



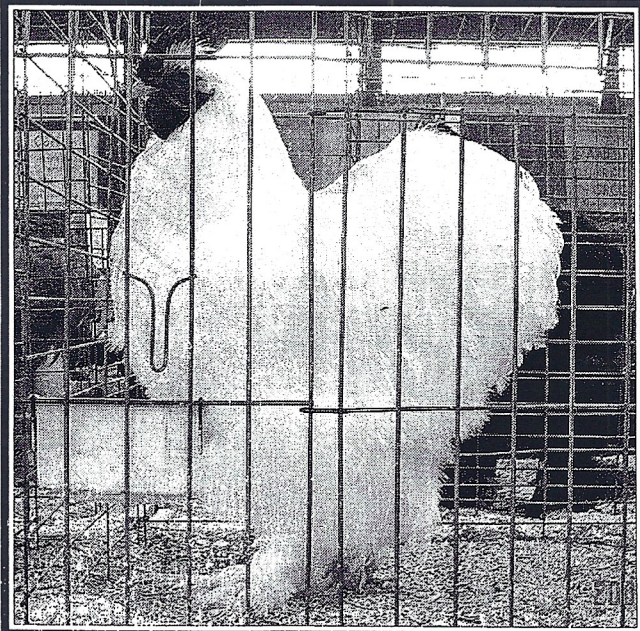

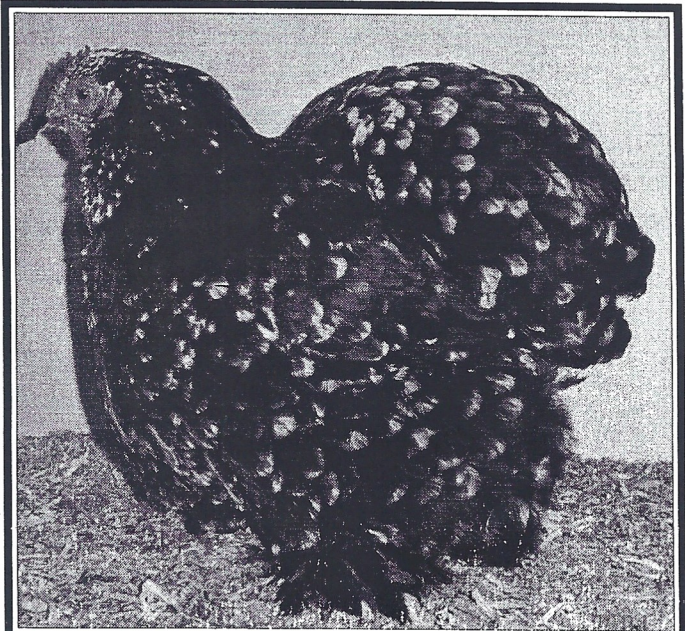

President's Notes:

Some were already members, and some weren't. You can bet I talked about our club with those that weren't and some of them joined on the spot, or mailed in their dues afterwards. You don't have to be the club president to ask people if they are interested in joining our club. It really helps if you have something tangible you can show them about the club. A copy of an old newsletter or a copy of our breeders directory (both of which I take with me to every show I attend). The best part about all of it is that I have had some really great conversations with the people I meet at the shows! That's what this hobby is about. Having fun, making friends and promoting your favorite breed and the poultry fancy as a hobby! Yes, I know I mentioned hobby a couple times in the past two sentences. I looked up the word hobby in the dictionary and this is what it said. Hobby: An activity or interest pursued outside one's regular occupation and engaged in primarily for pleasure. Right there in black and white, our hobby is supposed to be fun!! So here's to a great New Year filled with success and happiness and most of all, have some fun with your hobby!

We have a bunch of stuff going on within the club right now. It's election time again, and we have several new faces running for positions within the club. Please take the time to fill out your ballot when you receive it and mail it back in. I am also starting to put together the breeders directory for 2005. As you know we do a directory every two years and it is really a handy publication. A sort of quick reference guide to find names and numbers of club members and breeders of particular varieties of Cochins. It is only as good as the input we receive back from you, so please take the time to fill out the information sheet that is included with this newsletter and mail it back to me. I emailed the form to those that I have email addresses for and several have already gotten their information back to me. Thanks!

I have run into Bob Lamar at just about every show I've attended our here on the West Coast and he also judged our Western National for which I would like to say thanks for a job well done. He says I'm following him around, and while that may be true, I have taken the opportunity to develop a running discussion with him regarding the fine points of Cochins. During our most recent discussion he asked me what I was doing for the Cochin breed, and at first I wasn't quite sure what he was talking about and most likely had a silly look on my face. With some further clarification from Bob, he was talking about what am I or we as a club doing or not doing about the breed characteristics described in the Standard of Perfection. Something about which I have written articles on before. Our discussions focus primarily on the bantam Cochins, but we seem to hit Cochin tails quite regularly as well. His main point of contention is that we are not breeding Cochin bantams according to

the standard, but instead are breeding bantams that are low slung and too close to the ground, without any daylight underneath. I am not the first to use the term "creepers" to describe this type of Cochin. In fact the Standard of Perfection lists the shape of Bantam Cochins as "Shape, color, and special variety disqualifications the same as for the corresponding variety of large Cochins where applicable." In the Bantam Standard, "Breast so low that feathers touch the ground," is listed as a **defect**. But what does that mean to us as breeders, when the judges are selecting lower slung birds or birds with breast feathers touching the ground as class champions? It means that we have to educate the judges. That is basically what Bob's challenge to me was, and one that I will attempt to take on. I am not going to fill this column up with this subject at the moment, but suffice it to say that you will be reading more on this in the near future. Joe Mazur's Mottled hen on the front page is a good representation of a female bantam Cochin that has good body carriage. Her breast feathers do not touch the ground however, her profuseness of feather on her abdomen and keel give her that round well proportioned look. Mary Hoyt had a Blue pullet at the Pacific Coast Bantam Club show at the beginning of December that had really nice station and carried herself up off of the ground. In many cases it just takes using birds with just a smidge longer legs to alleviate that creeper look. More to follow on this subject, but I urge each and everyone to read and reread those standards!!

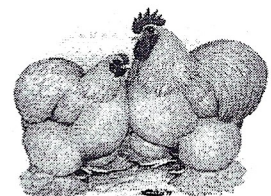

Information on The (UK) Cochin Club for large fowl appeared on page 4 in the last newsletter. Additional international data is provided below.

The UK has a separate club for bantam Cochins or "Pekins" as they are

referred to in Europe. The Pekin Bantam Club secretary/treasurer is: Mr. David Sill; Wards End Farm, Marsden, Huddersfield HD7 6NJ, UK. As a member of this club, you receive a copy of the current Pekin club standards and two newsletters a year. Dues are 5 Euros (\$6.25 US) per year. Normally, I would not recommend sending cash; but, the exchange charges and inconvenience make the transactions almost impossible so it's best to just wrap up \$7 cash and forward it to the club secretary.

They have most of the same colors in the UK with a couple of exceptions, notably cuckoo and lavender. (I was really impressed with the lavender color!) At some point, I hope we can get a color photo in the newsletter for all to see. The lavender is not a lighter shade of blue; it is different genetically than blues as we know them in the U.S. Much to my surprise lavenders were introduced from America into the UK by a Mr. John McNeil according to M. Gregson's book (see below). If anyone knows of John McNeil, whether it be past or present, I would appreciate knowing more about him and how he got the lavender color.

I just finished the book "Pekin Bantams" by Margaret Gregson of the UK. In addition to providing very interesting reading, it contains some 29 color and approximately 40 black and white photos and illustrations. It is easy reading, and I recommend it to anyone curious about bantam cochins (pekins) in Europe.

For those of you who don't already know, there is a Pekin Bantams website based in the UK: www.pekinbantams.com. This is a very interesting website which is operated and maintained by a young man in the UK (Simon Gambling). It is dedicated to the pekin bantam and contains a wide assortment of useful information. If you have a chance, visit the site

sometime; I think it will prove well worth while just for the articles alone. I'm coordinating with the website to get selected ABA articles included. Karen Unrath has given her approval as long as there is full credit to the author, the ABA and, of course, to Cochins International for assisting in the process.

I have also made contact with "The Pekin Bantam Club of Australia." I found its newsletter very impressive with a beautiful color cover and very interesting articles. Hopefully, we can reproduce one or more of these articles from time to time. Some examples are: "Breeding the Silver and Gold Colors," "Breeding Experiments with Mealy/Grey, Columbians and Impure Birchen" (both by Alan Featherstone) and "The Brown-Red Pekin" (by David Plant). Membership brings you three newsletters for \$20 per year. Arrangements have been established between CI and the UK and Australian Clubs for the purpose of exchanging newsletters.

Informal contact has also been made with Cochin (pekin) breeders in Norway and South Africa. Even though Norway and South Africa do not have pekin clubs, there are interested breeders in these countries. Finn Loge, Norway, has approximately 50 whites including frizzles. Grant Moodliar, South Africa, also has whites and other colors and has expressed an interest in exchanging information with breeders. Grant sent me some interesting information on breeding buffs which I forwarded directly to Tom since he has very high interest in buffs. I'm sure he will be happy to share this information with anyone. I have Grant's mailing address, if needed. His e-mail is: GrantM@energem.com.

Correspondence is pending with contacts in Scotland, New Zealand and France. Initiatives are planned to find contacts in Egypt and Chile and at least one in SE Asia, the latter country to be

determined.

If you have any questions or know the names, addresses/e-mails of anyone outside of North America, please pass them along to me for follow-up and benefit to Cochins International and interested breeders everywhere. Regards, John Burgess

Cochins Rule!

Hannover Show

In college I was blessed with many opportunities, and one of the most incredible was spending a quarter abroad. What I enjoyed most during my four months in Berlin, Germany was pursuing my hobbies in another culture and getting to know the similarities and differences of these interests between cultures. Pursuing my interests, of course, led me to poultry shows.

While stateside I contacted Loyl Stromberg, knowing that he frequently organized European poultry tours. He gave me contact information for several German breeders, but was more exciting when he informed me that one of his tours would be in Europe during my stay and would attend the renowned show in Hanover, Germany. Excited for my trip I crossed the Atlantic.

Once settled in Berlin I contacted some breeders and attended a small show in the rural reaches of the city. However, my thirst for experiencing the "poultry culture" was unslaked until I traveled to Hanover several months later. At the "Deutsche Junggeflugelshau" I was met with a colorful sign, a hundred page bound show guide and, incredibly, a ten dollar admission fee.

I stepped inside to a real exhibition. In the front of the huge hall were colorful display cages, each large enough to show a breeding pen of bantams or a pair of larger birds. These birds were not entered in the show; the display included some dwarf geese and a beautiful pen of barred cochin bantams. However, when I saw the pen of buff barred cochin bantams, I realized that I would see some exciting things I had never seen before. In one of the front corners of the hall was a special Japanese themed display, where the exhibition Japanese and phoenix were caged among potted bamboo and tables of breed and club information. In the opposite corner were about a dozen large, fenced pens on the ground, each with a small pond and several breeds of wild ducks or geese.

This wasn't an American poultry show; this was a European poultry exhibition. Everything from the displays to the wide aisles and single decking was planned to please the viewer. Most incredible, however, was the size of the show. Twenty thousand birds in one hall, including several thousand pigeons to add diversity. Also, this was a "Junggeflugelshau," a young bird show. Twenty thousand cockerels and pullets!

As I made my way around the showroom I was amazed by the array of breeds and varieties. Every breed was present, including all-American products such as Rhode Island Reds and Plymouth Rocks, and at least as many breeds that I had never seen before. Strolling down the aisles I enjoyed seven varieties of mallard ducks, blue red large brahmas, and buff laced spitzhaubens.

Finally the cochin aisle! This was a show row that didn't disappoint. No variety dominated; the largest variety class had perhaps a dozen birds. However, there was much parity between the blacks, whites, blues, buffs, self blues, barred, buff barred, self blue barred, red, mottled, light brown, blue light brown, silver duckwing, birchen, wheaten, silver wheaten, and a version of partridge. While absorbing this array with eye and camera, I noticed several differences between these birds and ours. First, their color standards are considerably more breeder friendly. For instance, the partridge va-

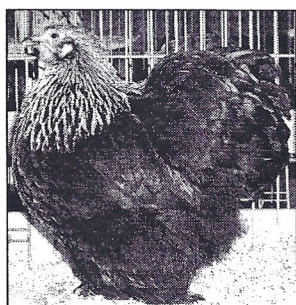

riety in the United States challenges breeders with a cleanly laced, gold hackled female and a black chested, mahogany hackled male. This leads many breeders to double mating, and many more to abandon their efforts in frustration. On the other hand, the German standard calls for a female very similar to our partridge, but allows the male to be her genetic counterpart- nearly all red with black primaries and tail. In other varieties flecking is allowed in the males' breast, where Americans would seek a clean black front. While there were no apparent differences in the type these breeders were striving for, none of their varieties are as far developed as our blacks or whites. I feel the friendlier standard lends to less difficulty and more popularity of showing other varieties. Indeed, best of breed was awarded to a silver duckwing pullet- from a breeder in Berlin! I left that great show that evening to go to dinner with the Americans on Stromberg's poultry tour, but had the address of one of the most prominent cochin breeders in Germany, the topic for a future article!
