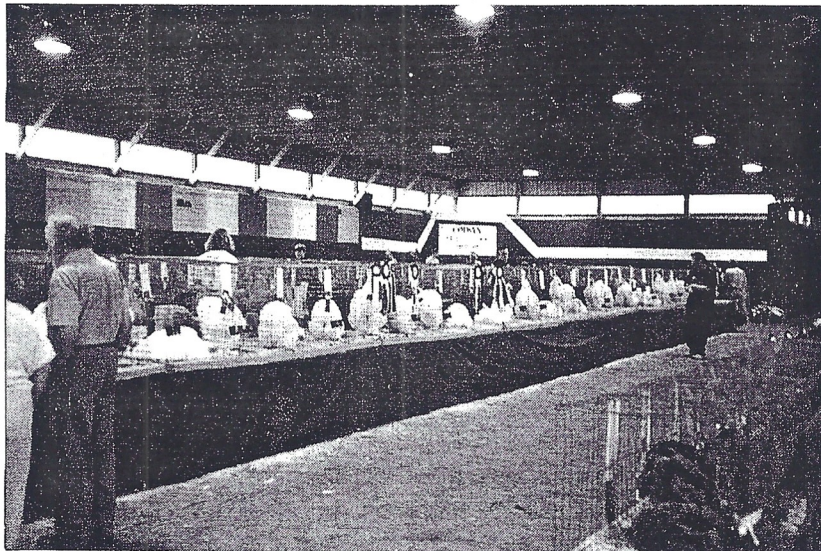
What is the cause of poor shell texture? Many reasons have been advanced, ranging from putting the blame on "bidly" herself to saddling the weatherman with the burden, but never including the poultryman himself. It has been my personal experience that the cause is about 10% breeding and 90% feeding. There is no doubt that a certain percentage of chickens seem to lack the inherent ability to produce good shell texture—a condition some what analogous to the trait of poor teeth that may run in some of our human -families. This may be due to the improper functioning of some of the glands (notably the ductless ones that we know so little about). At any rate, it is in a measure inherited, but the comparative percentage is small and the remedy obvious. Feed so that the flock as a whole is producing a good shell and do not place the porous ones in the incubator. "What you set you get," applies to this as well as to other factors.

A normal flock producing around 50%, in my experience, required 65 lbs. of shell producing material per ton of feed in order to produce a good shell, and if production is above this figure, proportionate increase of this amount is required. This can be furnished from various sources originating in the vegetable, animal or mineral kingdom, but the source of the material determines to a large extent the character of the shell produced. It is surprising to what extent experienced egg men can tell what the quality of the egg should be by handling a few eggs together, even before they are candled. There is a type of shell that has a "Dresden China" sound and feel when handled together, and there is another type that has a dull, tough sound and feel. It is the latter type that usually denotes the likelihood of high quality and the former the possibility of poor quality. Under the candle, both may show a good shell texture but the structural conditions

are different. The "Dresden China" type lend themselves to much more rapid evaporation than the other. Dependence to a large extent for the shell producing material on the mineral source will produce the "China" type of shell and if sufficient material of this source is used in the mash to produce results the palatability of the feed is materially reduced. Nevertheless, they help in hardening the shell and may be used but not to exceed 20% of the total amount of shell-producing material. The other 80% should come from an organic source (living organism). The hen seems to be better able to assimilate and use the calcium and phosphorus from this source than from the mineral or inorganic source. The calcium from the leguminous crops, primarily alfalfa and clover, and the phosphoric compounds of calcium obtained from bone meal has given me the best results. I aim to provide the necessary 65 lbs. in the mash and what the hen gets from the grit and shell box she can use for the catabolic (breaking down) and metabolic (building up) processes in her body. A factor that should be borne in mind is that "if a little is good, twice as much is not always better". If too much of the calcium compounds are used (especially from the mineral source) it puts a burden on the hen to eliminate from her body the excess, tending toward a (depletion of the secretive fluids of the body. This is especially true in the case of the phosphoric compounds of calcium. Some of our commercial forms of "mineral compounds" that rely upon animal bone meal for their basic source of phosphorus and calcium are able to give satisfactory results with lesser amounts than of the raw untreated bone meal, due to the fact that the method of manufacture renders the product in not only a more concentrated but also, is of more value, in a more assimilable form. The use of a good grade of cod liver oil will play no small part in the proper production of good shell texture. This is especially true during the seasons of the year when the amount of available sunshine is low. During the summer months its use may be readily dispensed with as the commensurate benefit derived from its use during this period does not seem to warrant the continuance of its use. Approximately one gallon to one half ton of mash should be used if the oil is of good quality. If it is not of good grade it is better not to use any. Moreover, If the calcium content of the feed is not sufficient it is a waste of money to use cod liver oil at all. The vitamin content of cod liver oil has its greatest function in the aiding of the hen to break down the calcium compounds in the feed and build them up into other calcium compounds in the making of shell and the maintaining of the body requirements. Unless this material is provided for in the proper amounts the use of C. L. O. is of questionable value. There is another factor that will warrant attention. It may be possible to produce too hard and tough a shell for our hatching eggs, so that the inflow of oxygen and escape of carbon dioxide gas during incubation period is hindered. The catalytic changes in the shell and the depositing of the calcium in the chick structure may be retarded, making it harder for the chick to break out of the shell. Again, it is but a case of management in which the poultryman himself is the main factor in the success or failure of his business.

INCREASING THE WEIGHT OF HENS AND EGGS BY BREEDING

**By James B. Morman
R.P.J. Dec 1915**

Feeding liberally will increase the size and number of eggs laid, plus the fowl will be heaviest in the spring when laying most freely. Early developed pullets make the best layers in the heavy breeds. For the production of the heavier hens it is necessary also to select the largest and most vigorous pullets for mating. Early hatched chicks are always more vigorous than later hatched. In these, vigor can be maintained by proper feeding and care.

The cockerels selected must be large and vigorous, and from hens that layed well and large eggs. By inheritance the continuance of vigor from generation to generation, may be expected a gradual increase in the size of the chicks. For large eggs; where

fowls gain in weight as a result of continuous breeding, a gradual increase of size of egg will result.

Hatch from largest eggs. Select the largest eggs with best shape and strong shells. The chicks produced from the largest eggs each year produce bigger and bigger chicks. The effect of continuous selection is cumulative. While modifications of type are to be expected, large fowl produce large eggs proportionately larger than normal. It may take years to secure a material increase in fowl and egg size, but it is bound to come.

When selection is to increase size, attention must be paid to form. Only select breeders who have long breasts, good width between thighs, and long bodies. The males selected should have the same characteristics of form as hens, but greater length of leg. From large eggs-large hens.

THE MANY USES OF OXINE

by K. J. Theodore

I first introduced Oxine as a medicinal treatment for upper respiratory fungal infections, as outlined in the first article I ever wrote for the Poultry Press. Oxine was certainly not anything new at that time, but it was new information to most of the fancy. It had already been used for decades in both the chlorination of municipal drinking water supplies, and was widely used throughout the commercial poultry industry. But few fanciers knew anything about it. I happened to have a duck at the time that was suffering so severely from a respiratory infection that I spoke to a Poultry Research Veterinarian friend of mine about possible treatment experiments, since illnesses such as Aspergillosis were thought of as fatal if severe. He told me about Oxine AH and how successful it had been when used as a nebulizing agent both in poultry and in the equine field. (Nebulizing meant the bird had to breathe the product into its airways.)

I had nothing to lose since the duck could barely breathe, so I tried it. I used a Tri-Jet fogger and a solution of 6-1/2 ounces of Oxine to a gallon of water as prescribed, and I 'fogged' the bird's face and cage three times daily for ten days. She was cured.

Since then, I have learned quite a bit about this product. Since Oxine is technically a disinfectant and I have over 26 years in the specialty chemical industry, I understood the mechanics of how the product worked from the start. I also understand EPA registrations, USDA, and FDA, so I had access to all of the many applications of the one parent product under various label uses.

Oxine is known to kill every bacteria, virus, and mold it has ever been tested against and is 200 times more effective than chlorine bleach. But one of the most impressive things about Oxine for me is that it does it with such relative safety (when used according to label instructions). Environmentally speaking, Oxine actually biodegrades to ordinary table salt. And it is so safe to use on livestock that it is actually approved for use in the drinking water of 'organically grown' animals. I use it myself at the rate of 7-15 drops per gallon of water in our stock tank of drinking water for our own sheep. It keeps the water impressively clear and algae free, while keeping down the biofilm 'slime' that tends to develop on the sides of the tank.

Oxine is used in many commercial operations in the automated drinking lines for poultry. It keeps the bacteria level down in the water lines, prevents biofilm from developing, and keeps the birds healthier by keeping down the pathogen level that could potentially travel from one bird to another. The side benefit for commercial growers is that Oxine makes the drinking water more palatable to the birds and therefore they drink more. This is especially important in layers, but can have a benefit in any operation since it also improves feed conversion.

Technically, Oxine Concentrate is a 2% chlorine dioxide gas suspended in an aqueous solution. It is diluted with water to varying degrees depending on how you would like to use it. Since it is a disinfectant and not a drug, it must make direct contact with the pathogen in order to kill it. In the diluted inactivated state, Oxine is perfectly safe to use around both your birds and yourself. Oxine can also be 'activated' using citric acid crystals, which 'release' more of the available chlorine in the solution, but I highly discourage this method of use within the fancy. If you were to activate the product, it is recommended that you wear a NIOSH approved respirator and you would not be able to fog the solution into any area where the birds are present. Without activation, I am very comfortable with using the product without a respirator or mask, although you should follow whatever precautions you are most comfortable with.

Here's how I use Oxine in my operation (this is simply an example

program – you should adapt this to your particular situation since every coop and hatchery is different). I raise both chickens and waterfowl (ducks). I use 1/8 tsp/gallon of water for my ducks' bath water to keep the bacteria level down and to help prevent bacterial enteritis, since E-Gads, we all know what ducks do in their water besides drink from it. They get a separate small dish (that they won't fit into) at night before bed with drinking water that I can fortify with vitamins, minerals, and probiotics if I choose – but not with Oxine in it which could kill the beneficial bacteria in the probiotic supplement.

I use 1/8 tsp/gallon of water in my chickens' drinking water every other day to keep down the biofilm (slime) that forms on the inside of the waterers. It also keeps the bacteria level down for when that amazingly accurate missile of a dropping somehow makes it into the drinking water trough every day. (On the opposite days I like to include a combination vitamin, mineral, and probiotic supplement in their water instead.)

Since I run a biosecurity program in my showbird coop, I use Oxine to fog the entire inside of the coop (including the birds themselves) once a week. It keeps the dust down and knocks all of the viruses, bacteria, and mold spores out of the air. It also keeps the air fresh smelling in there. Oxine also has a residual disinfecting quality so I try to moisten surfaces such as roosts with the fog as I go. I see no need to remove feed or drinkers from the coop when I fog so the procedure is quite simple.

Other possible uses for the product are an egg dip prior to incubation (always using water warmer than the egg and at the rate of 4 oz/gallon of water). In this case, you would simply dip the egg in the solution and lay it on a clean paper towel to air dry – do not rub since that would breach the egg's cuticle, something which is important to hatching success. You can also use it at the rate of 7 drops/gallon of water in your water reservoir in your incubator, and/or in a humidifier that may be running in a room where you store eggs prior to incubation.

Oxine has so many approvals for use in the (human) food industry that they're too numerous to mention here, but it's worth noting since it reinforces Oxine's overall relative safety.

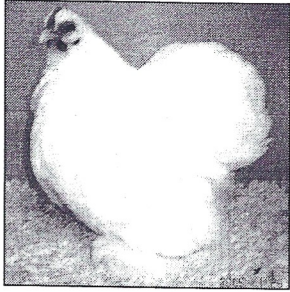
You may purchase Oxine through several of the poultry supply houses. A few that I know of are Seven Oaks Game Farm, Smith Poultry, First State Veterinary Supply, Cutler Pheasant Supply, and Aire Solutions, LC. All of the suppliers listed above advertise in the Poultry Press. There may be more and I apologize if I have left them out. If you are a supplier of Oxine and were not mentioned here, then I suggest you advertise that you are in the next issue of the Poultry Press so it becomes known. Also, if you let me know who you are, I would be glad to include you in an amended copy of this article prior to putting it up on my website next month.

If you need a fogger and cannot afford the more expensive ones, there is an alternative. It is the Preval Paint Sprayer from www.dickblick.com. It's a small hand held device that is commonly used when vaccinating poultry against viruses that the birds need to breathe in to become inoculated. The Preval sprayer requires 'power units' to work and they can be purchased from Dick Blick as well. Also, Fogmaster makes a 'Fogmaster Jr.', which you can view and purchase at www.fogmaster.com. The suppliers of Oxine may also provide fogger options and perhaps some kind of package deal, so I would check that option out as well.

In the interest of good bio-security practices and options, I have included this article. Thanks to K. J. Theodore.

What is grit and when should I use it for my poultry?

Grit is anything that would provide a grinding tool in the gizzard, where the feed is broken down. Tiny pebbles, sand, grit, canary or pigeon grit, etc. are all suitable for adults birds, but only canary grit (or something similar in size) should be used for chicks, when necessary. If your birds are on commercial feed exclusively, then grit is not necessary. If you add grains or seeds, you should provide grit if the birds do not free-range. Under free-range conditions, grit is not necessary, although many feel more comfortable if they provide grit on a free-choice basis. This is especially true if you have a bird that tends to 'load up' on grass.

When should I start my pullets on oyster shell?

Oyster shell should never be given to young pullets before egg production since calcium overdose may cause kidney damage. Only hens in production should be provided a calcium supplement such as oyster shell, and even then there is some debate on how much. If you feel small 'bumps' on the surface of your hens' eggs, then they are probably getting too much. If they free-range, they probably don't need it since they'll pick up what they need naturally. However, if they are pen or cage raised, then providing a pinch of oyster shell once a week would be advised. Too little calcium in a producing hen's diet will cause her to steal calcium from her own bones to make up for the deficiency. Free-feed oyster shell should be fine for adult hens under any circumstances, provided that you don't have a 'guzzler'.

Bird Shippers of America - Who Are We?

The Constitution and the statutes enacted by our Congress guarantee and are designed to insure that postal patrons receive "prompt, reliable, and efficient" postal service "to all communities." In 2002, the Bird Shippers of America, a group of business, individuals, and allied industry was formed. The primary purpose of this organization would be to protect the right to ship live birds, of various types, through the United States Postal Service. Our membership provides the revenue to hire a lobbyist in Washington, D.C. who actively leads us through the complicated scheme of our country's politics in trying to succeed in our mission

Bird Shippers of America Update: American, US Air, NW, & Airborne (posted on www.birdshippers.org ~ 19 Apr 2005)

Hey, we're making progress.

We realize how tough things have been out there for many of you in the poultry shipping world these last few months. However the most recent update from Mr. Steve Boynton, our lobbyist, is very encouraging. Here is what is transpiring between the USPS and its air carriers:

1. American Airlines is in its third week of an eight week test. (The USPS pulled their contract earlier and has now reinstated them under some restrictions.) According to Mr. John Bonafilia, of the USPS, the "early results are encouraging."

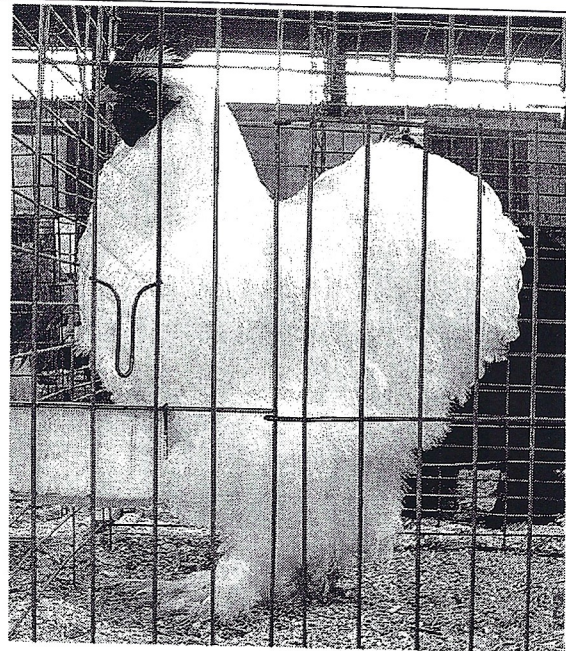
2. On April 8th, mail was tendered to U.S. Air for its test. (U.S. Air's contract was pulled at the same time as American's.) "The first two days were encouraging."

3. Northwest Air, which currently has a separate contract with the USPS to carry lives at a \$.80 per pound additional surcharge, is actively carrying lives from Minneapolis and Detroit. The USPS reports Northwest has signed a contract with Airborne to start taking lives on May 14th from presumably Memphis, Los Angeles, and New York. (These cities have not been confirmed by the USPS but it is believed by us that these cities will be served.)

4. The USPS is currently in negotiations with a cargo carrier to take lives out of markets where limited commercial lifts however, costs may be a factor here. We were informed by the USPS

they will know more in two weeks on this issue.

In conclusion, Mr. Boynton adds, and I quote, "This latter message (Number 4 above) is really a two edged sword: Firstly, it is encouraging that efforts are being made to expand the service, but, secondly, the USPS does not seem to acknowledge that it has an unequivocal Constitutional and statutory duty to provide mail service to postal patrons. The law does not say that the government, through the USPS, will provide service unless it is too costly, or basically, too much trouble."
