The Red Cochin Bantam

By George A. McCarley (Reprinted from the 1952 ABA Yearbook)

First, my thanks for the invitation for our secretary for the opportunity to discuss the Red Cochin Bantam and second, to apologize to the general bantam loving public for the poor attempt I shall make to discuss this idea. As I start this article, it seems that I am not capable of such a task. When one stops to think of trying to describe something that no definite pattern has been laid out for, it is like a builder trying to describe a building that no blue print has been drawn for. I would like to bring to attention before going into detail, that any idea or thought expressed here after are mine and open for discussion.

To me, a good Red Cochin is a joy to behold. The first thing naturally one would think of in breeding would be type; good feathers, plenty of them and a loose fluffy nature, deep breast, body not too close to ground, neat wing fold with head and tail carried almost on an even keel, body being tilted slightly forward. This to my way of thinking would be type that no one would be ashamed of. sacrifice type for color. This would be a sad mistake. So after we have our type, color comes next. I definitely believe that color is a real factor to offspring. I will probably draw some crossfire here in my article as I state that I think that a good Red can only come from a Black-Buff combination. I know some breeders will argue on adding Partridge blood. There are lots of Partridge males being used in trying to perfect the Red but I will not agree that this is a wise idea. You will see some good Reds that have Partridge origin, but generally on close examination one will find faint tracings on back and breast feathers as of barring on the Partridge.

Now as to color. My ideal color is the same as the Rhode Island Red. By this red, I mean one that is a clear red and not a reddish brown. Undercolor should show a good color of red on down to the skin. White or buff undercolor is undesirable. The quill of the feather must be red also and not orange or buff. There should be not patches of black or brown feathers on shawl or body. I think that maybe a few black feathers in wing or tail would be permissible. I have talked to

some breeders on this matter and they say that the black in wings and tail should be a must. My opinion on this is no. A top quality Red Cochin should be solid red. Of course this is only my opinion. In years to come, I think that they will be admitted to the Standard. They should be. They have come a long way and by the help of true Cochin Fanciers, he (the Red Cochin) will take his place beside the other varieties. I know that there are many breeders who will be willing to put their time and patience with this fellow and help him earn the place he so rightly deserves.

My Reds are a cross. Their origin being a Black Cochin cock crossed over a deep Buff Cochin hen. From this start it has been a program of crossing back the best to the best over a period of a good many years. This requires a lot of time and patience. One generally does not got what he expects when cross breeding. The larger percentage of ours now come Red, but every year we still get some almost black and a few golden buff. Of course these run in a low percentage. In our breeding program we take our very best reds every year for our breeders. As stated before, stick to that color if you still hold type. This has been our program since we have been breeding Reds. It will be our program in years to come. Regardless of what one's program is, there will always come off-colors. I think that this is to teach us that there is a Master Breeder over us all who shows us sometimes how weak we are when we try to figure above the law of average.

One might ask the question of why I am so sure that a solid Red can be bred and still hold type. My answer is: I have tried it and know it can be done.

CI Editor's note: Some interesting points in Mr. McCarley's article. Particularly when he states that in breeding you never sacrifice type for color. Red Cochin Bantams were admitted to the Bantam Standard and the color description is not very inclusive or descriptive. I would venture to state that I don't think we want our Red Cochins to be as dark as the deep red called for in Rhode Island Reds. We have several members working on this variety and it would be nice to see a few more champion the Red Cochin cause.

Cochins International Items of Interest:

Club Patches: We currently have about one dozen club patches left. The ones that are left look like the club logo on the cover. They are about 4 inches in diameter. If you would like one of these let me know. They are \$5.00 and I have them, so if you send quote and some details for our new patches in four different varieties. Black, Buff, White, and Blue. Parti-colored varieties are too hard to replicate in embroidery.

Club Dues: It was suggested that the membership be given a price break for multiple year renewals. This is being looked at and will be further discussed in the next newsletter.

Awards: Open to ideas here! We are working on an additional Master Breeder's Award. Something along the lines of a Judges coat/smock.

With the increased funds that the dues increase created, we should be able to offer some additional awards at our National meets. Not your standard plaques or trophies but something classy signifying this level win. Look for more info on both items in the next newsletter.

Cochins to be Auctioned off: In the last newsletter you may recall that we had several members volunteer pairs of Cochins to be auctioned off to raise money for the club. I will have exact details and information, as well as what is to be auctioned in the next edition of our Newsletter. - TER

Is There a Cure?


I have had a few nice birds in the past come down with a puzzling ailment that I cannot seem to cure. I notice the first day or two that they are not interested in eating. The they begin to just stand all slumped over. They turn pail in the face and seem as if it is painful to even move. These symptoms are common for several avian diseases, I know. However, on about the third day, they begin to drink uncontrollably. Often they spill most of each gulp down their front, as cochins are known to do. On this same day, they will develop a greenish discharge from the behind that sometimes turns a pinkish clear shade. At this stage it is nearly impossible to save them. I have noticed that this can last for several days in some birds until I mercifully end their misery. Other times, these symptoms last for only a couple of days before eminent death.

Just recently I brought a pullet back home from her first show. She won Best of Breed and Champion Featherleg. She was laying well and in good condition. Within a week, she was drinking too much and discharging from behind. She never completely stopped eating, and I believed this is what saved her. As of this writing, she is doing better and will eat greens and some Layena each day. I gave her 1cc of Tylan 50 for two days straight because this is the only thing I had around that I thought might do her some good. I have given others the same medicine, but never in this large a dose. Maybe this is what saved her, or maybe she didn't have the same

If anyone has any experience with the problems I have mentioned, please E-mail me or send a response for Tom to put in future newsletters. I know other breeders have had this problem in the past. I thank you for your helpful ideas and best of luck with all your

Letter to the editor:

Dear Tom,

Just a few lines to express my appreciation for your interest you expressed by attending the Eastern National on September 24th, 2000, in Fergus, Ontario, and the meeting held in conjunction with the show.

After reading Terry Ingram's great article on Perfect Bird Pens, I felt compelled to write and submit pictures outlining my type of set up and related problems. Geographically, I am located on the eastern shores of Lake Ontario. My birds are housed in separated buildings located in a heavily wooded area. Foxes, Raccoons, and several species of birds of prey are a year round concern. During the severe cold winter months keeping the combs of my male birds from getting damaged due to frostbite provides a great challenge. Presently I

am using a mixture of Vaseline and cream to protect the combs. We'll see once the winter is over, how it worked. To protect the birds from the cold cement floor, I use a combination of dry straw, mixed with dry wood shavings. This keeps the floor space warm. In the spring, the straw, shavings and birds droppings make a great mixture for any compost pile. The plastic water fountains are protected from freezing by using a light bulb type heater. During spring and summer I am using self-standing breeding pens and ro-

tate the male birds. My Blue Cochins are selected and mated by the basic rule of Mendel's Law. Based on a careful mating and breeding program my best Blue Cochins have been produced by mating Blue to Blue, to get a clear base color with darker lacing. Last year however, I noticed that my male birds exhibited a little rust or brass color in the neck hackle feathers. I am inclined to use Splash-White birds in this year's breeding.


The Mottled color pattern is a recent addition to my pens. Currently, I am breeding straight Mottled to Mottled to obtain an ideal exhibition and breeding foundation. One of the most asked questions at shows or meetings has to be "Is your line of birds a male line or a female line?" Meaning, does your line produce top male or top female birds? I have to say without hesitation, my line is definitely a female line.

Mottled Cochins in their Winter pen.




Black Cochins Over a Period of Twenty-five Years

By Judge R. Penn Krum, Stafford, Kansas (Reprinted from the 1937 ABA Yearbook)

I have been asked to write an article on Cochins Bantams, so I will give you a short history of Black Cochins covering a period of the past twenty-five years, as I know them.

The Cochin (bantam) is a dwarf of the Cochin Family, and fits the Standard of Perfection in a general way in all but weight and hock plumage. You can look back over a period of twenty-five years and my Black Cochin Hen of 1912 was the talk of Breeders and Judges. She was of standard weight, low without any sense of being a creeper, massive in her "diminutiveness," good width, in San Francisco shown by W. F. Caskey, was my first recollection of a near perfect Cochin male. He was near standard weight, comb being a little rough was bird of the hour. Then in 1917 W. F. Caskey showed a Black Cochin Cockerel that outside of them had been breeding good ones, but the super bird appeared or at least it seemed so. Wege, Wilson, Mummert, Ockers & we have Herster, Gale and Moyer, getting up in the ribbons against the best and also the birds were getting far more uniform. The desired feather quality that was being recognized on the Standard Cochin. About 1926 and 1927 Rector and Browne began to be prominent in Black Cochins and were a fine addition to the fancy.



Then at Milwaukee in 1930 Caskey won Grand Champion Pullet of the show on an outstanding pullet. A star in a great class. Then in 1931, Caskey again won Best Bird in the Chicago Show on a cockerel that I have never seen his equal and a year later at Chicago Granger set down an almost model Cochin in first Cockerel. Nice, active, alert, well finished and well proportioned bird - a masterpiece in the flesh.

I never get tired of looking at the Grand Champion at Boston in 1932, a Black Cochin Hen shown by Walter H. Brown. A most near perfect model of Miniature Cochin.


Again 1934, Caskey again clicked with a top notch Black Hen winning Best Bantam at the Big Cleveland All Bantam Show. She was a grand bird in every respect but a poor comb.

I hope you enjoy reading this summary of the Black Cochins, as I know them over a period of the past twenty-five years. Only a few of the breeders are breeding them today that were tops twenty-five years ago. I can sincerely say that I am grateful for the small part I have played and God Bless the one that invented the Bantams.

1937 ABA Yearbook Editor's Note: It is mighty good to have this summary of Black in Topeka kansas. Cochins by the Dean of Cochin Judges. Well of do I remember many of the birds mentioned, and how I wished my White Cochins measured

up to them. Judge Krum has judged hundred, yes thousands, of Cochins and I venture to say that, with the exception of color, he could judge a class for ideal type and feather while blindfolded. If you are interested in Cochins and never gone over a class with Judge Krum, you have missed a Cochin thrill you will never forget.



Tasty Chicken & Dumplings

Approx. 4 servings



Kathleen Roebuck

This is an easy recipe my family has always enjoyed. I like to start preparing it in the morning and do the final preparations about an hour before dinner.

Ingredients:

I whole chicken (cut-up)

I medium onion

I stalk celery cut in half

I tbs. Parsley

I tsp. Thyme

I bay leaf

I chicken bullion cube (Knorr)

Dumplings:

Biscuit mix 1/4 tsp. Parsley 1/8 tsp. Black pepper pinch of powdered thyme

In a large pot place the cut-up chicken, onion, celery, parsley, thyme and bay leaf. Cover completely with water. Bring to a gentle boil and cook until chicken is tender (approx. I 1/2 hrs.) Remove cooked chicken from broth, cover and place in refrigerator. Remove the celery, onion and bay leaf. Discard. Pour the broth through a fine sieve into a clean bowl. Store in the refrigerator for several hours until fat has solidified and can be skimmed off.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Begin 40#45 minutes before dinner time.

Place the chicken parts in a small roasting pan. Season to taste. Bake at 350 until completely heated through. Meanwhile, after removing the fat, transfer the broth to a wide cooking pot. Bring to a gentle boil. Add bullion cube. Simmer gently.

Prepare dumplings according to directions on the box. To the mix add the parsley, black pepper and powdered thyme. Add by the teaspoon full to the hot broth. Cook covered on low heat for 15 minutes. Remove lid. Serve with the roasted chicken. Ladle the hot creamy broth over the chicken and dumplings. Garnish with parsley.

As I See It

By Tom Roebuck Jr.

Larry Merritt wrote an article in the March Poultry Press expressing his viewpoints on Cochins and their fall from glory as one of the more popular breeds. All are entitled to their opinions and I agree with some of Larry's points. However, I think there is a lot more than the reasons he offered to explain the Cochins' supposed decline in popularity. Let's think back 10 or eleven years to what significant events occurred in regards to Cochins that may have had an effect. That is about the time of the disbandment of the U.S. Cochin Bantam Club and the end of the World Cochin Family. This would dishearten any breed club member. Couple with this the increasing gas prices over the years, entry fee increases and as Larry pointed out the extra effort Feather legged/Asiatic breeds require to prepare for a show and I think you have a good recipe for a loss of interest in Cochins.

However, those are not the only reasons. In this paragraph I am talking primarily Bantams, but my overall point applies to Large Cochins as well. I have had several discussions with breeders concerning Cochin characteristics in recent months. Some of which I pointed out in the last newsletter. Eye color, and under color are two them. Another is station. Station, is the way that the individual bird carries himself or herself. Cochins are required to be up off the ground with the males showing some daylight between their undercarriage and the ground. Those birds that hug the ground and are too short legged are referred to as "creepers." Two additional points that Larry Merritt pointed out were poor wing carriage and narrow feathering/stringy feathers over the cushion. Put all of these together, poor eye color, poor under color, creepers, poor wing carriage, poor feather quality, and there are two common denominators. First, breeding, second, judging.

It is the responsibility of Breeders, no matter what breed they raise, to strive to achieve the breed characteristics as described in either the Standard of Perfection or the Bantam Standard. For many years of late, where Cochin bantams are concerned, some breeders were going with the philosophy that bigger was better. Showing and winning with enormous Cochin Bantams. Many times, hand in hand with these big bantams were poor wings that were not carried up and tucked away, instead we saw loosely fitting wings that dragged the ground in many cases. A definite detractor from the overall Cochin appearance. The same goes with poor eye color, creepers and poor feather quality. Like begets like, and using breeding stock with defects will only get you more defects. The problem with all of this is that these birds were winning at shows, which is a perfect segue into my second common denominator, judges.

Just as it is the breeders' responsibility to try to adhere to the characteristics in the Standards, it is the judge's responsibility to be the quality control inspector and uphold the words and descriptions in these very same publications. If he or she selects a champion that is too big, then breeders are inclined to shoot for this new standard. If he or she selects a bird that has poor wing carriage, then breeders may not pay as much attention to getting that nice short wing, with the compact carriage Cochins are supposed to have. Why will breeders abandon the descriptions set forth in the standards? Because people like to win. It is not a flaw. It is human nature. It can't be helped. That is one of the things that make us who we are. People like to see the fruits of their labors.

Another factor relating to judging is the tendency, until recently, for judges to refrain from selecting anything other than Black or White Cochins (I am specifically talking Bantams here) as their Best of Breeds or Reserve of Breeds. As they say, type makes the breed and color the variety, but it seemed that a solid color is or was, always a safe bet.

All of these factors, added together, could exasperate veteran breeders and discourage newcomers alike, which I think is exactly what happened in many cases. Why select a breed that takes extra effort to begin with, put in all the effort breeding toward the standard and then have your efforts appear to be in vain, when you finally enter into the show arena?

Luckily, downward trends eventually reverse themselves and begin their way back up. One of the big catalysts for this was the formation of Cochins International in the fall of 1992. There was undoubtedly reluctance by some to join a new Cochin organization, but thankfully many of the founding members are still with us and helped guide the club in the right direction. This guidance kept Cochins International alive and we are almost in our tenth year of existence, looking very strong for the future.

We are seeing a resurgence in the popularity of Cochins, both Large and Bantam, and this involves a growing number of new breeders. Very encouraging indeed. I have witnessed judges in the past 6 months who have had the presence of mind to look beyond black and white and select other varieties for Breed Champion. In each case, these have been duly warranted and excellent examples of the breed. Congratulations to these judges, but more importantly, congratulations to the breeders for striving for the standards of perfection.

It is our duty as a Cochin club to make sure that we continue on the current upward trend. As all of us are Cochin Breeders it is our responsibility to breed toward the standard, not away from it. Take the time to read the descriptions in the respective standards. They paint a very vivid picture of what a Cochin is supposed to look like.

That is "As I See It."
