## Vice-President's Corner:

Hello to all!

It is such an honor and privilege to have been elected Vice-president for this year. What I lack in experience as a club officer, I more than make up for in my enthusiasm and devotion to the club and our breed. I plan to prove to be as capable (but maybe not as knowledgeable) as Mr. Anderson would be in this position. Congratulations to the other officers and directors elected to serve our club!

For those of you I have met, either in person or on the phone, I have enjoyed good conversation and many good friends. For those I have not had the opportunity to meet, let me introduce myself.

I first fell in love with the endearing Cochin about six years ago when I was given a large Blue pullet as a farm-warming gift by a dear friend. It was love at first sight. Not only the breed, but the variety. We have grown from a 10' X 12' shed that housed about a dozen birds in Florida into two barns (one 18' X 24' with enclosed outdoor runs, and one 12' X 20' with an additional bathing and feeding room) that house up to 60 adult and started birds. Chicks are hatched and brooded in a spare room in the house, being moved to a barn at 3 weeks of age. We don't have as large an operation as many people do (hatching about 100 chicks last year), but prefer to keep it small enough that quality time can be spent at each barn daily.

Since I only work part-time at night, as a K-9 security officer, I have my days to spend with the birds. Pens are cleaned daily, one to two times, waterers scrubbed every two to three days and birds fed two times a day.

Owning exhibition poultry has been another avenue of experience and competition with animals for me. As a child, animals were always present in our home; and as an adult I have bred, trained and exhibited canaries, love-birds, quarter horses, European Dobermans (not to mention being a foster mother to rabbits, squirrels, cats, etc.). Fortunately, my husband (of 18 years) has supported me, especially financially, through my endeavors. Currently we also have Jacob Sheep and two German Dobermans which I use on the job.

I feel it is very important for the future of our breed that we, as exhibitors and breeders strive to create the Cochin described in the Standard of Perfection and not follow fads that surface in the showroom. Every year before setting up any breeding pens I re-read the Standard and study the pictures, getting straight what I need to concentrate on and improve on. My birds are in no way perfect, and every year my goal is to breed better birds than the year before.

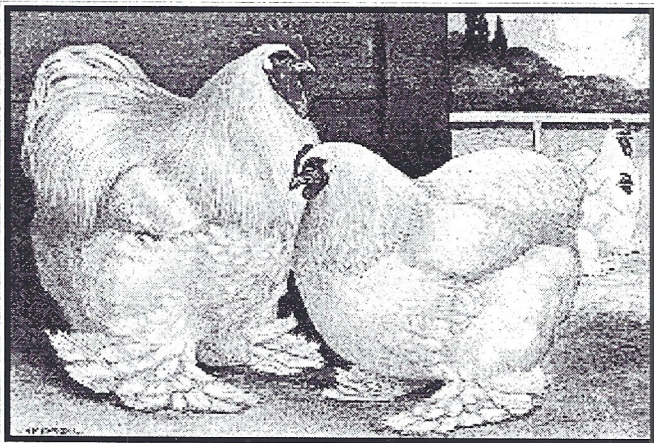
When selling birds, I try to provide Xeroxed copies of the Standards for Cochins to customers who are interested in breeding or showing, so from the beginning they will have a description of the ideal bird.

Attending one to two shows a month from October to May, I learn something new at every show, and meet lots of great folks. Sharing information about Cochins with others is a very enjoyable experience and newcomers should be encouraged as they may well be the breeders and exhibitors of the future.

I look for great things to happen in our club in the coming years and hope to meet each and every one of you in the future.

Happy hatching and may you breed many champions!

## From Your Secretary:

Minutes by Dennis Wollard from the business meeting held at the Cochins International Western National, November, 1999 in Claremore, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order by President Pat Lacey at 9:00 AM on Sunday with eleven members present. The officers were introduced along with guests. The first item discussed was the number of birds in the show and that everyone was pleased not only with the number, but also pleased with the variety of colors represented in the bantams. There were some 170 bantams and 26 large birds in the show. As voted upon previously, there was a clarification concerning the trophies. Trophies are given at National Meets, and certificates given at District Meets. The club is caught up on trophies. Everyone was encouraged to vote in the upcoming elections, and to run for office. Currently, Bill Ryan and Scott Adams are running for president, Dawn Ware and Charlie Anderson are running for vice-president, along with Jamie Matts and William Ziehm for the Northeast 1, and Bernita Miller and Wayne Melancon for the Southwest District. The other districts are uncontested. The Secretary/Treasurer office is also uncontested.

Pat pointed out that the Newsletter is being published three times a year and it has been an excellent newsletter. Master Breeder points are offered by the club, however there has been some problems with the points. Tom Roebuck Jr. is doing an excellent job with the points and problems arise when the show secretary does not send the show report to Tom. ## Northeast District II Update:

Our 1999 Northeast II District Meet held in Richmond, VA on 20-21 November, 1999 turned out to be a tremendous success. We had 106 bantams and 46 large fowl, which made for an outstanding exhibit of Cochins over all. Tom Roebuck, our newsletter editor, was present and assisted in taking pictures of the winners, as well as with the signing up of new members. The following exhibitors joined CI in Richmond: Bonnie S. Cave of Front Royal, VA, John O. Burgess of Mason Neck, VA, Danny Dysart of Woodstock, VA and Robert and Effie Crane of Morganton, NC. I would like to extend a hearty welcome to all of you. In addition, Tom contributed a beautiful framed print of buff bantams for the winner of the best of variety buff. The lucky winner was Danny Dysart of Woodstock, VA on a buff cockerel. Speaking of winners, Cochins really made a big impact at the show. Bill West of NY won Champion Asiatic and Large Fowl with a big buff cockerel. Bill also garnered Res. Champion Asiatic with a buff pullet. In bantams, Robert and Effie Crane of Morganton, NC, who are known as "The Cranes", won best of breed and Champion Featherleg on a beautiful black pullet. Charlie Anderson of Connecticut won Res. of Breed, also on a black pullet, and of course Charlie had his usual Best and Res. of Variety with his blue bantams.

I had the pleasure of meeting several people for the first time in Richmond. Charlie Anderson and I discussed blue and black bantams and the club in general. Tom Roebuck and I met for the first time and although neither one of us seemed to have a spare minute to talk with each other very much I enjoyed meeting him and I greatly appreciate his help and overall presence at the show. I met Dawn Ware, who exhibits very nice large fowl in black, splash and blue and is our new Vice President. George Mitchell, who I have met previously, was there with his black bantams and some large partridge he is working with. I finally met Tom and Pat Rice who show good numbers of several varieties of large fowl and who are almost single handily responsible for making our Regional Meet in Frederick a success due to the numbers and varieties of large Cochins they exhibited there. Despite our good intentions to have a CI meeting at the show we all never seemed to be able to congregate at the same time to do this but we will try again next time!

As special recognition for our 1999 District Meet in Richmond, large rosettes were furnished for the overall champion Cochin (Bill West – winner), the Champion and Res. Champion large Cochin (Bill West – winner of both) and the Champion and Res. Champion bantam Cochin (The Cranes and Charles Anderson respectively).

Our 2000 District Meet has been placed with the Delmarva Poultry Fancier's Show in celebration of their 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Several other District Meets have been placed at this show as well, such as the Plymouth Rock Fancier's Club, and it should prove to be a good District Meet. One item of question is the continuance of the large rosettes for future District Meets. Most members liked the idea, I think a few did not care otherwise, whereas one member suggested a rosette for each best of variety exhibited in large fowl and bantam. I would greatly appreciate your opinions and remarks either via mail, e-mail ([bill.lewis@intervet.akzonobel.nl](mailto:bill.lewis@intervet.akzonobel.nl)) or phone (302-644-0467 or 934-4340). Rich Barczewski and I split the bill (approx. \$52.00) for the rosettes awarded in Richmond and would appreciate any additional help if you are willing. Now that the logos, etc...are established with the printer of the rosettes the prices will be lower in the future, however with the possible addition of BV rosettes the costs will stay within the \$40.00 to \$50.00 range. Rich has offered to help with the rosettes for the 2000 District Meet as well, so based on your comments and interests, in combination with contributions and what Rich and I have to work with we will see what will be available for the 2000 District Meet. Please let me hear from you.

At this time snow is falling in Delaware but the birds are doing well. I am still working with some blue and black bantams and will probably show some of each at the Delmarva Show and more continuously thereafter. Hope each of you is enjoying the New Year and I look forward to seeing you at the next show. I would also like to personally thank Mr. Robert Hawes for representing our club as Northeast Director 1 for the past few years and may I pickup where he has left off and continue to stride ahead.

I would like to take this opportunity to tell you about myself. My name is Jamie Matts. I am 28 years old and have been raising Cochins for the past 14 years. I have been married for the past 4 years to my wonderful wife Terri and we have a 2 year old daughter named Megan. I have been strictly a Cochin breeder for the past 8 or 9 years. I purchased my first quality Cochins from Mr. George Schroeder, whom I learned a great deal from including how to artificially inseminate birds. I think my greatest lesson learned was from Mr. John Hayes as his words always ring true "It cost no more to raise a barnyard bird then it does a quality showbird." I cannot begin to list all the people who have influenced me over the years. Just know that all the advice given I have used to make my own conclusions about this breed. I currently raise Cochin bantams in the following colors: Black, White, Blue, Mottled, Blue Mottled, Columbian, and Partridge. I just started with Buff Standards. I have about 150 adult birds and have been hatching since December 1, 1999 with about 250 chicks at this time.

We recently went to the Northeast Poultry Congress Show in Springfield, MA, on January 15th & 16th. There were over 100 Cochins represented at this regional meet. Coming out on top for the Bantams was Tom & Kathy Roebuck Sr. with a black hen that was BV & BB. A black cock also shown by Tom & Kathy took RV & RB. A blue hen by Ken Johnson was BV and RV went to a pullet by Charlie Anderson. Both BV & RV Buff went to Jeff Ryan with a pullet and a cockerel out of the trio class. Best Variety in the whites was a cock bird by Jamie Matts and reserve went to Donna Lamb on a nice pullet. BV & RV Columbian went to Jamie Matts along with BV & RV Mottled. The Blue Mottled class was taken by Norman Rau with a cock bird and RV was a pullet by Jamie Matts. The best part of all of this is that I got to spend time with my "chicken" friends, and add new friends to that list! That, after all, is what this hobby is

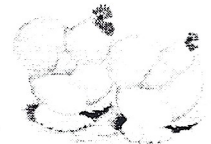

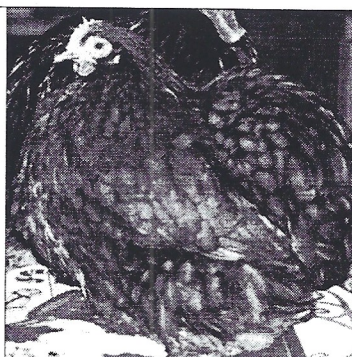

## PERFECT BIRD PENS

Our newsletter editor, Tom Roebuck, has been begging for articles about bird housing and cooping arrangements for a couple of issues now. I have been waiting patiently for my fellow readers to step forward with their version of the perfect pen setup. Thus far, no one has anything to offer. I can only assume this is due to one of two reasons: No one wants to admit they have not found the perfect setup or; they have the perfect setup and wish to keep it a closely guarded secret!

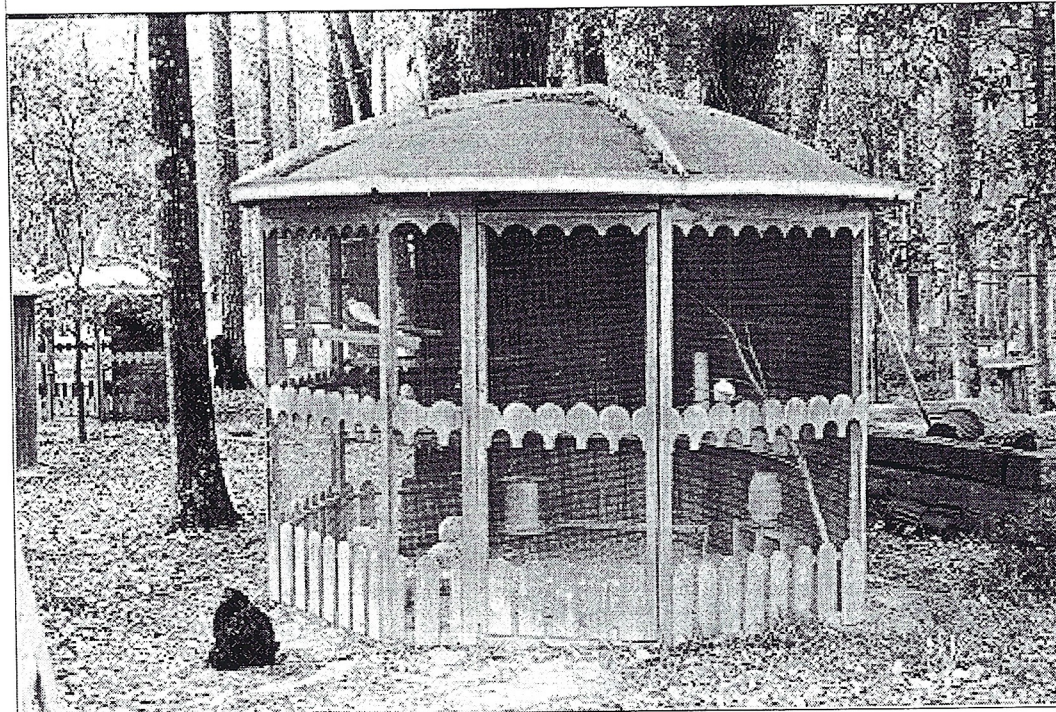
To those who have chicken houses that have been blessed with perfection, read no further! To the rest of us, maybe if we all offer up our ideas, we can catch up with the "other folks". In the hope of getting all of you to "open up", I am coming out of the closet to humbly offer my ideas and thoughts on pen setups.

When I began raising Cochins in earnest three years ago, several things became apparent. Raising Cochins in the numbers required to produce show stock would take a lot of time and work. I had to build pens suited to the birds, the climate and my budget.

Like most of my colleagues, I began by getting and raising birds first, then building the pens necessary to house them. To any beginners out there, do not do that! Build or buy the pens you can afford, then raise only the birds you can comfortably house. You and your birds will thank you come show season. Limit your efforts! Before you begin hatching, determine the number of birds you can hatch and raise. Establish a cut-off date to stop setting eggs. If you stretch your hatches too long into the season, you will have birds in too many stages of development, requiring more pens, money and time.

When I started thinking about pens for my Cochins, I thought of how I could use buildings that I already had. For raising young birds to maturity, I decided to use old pens previously built for pigeons and doves. These were built with economy and aesthetics in mind. An old satellite dish provides an inexpensive roof for a gazebo that is cheap to build and looks good in our woodland landscape. With the introduction of the popular TV mini-dishes, the old large dishes are being discarded. After contacting a local installer, I soon had dishes free for the taking!

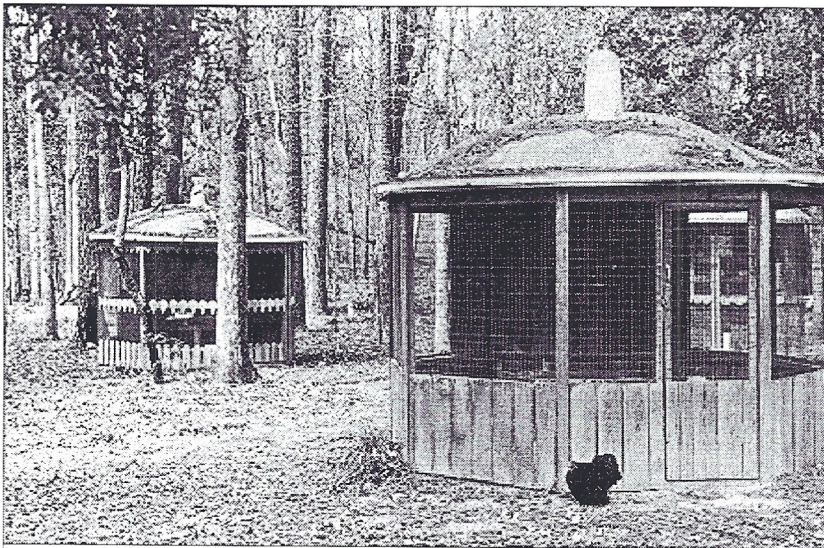
A fiberglass dish 10 feet in diameter can be used to make an 8-sided gazebo about 9 feet across. The walls are 6 feet high and made of 2 x 4 x 12s halved and split into 2 x 2s. Any combination of wire and siding can be used to suit the climate. It is hot in lower Alabama with mild, windy winters. I chose to wall in the north side of my gaze-

bos to block the winter wind. The rest of the sides are covered with wire. Hardware cloth is preferred to keep snakes out. Welded wire is less expensive and more durable if snakes are not a problem. I wish I had used screen wire. Mosquitoes are a serious problem in the summer and cause fowl pox outbreaks.

As illustrated, I added gingerbread trim to some of the houses for looks. When I began raising birds, I vowed to avoid having a bunch of ugly coops scattered all over the place. I have half way succeeded. The pictures shown were strategically taken to avoid showing the other half of my operation!

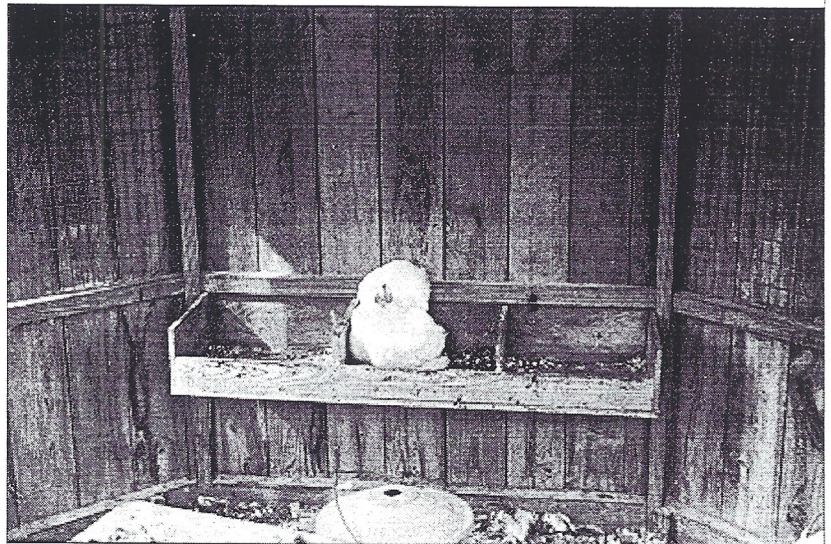


I have four such pens built to date. I can raise up to 20 birds to maturity in each. I prefer to keep the number down to 12-16. The birds aren't as crowded and the mess is easier to manage. Clean white sand is the best litter I have found for my outdoor pens. The birds can bathe in it. Sand doesn't hurt the foot feathers and is easy to rake droppings out of. I change the sand completely once a year and refresh as needed through the growing season. I use 25-pound feeders and 3-gallon plastic waterers in each pen. I intend to run underground waterlines and electrical wiring to each pen. This will enable automatic waterer and light installation. I believe in doing everything possible to

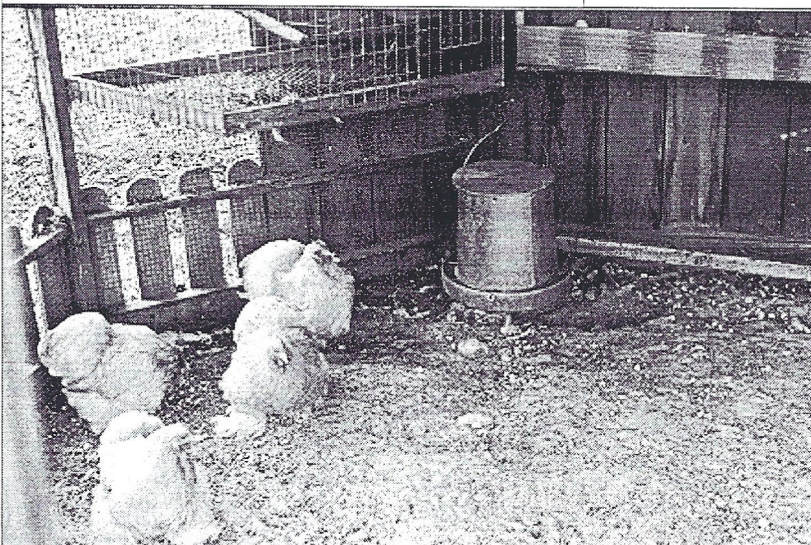
cut down on the mundane, labor intensive chores. I can then spend more quality time taming and caring for the individual birds.

The advantages of these pens are: (1) They are nice to look at. I get a lot of compliments. (2) Disease control. The birds are spread out. Birds that have health problems are isolated from those in other pens, making treatment easier and more economical. (3) Odor control. The birds are not as concentrated, making a more pleasant environment for them and me! (4) The birds are relatively cool in our hot summer months. The pens are shaded and not crowded.

The disadvantages: (1) I have to walk a lot to feed and water the individual pens. (2) I can't think of any others, but I am sure there are some!

The children have moved out and some of my hens have left the breeding pens to enjoy more room in a gazebo!

After the young birds are raised, culled, sold and committed to the show pens, I move most of the breeder hens out to the gazebos. They enjoy the freedom and each other's company. I have breeder and show conditioning coops set up in another building. In the next issue, I will share what I have developed for those pens. I welcome comments, criticism, suggestions and questions on what I have shared so far. If anyone would like more information, dimensions, etc. concerning the gazebos, I will be happy to help. I am still looking for the perfect setup, so please speak up and share anything you have!

## Hatching Egg Care

As the spring hatching season approaches, most poultrymen will find it necessary to store eggs until enough can be accumulated to set the incubator. Of course, it would be possible to set the eggs each day as they are gathered, but that means they would hatch every day also resulting in chicks of all ages. Therefore, lets review proper hatching egg care.

The first step in the production of quality hatching eggs is to have a healthy, parasite free breeder flock. Any time that there are unhealthy birds in the flock, hatchability will be lower. The same may be true if the flock is heavily infested with internal parasites. External parasite problems may, sometime become so bad that the males will not mate with the hens. Therefore, make sure that the breeders are in top physical condition.

After the flock is producing fertile eggs, the next step is to get them gathered safely to maintain this fertility. During extremely cold or hot weather this is most important and eggs will have to be gathered several times a day. Also, in respect to gathering, nest management should be mentioned. Many hobbyists do not provide nests, but in any case, the facilities should be managed so that eggs remain as clean as possible. Very badly soiled eggs are often a problem. The best recommendation as far as these eggs are concerned is to throw them away. This applies to eggs badly contaminated with droppings or egg materials. There is always an inclination to wash these eggs, but this is almost never recommended. If the eggs are not badly soiled with droppings, they can be sanded lightly with a piece of sand-paper to remove adhering material. Washing is not recommended because it removes a protective sealer over the shell and improper washing increases the chance that bacteria will get into the egg. Bacterial contamination inside the egg sometimes causes the eggs to explode in the incubator, contaminating the incubator as well as the rest of the eggs.

After the eggs have been gathered, there are certain practices to keep in mind in regard to storage. First, how long can they be stored? Generally, seven to ten days is about as long as hatching eggs should be saved if maximum hatchability is to be maintained. Eggs may be stored for up to three weeks under proper conditions, and hatchability will be slightly lower. The proper conditions for storage include many factors. First, the proper temperature is about 55 - 60 degrees Fahrenheit (the temperature of many cellars and basements). Refrigerator temperatures are too low and will lower hatchability. Certainly, temperatures above 75 degrees should be avoided as they allow the embryo to develop very slowly and may eventually kill it. The 55 degree temperature causes it to remain dormant.

The storage room should also be relatively humid to prevent excess evaporation of water through the shell. About 75 - 80 % relative humidity seems to be acceptable. If eggs are stored under excessively humid conditions, molds may grow on and through the shell.

If the eggs are to be stored for several days, the cartons should be tilted daily. This can be done by placing a block under one end of the carton and switching ends daily. There is some doubt as to whether this is necessary or not. Certainly, if the eggs are held for ten days or less, it is not beneficial. There also has been debate as to whether to store the eggs with the large or small end up. Traditionally, hatching eggs have been stored with the large end up. However, some research in Canada indicated that eggs stored with the small end up, hatched very well, so it probably doesn't make much difference as to position in storage. This should not be confused with position of the egg during incubation. Very low hatches will occur if eggs are incubated small end up.

## Starting a Strain of Partridge Cochins

### My Experiences

I've been raising show poultry for over 27 years and I would like to share some of my ideas and experiences with my fellow Cochin breeders and exhibitors. When I started I lived on a ranch with my Grandmother, who knew a lot about farm fowl, but not much about show. She taught me about the care of our farm flock that was made up of feed store Barred Rocks and Leghorns.

After learning the basics I started to get curious about the different breeds of poultry. Every chance I got I had my nose in some type of poultry book or magazine. I talked my grandmother into ordering some chicks from a hatchery in Oregon (don't remember the name), but we ordered some Black and Buff Minorcas. They showed up in the mail and I took very good care of them, losing only two out of the fifty chicks! After they matured I noticed that they weren't the right color (this was back in the 70's). Every year I tried to order something else from the hatcheries, with most of the stock being very poor in type of whichever breed I chose.

During this time frame I started showing at the local County Fair. My first show I entered the Feed store quality Barred Rock Hen and a Buff Leghorn pullet that my Aunt bought me for Christmas that year. To my disappointment the Barred hen was disqualified for not being up to the Standard of Perfection, and my Buff Leghorn pullet got a second place finish. That did though!! I was hooked on showing poultry!

I then bought my first pair of Partridge Cochin Large Fowl from a lady named Erma Smith, from Santa Maria, CA (my hometown). She and her husband, showed all over the United States, showing many breeds. Judge Dave Anderson lived in Santa

Maria at this time and I met him through my 4-H Club. He offered to take my Partridge hen to the Pomona Winter Show for me. This was my first showing at a poultry show other than the County Fair. She placed first and I was very excited, so I decided to start breeding Partridge Cochins!

Dave offered to hatch some eggs for me and I gave him a dozen. Out of these I got three chicks but they were so inbred that he had to peel them out of the eggs! I asked around for breeders of Large Cochins and was given the names of two of the best breeders in the country; Arthur Manly and George Priest.

I wanted new Partridge blood to cross into my already inbred strain, so I made a trip to Fresno, CA, to see Mr. Manly. I couldn't believe my eyes when I got to his place! He had more Cochins than I had ever seen in one place and every one of them was beautiful! He told me he would sell me some of his culls. I expected to see some very ugly birds, but when he took me over to see the ones he was talking about I was quite surprised! They were big, nicely feathered feet, and perfect penciling. He was culling very strictly. For instance, if he had a hen with a bad comb he was culling her, no matter what her body type! I bought about five hens to use in my breeding program. I crossed these females with my partridge male and had very good luck. I then showed one of the resulting pullets the following year at the Fresno Show and won first place. Eventually, I won Champion Large Fowl trio with these Partridge Cochins. This was the first time that this had happened in California.

After this I had some financial setbacks and had to get rid of my beautiful flock of Partridge Cochins. I

gave them to a relative and she kept them for about a month and then gave them to another woman. George Priest caught wind of this and bought up the whole flock. This was George's start with Partridge Cochins. He had only Blacks and Whites at the time.

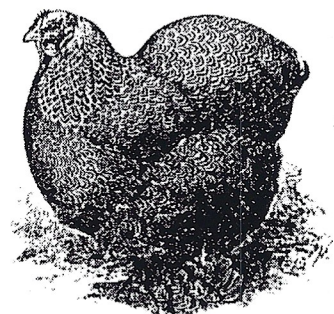
Three years later I decided to get back into Cochins so I paid George a visit to buy back some of my strain. He sold me a very nice young pair and they are the parent stock of my now very nice flock of Large Partridge. Thanks to George for maintaining the bloodline and adding to it with other strains he had crossed into it.

Recently, I won Reserve Champion Asiatic with a very nice Partridge hen and I would like to share some good sources of Partridge Cochin with my fellow members; George Priest, Bakersfield, CA, myself, here in Santa Maria, CA, and Duane Urch. Duane has a very good strain of Partridge and sells hatching eggs as well as chicks.

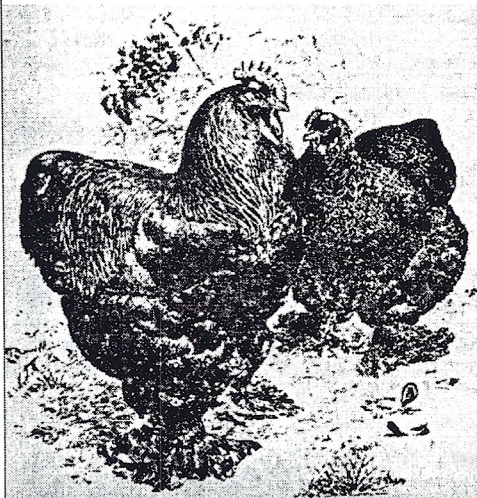
I could go on and on about the Partridge Cochins, but I think this is enough for now.

## Postcard Art!



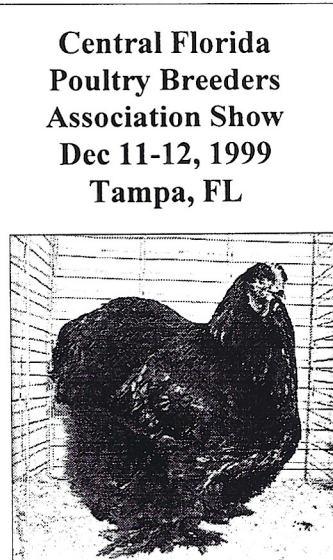

## Double Mating Partridge Cochins

By Millard N. Capp

(from the Bantam Magazine 1945, reprinted by the ABA 1979)

Partridge Cochins may be single or double mated. Many breeders consider double mating the only way to breed the Partridge color. From my experience I suggest the following for double mating.

For cockerel mating select the male as near to Standard as possible, with good rich red surface, brilliant black breast, free from red, well striped saddle and hackle. Type should also be considered, as well as looseness of feather and quality. To such a male mate females as good as you have, with good even mahogany top color showing prominent striping in the hackle. Fluff color may be more or less broken up, but not smutty. Both male and females should breed some good exhibition males, but the female will generally be good only for cockerel breeders, and hard to sell, but to the double mating enthusiast they are invaluable for breeding purposes.

For pullet mating, select females as near Standard as possible, with good even top color of mahogany, penciled most profusely with good distinct lustrous greenish black. Hackle on females should be penciled and not striped. General type and undercolor should be given consideration. To these females mate a male that is a trifle lighter in undercolor and top color than in cockerel mating, with a great deal of red in the breast and fluff, and showing as little striping in hackle and saddle as possible. On the females try to get the most distinct penciling, with sharply defined black pencilings the most desirable. From such a mating you should get some good exhibition females, but the males (as the females on the cockerel mating) will be good only for breeders. Occasionally, from each pen, there will result a bird of the opposite mating that will be an unusually good exhibition bird.
