Our Newsletter has changed!

In September 1932, I exhibited my first bantams with my father the late Claude Enslen at the Grant County Fair. Among the different breeds and varieties shown were several Cochin bantams in Black, White, Buff and Partridge. In the early 1900's, my father managed the Overman Poultry Farm, east of Marion, IN., and he and my grandfather raised large fowl in White Plymouth Rock and S.C. White Leghorn. My father obtained his APA judges license during that period, and for a while, he followed the fair circuit with a special railway boxcar equipped for birds and living. At a very early age, my interest in poultry was kindled. I started helping Dad with the chickens at the age of 8, and I still recall those wonderful days and nights at the fair shows, sleeping in a trailer full of straw during the week of the fair. From the age of ten I think there has always been bantams, especially Cochin bantams in my life except during the years of WW II (1942-1945) at which time I served with the US Army in Europe. After my return from the service in 1945, I obtained a nice pair of Black Cochin bantams from the late Henry Witt of Kendallville, IN. I believe Mr. Witt had a pure Caskey line of birds. I did not raise many birds nor did I exhibit at many of the shows until a few years later. I never placed a bird first until the mid 1950's, when I showed against Henry Witt and the late Horace Abbott at the IN state show in Indianapolis, IN. At that show, I won 1st, 2nd and 3rd Black Cochin pullets in a very good class. After judging, Henry told me he would like one of the pullets.



I asked him which one and he told me all three. Considering the help he had given me, I gave him the three pullets. From that day on, Henry Witt was responsible for my success in breeding Black Cochin bantams. I never went to, or called Henry for advice or a particular bird with the quality I needed to improve my birds, that he didn't help through a loan of a male, eggs from a certain female or the outright gift of a bird.

Shortly before Henry died I called him for certain type pullet. On the phone, he advised me he was ill and to come up and get the bird. When I arrived, he was too ill to go to the bantam house and told me to go out and catch whatever was there that he was unable to care for them any longer. There was 13 birds in all left, five males and eight females. I had saved for a good pullet, and Henry accepted the amount for payment of the remaining 13 birds. He told me that time that he wanted me to have them as he thought that I would be a breeder and

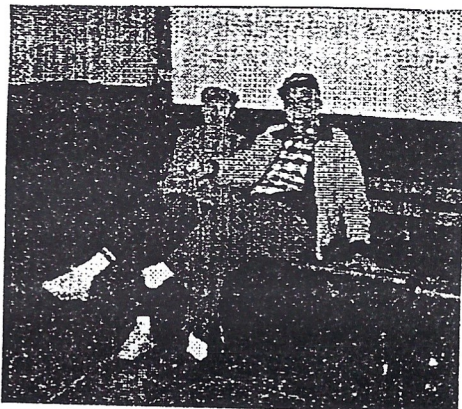

keep up the bloodline. This I have strived for. A few weeks later, Henry passed away. I will be forever grateful for this help and teachings. I owe my father and Henry Witt a great deal of gratitude for my success in breeding Cochins.

Over the years I have tried my luck, for a short time with Buff, Red, Barred, Partridge, Columbian and now I have a few whites. I keep them to try my hand at improving quality, type, and to gain knowledge of breeding traits.

Mr. Witt often told me that if I had forty acres, I had only enough room for one breed and variety to be a success with breeding Cochins. I have found this to be true, and to improve what you have, you must stick to one variety. More than one variety tends to distract you from what you are striving for in the other. I raise all young birds on wire until

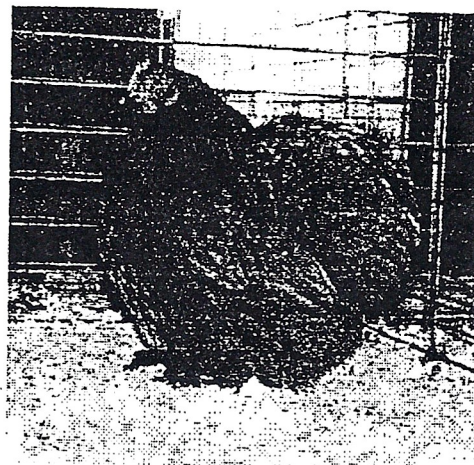
care and attention. Feed and water alone does not make a champion. Patience, lots of care and love and experience will make a breeder.

BREEDING BUFF COCHINS

The Cochin International, all Cochin National Meet is now history.

I am very pleased with the turn out, we had 11 exhibitors with 138 birds, not big on numbers, but big on quality. The black cochin bantams were impressive with 49 in the class. Bill Shrum had lots of time to spend with them, justice was well done.

We set the building up with teal blue skirts with white contrast, all rosettes were pink and burgundy with white except for champion row we used blue with white.

We had a show case where we put all the plaques on display along with our big rosette for grand champion of the show. It looked great!

I've come to the conclusion that I would like to do it again sometime in the future.

Having always had interest in poultry, my first love however is with Buff cochins, both standards and also the bantams. Having been trained in plant breeding, and raising standards some fifteen years ago, I've utilized these experiences in cochin bantam breeding. With plants the further you go from a desirable characteristic the greater chances you have of picking up off types or types which have been introduced into the line many generations ago and were long forgotten. In addition, by going out of a particular line it may take longer to get back to the desired characteristics in a bird that you desire. Therefore, you should always be careful when introducing new blood into your flock

since you may not always get the results you expect.

After talking with various poultry breeders (not necessarily cochin breeders), I've come to realize that certain breeds must be handled in their own special way and this may hold true for colors within a breed. Certain colors are easier to breed and/or the perfection of breeding may be more advanced in specific colors. Buff is difficult to breed, along with the laced and penciled varieties and others.

In the case of the BUFF cochin bantams, I feel that the way to go is with ruthless culling by breeding for type and color. To begin with, I raised 80 buffs and have kept only 7 for possible breeders to go with the other three older breeders I have.

Next, it is very important to study and

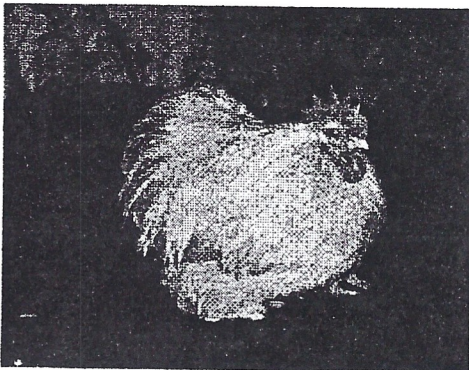
evaluate each and every bird on their strong and weak points and pair up birds which compliment each other. This means to pair up a bird which has a little darker color to a little lighter color, good type to lesser type, excellent fluff to less fluff, etc. This should produce birds that are closer to the cochin type and standard. To help fix the genes in as short a period of time as possible, the breeder must know which birds are producing the better birds, or the birds with the most desirable characteristics. Just because a bird has the phenotype (that a bird appears like) characteristics this does not necessarily mean that the bird will pass these characteristics onto their offspring. Certain characteristics may be dominate in one line and recessive in another. For example, certain production lines of white leghorns are dominant for white whereas others are recessive for white. The serious breeder should consider pen mating buff cochins or use trap nests. This will take a little extra care when we consider pen mating, rotating roosters, and marking each and every egg, etc. The last, but certainly not the least, is keeping track of the chicks when the hatch is due. Oh, how disappointing to have several chicks hatch out at the same time, and you know these chicks are from your chosen breeders, but you don't know the parentage of the offspring. By keeping close tabs of the matins, this will allow you to fix the quality genes in your line quicker and easier and at some point you will be able to begin to breed good birds to good birds. With the buffs this is more difficult to achieve than with some of the other colors. Buff Cochin breeders need to raise a good number of birds and cull hard. Especially with buffs, the color, type, fluff and head are all hard to achieve, and hard culling from large numbers of birds are necessary to achieve a good buff color.

To avoid too much inbreeding, a good breeder should maintain at least two related matings of related birds, if he has just a few birds. This will allow him to cross over every few generations and increase vigor, and still be within his line of birds. At the very least I would suggest maintaining two trios which are related or better yet three trios. This will allow for three distinct lines to be used as crosses later, and if the unthinkable happens like one of the roosters dies then you still have extra roosters. This is but one of the consequences where the breeder can not breed a considerable number of birds.

In conclusion, talk to several breeders and judges to learn what a good buff cochin looks like. At the shows study the awarded birds in the black and white colors. These colors usually have the better type and have been bred to perfection. Buff cochin breeders can learn a lot by studying these other colors of birds. By studying these birds, this will allow you to learn and engrain in your mind what cochin type should look like. With some luck and a lot of hard work expect to have written on your entry card BV, BB, Best Featherleg or better yet, Best of Show.

GRASS AND WIRE BOTTOM CAGES

When visiting with poultry breeders I'm always evaluating how they have designed their cages, brooders, etc. I now have a cage which I'm pleased with and is a combination of several designs I've seen. The cages may be designed for whatever size you wish: laying hens, small birds and any number of birds you so desire. My basic design is a 2x2x2 house with a 2x4x2 cage. Construct the house out of 2"x 2" boards with a plywood covering on three walls. The front door/opening area has the top 1/2 cov-

ered. The roof is plywood covered with tin and hinged so the entire roof lifts. The roof is slanted to shed away water from the cage area.

The coop is made of 2x4 welded wire, however, there is a 2"x 2" wood frame around the bottom of the cage. It is best to treat all 2x2's to help prevent rot. This cage has an opening in the top for adding or taking birds out. The key to this cage is to add a wire bottom of 1/2 by 1 welded wire placed on top of the 2x2 in both the house and the cage. This will allow the birds to be off the ground and out of the mud, while still being able to eat grass as it grows into the cage or they may stick their head out of the wire cage and eat around the cage. The birds stay clean on the wire and healthy by supplementing their diet with fresh

green grass daily.

Once the house and cage are attached the house should be some 2" off the ground, however, the back will need to be supported to help balance or steady the house.

Many variations may be added to the cage and house and some suggestions follow:

1. Cage may be made of smaller wire to prevent the birds from picking up parasites from the soil.
2. Removable roosts may be added to the house.
3. Food and water may be added to the house area to be protected from the weather.
4. Trap door added between house and cage to aid in capture of birds.

I raise cochins in these cages until I am ready to finish the birds, at which time the birds which have survived the cull, will be transferred to individual cages 18" square with wood shavings in the bottom of the cage. Try a cage like this grass and wire bottom cage and see if it works for you.

INDIVIDUAL COOPING ON WIRE FOR COCHIN BANTAMS

During my informative years, I must admit, watching my father build and rebuild cages and nests and more cages and more nests, I, too, became obsessed with finding the perfect cooping arrangement. For various reasons, each of us has unique requirements for our birds. Until something new comes along, I feel I have settled on the best system for cochin bantams. I now individually coop all of my adult breeders

and the vast majority of my show team in separate all-wire cages. I build all of my cages myself to my own specifications. For now, I have settled on a cage 4' long x 2' deep x 16" high. This size will actually be divided into two cages of equal size, thus housing 2 birds. I have experimented with a smaller cage, not only for space limitations, but also for females who do not need the additional height. Although, one might be perfectly content with a smaller cage, I have chosen to remain with this size for uniformity and for exchangeability of males and females. It also allows for each individual to "get more exercise". A critical addition I have made over time, is to add a double partition or divider separating the two pens. Some birds are prone to feather pulling (perhaps due to boredom) and of course the boys like to fight... the double wire partition has completely eliminated any problems. The layout of the front is shown in the diagram. I use 1x1 wire (16ga.) for the floor, 1x2 for the front, back, ends and top and 1/2 x 1 for the middle partition(s). These sizes were arrived at based on cost and experimentation. It is important to buy special pliers for cutting the wire flush...those sharp burrs can cut. I also recommend vinyl edges to be placed around all openings. My feeders and water containers are the plastic style hung on the OUTSIDE of the pens. Once built these cages are very sturdy. I hang them from L shaped hooks (2 per cage) in banks of 3 or 4. Space each 4' cage at least 3" above or below a neighboring cage to allow for a "manure catcher". I have used everything from newspaper to plywood... and have finally settled on 1/4 plywood.

With any system of management, there are pros and cons. I am sure there are some of you that would never consider individual penning of your cochins. However, I believe the pluses far outweigh the minuses. Bird cleanliness, monitoring feed and water intake, administering medications, automatic quarantine, positive identification of eggs, less show washing just to mention a few.....

The choice is yours....

Both of our 1995 Cochin Nationals are completed and were a great success! Bernice writes from Canada that they had 138 cochins and 11 exhibitors and Wayne writes from Louisiana that they had 140 cochins, and great cochin competition. I can attest to that. The weather was sweet for a northerner, about 75, sunshine. We made a lot of new friends, which was very easy with the folks down there. Ate a lot of wonderful crawfish. Saw moss in the trees. It was a fun trip. My husband came along to help drive. We did it in two days... one 12 day...one 8 hour day. Total miles 1130. Mike enjoyed it also and he even helped me clean up the birds. (He said they were probably the ones that didn't have a chance).

Our referendum on dividing the northeast into 2 districts has been completed. The vote totals 11 in favor and 1 opposed. Not much of a membership participation! This will be a good thing and the east is very excited about it. Here's the division:

I spoke with Bob Anderson and he made several contacts with no results. He feels a district mailing should be made to the membership in the Pacific area explaining how to encourage poultry clubs in your area to bid on our National. Our club can only afford to offer the plaques that it is doing now. Money awards have to come from the Host Poultry show and from cochin breeders participating. Because we have not received a bid, I have bumped the rotation ahead to the west central area and have notified Mark Peterson that his area can offer me a bid up to Jan. 1, 1996. He was quite sure that the Hutchinson club that is hosting the 1996 APA National would be interested in bidding. I will keep you informed. The Pacific area will be able to bid on the next rotation in 1997.

There has been a real interest in offering a **LIFE MEMBERSHIP**. Dennis Wollard, Karl Rau and myself are going to work out the details. The money will be invested in a certificate and will not be touched. We need to decide whether to use: 1) All of the interest for club operations, 2) 1/2 of the interest and reinvest the rest, 3) or none of the interest and reinvest it all. Please begin to send in your articles for the cochin book that we are beginning to

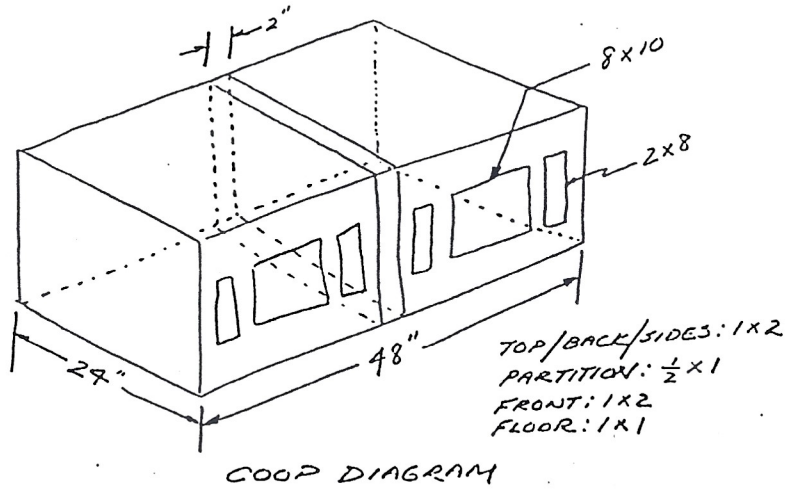

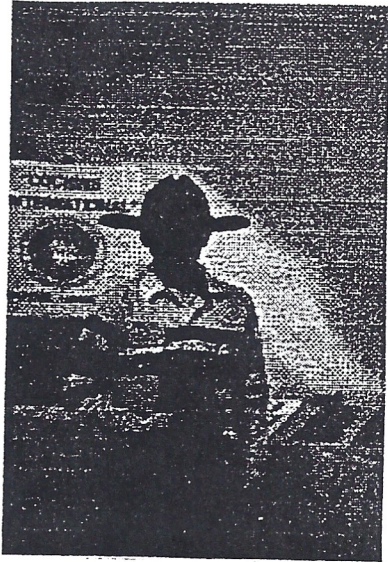

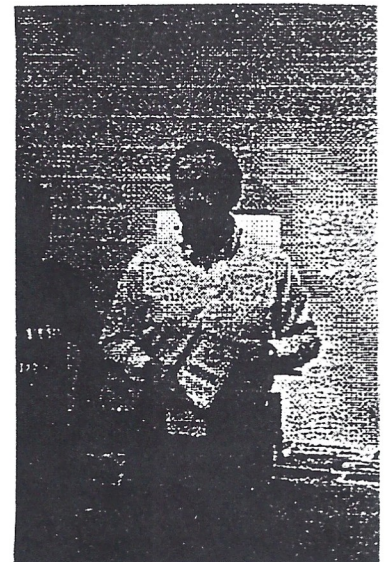

Ref.: APA Standard Revision Suggestions:

Dear Mr. Malone:

I submit the following suggestion:
Since all waterfowl, including Bantam ducks, have now been given equal status in all championship condiserations, why can't the display age/sex options for chickens be made the same as for ducks?

Presently a waterfowl display consists of "old male, old female, yg. male, yg. female & 3 more of the same variety, either sex; whereas a chicken display must consist of cock, hen, cockerel, pullet and either an old or young trio.

I believe we could attract more fine chicken displays if the age/sex options in display make up were the same as waterfowl. This would also allow chicken exhibitors to earn display credits in some smaller shows that do not have trio classes.

There may be a good reason for having the existing class options that I am unaware of. If so, OK, I'm not going to loose any sleep over it.

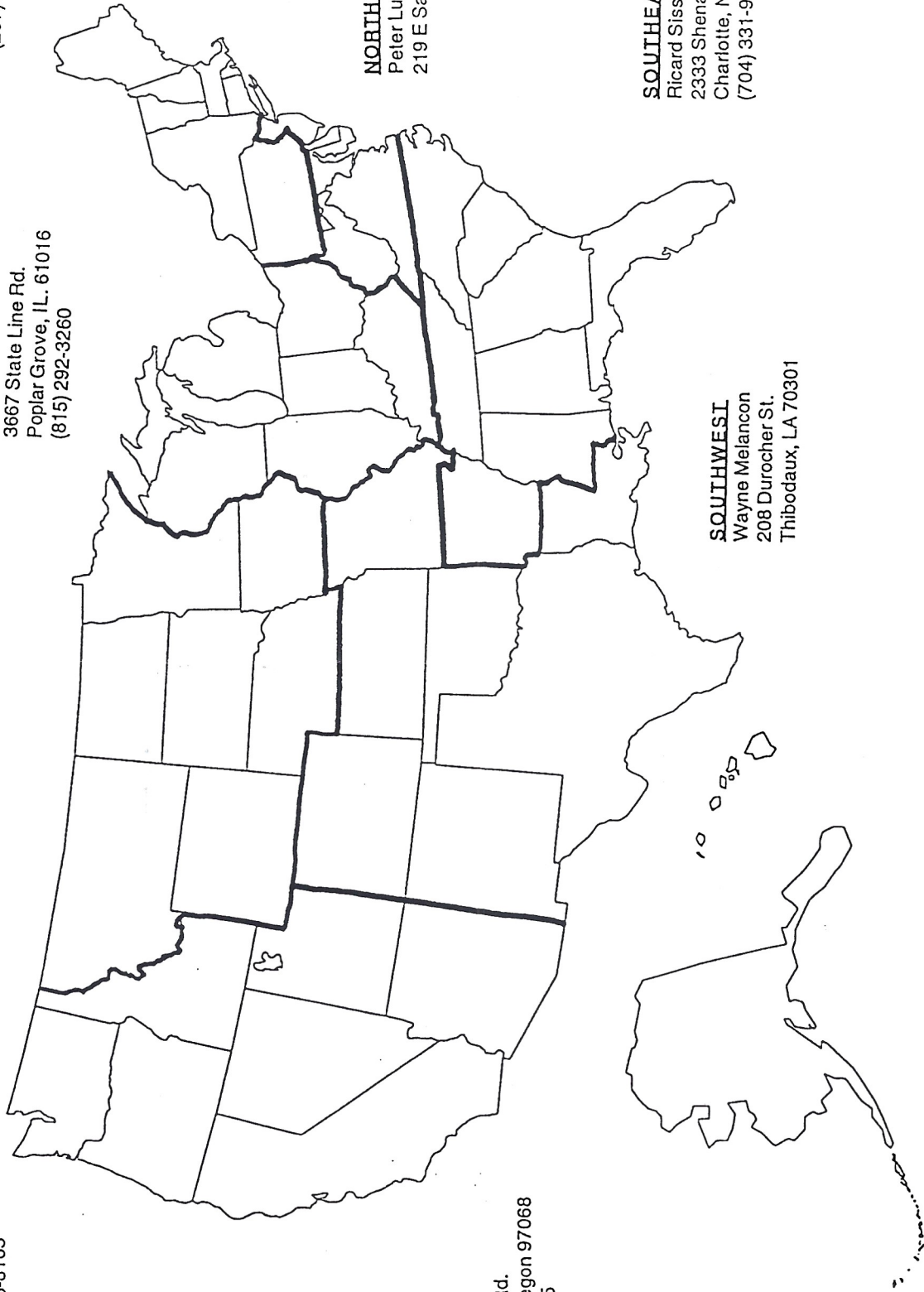
