We appreciate his stepping forward to not only do the newsletter, but also the Master Breeder Points. He has big shoes to fill. Karl Rau did an excellent job. He took the primitive paste up newsletter I used to do and made it a high tech. Tom is also a computer expert, so that professional look will continue. Be sure to thank Karl if you see him this fall. He did this job for several years and did an excellent job. We have discussed this before. What makes this club great is its members willingness to step forward and take a turn.

Show season is about to start and I am excited. I went through my birds yesterday and evaluated them. I put them in single cages at eye level. I note the band #, and then I rate eye color, head, comb, leg color, wing (feather width and strength), width of back, width of tail feathers, over all shape, and I mark them X excellent, G good, P poor. If one really catches my eye I give it a \*. Then I write down who were the parents and study the results to see if a pattern might be present. I make my decision on the birds that I am going to keep and

All show placement requests should be sent by the show secretary to the appropriate area *DIRECTOR*.


Material submitted for publication, show report and "Master Breeder" points questions and/or concerns should be sent to the *EDITOR* and *POINTS CHAIRMAN*.

### Northeast District I Director Input:

Northeast District I Meet

The District Meet for the Northeast I (New England states and New York) was held on Sept. 27th. at the Eastern New York State Show in Cobleskill. Cobleskill is in a very picturesque area and the fairground is a beautiful spot for this show. The building was spacious and well lit, with wide aisles, but with 1300+ entries all bantams had to be double tiered. There was lots of outside space for sale birds and a great array of feathered friends were offered. Beth Adams, Cochin Int'l. member and show secretary, did a great job and everything went smoothly. There were 16 large Cochins entered: 10 Black, 1 Blue, 2 Partridge, and 3 White with 14 exhibited. Thanks to a little help from Beth there were exactly 100 Cochin bantams entered: 33 Black, 1 Birchen, 3 Barred, 13 Blue, 2 Blue Mottled, 6 Brown Red, 14 Buff, 9 Mottled, 3 Splash, and 16 White, with 80 exhibited.

The large fowl winners were: BB a Black pullet by Bill Ryan, RB a Black hen by Kay St. Amour. BV Blue by Karyn Dudley; BV and RV White by Christine Lehman.

The bantam winners were: BB a Buff pullet by Bob Hawes, RV Buff by Bob Hawes; RB a Black pullet by Charlie Anderson, RV Black by Rosemary Plath Michalski; BV Barred by Carol Pueschel, RV by Wightman's Bantams; BV Birchen by Wightman's Bantams; BV Blue by Charlie Anderson, RV by Jamie Matts; BV and RV Blue Mottled by Jamie Matts; BV and RV Brown Red by Wightman's Bantams; BV Columbian by Bob Hawes; BV Mottled by Kay St. Amour, RV by Scott and Sharon Petow; BV and RV Splash by Rosemary Plath Michalski; BV and RV White by Gillis and McCarthy.

There were some quality birds shown, the large Black pullet and Black hen were massive and in great feather. In the bantam class there were several birds that were near the top of the breed. The Black pullet, Buff pullet, White hen and Mottled pullet were brought out for selecting Best of Breed. Any one of them would have been a good representative. The Mottled and the White were sent back after much peering and prodding by Judge Paul Montieth. Paul had a very hard time deciding between the Buff and the Black, finally calling in Judge Don Nelson to cast a vote. The Black pullet by Charlie Anderson was in great form in her own coop but when she was put into a large coop to judge for BB she lost her composure, stretched out her neck to look at the neighbors and destroyed her nice compact type. The Buff won out and went on to be Champion APA Bantam and Show Champ. A great win for a Buff. Others BV's that deserve mention were the Blue cockerel by Anderson and the Splash pullet by Michalski.

Thanks to the many exhibitors who came from Maine to Maryland and all states between. Next year's District will move North, probably to New Hampshire. Hope to see you at the National!

#### **Mottled Cochin Bantams**

(from Cochin Bantams reprint 1987)

The Mottled Cochin Bantam must first of all be a real Cochin. Never use any other breed to get the color markings: if you do you lose the type and feather quality, and the result is just a speckled chicken. with possibly a few feathers on its legs. The color should be the same as the Mottled Ancona. In type, station, feather quality and size, the Mottled Cochin must be a COCHIN. The only way to get this is to use 100 per cent Cochin blood in mating them. I made my Mottled Cochins from my own Cochins of other varieties.

My Mottled Cochins combine the blood from Black. Cochins, and White Cochins, with just enough of the Brown Red Cochin to cause the black and white colors to segregate. You will never produce a mottled by breeding straight Black and White. When the color pattern is established, a good percent of top-notch show birds will be produced by properly mating Mottled to Mottled.

The ideal exhibition male is also

the ideal breeding male. But this does not always hold true in the case of the female. The best exhibition pullets sometimes mole into too much white as yearlings. Because of this it is better to use yearling hens of correct color; but if a pullet must be used, pay particular attention to undercolor. Her surface color may be a bit too black, or rather a bit shy in white markings. Twenty-five percent of the chicks from this mating will be white. These white chicks can not be bred back, as can Blue Porcelain, or Splash-white sports from Blues, because the blue-bred white is a true Allelomorph, having as its alternate Mendelian character the blue-bred black. whereas the mottled-bred white sport has no true alternate. However, these mottledbred white sports have some breeding value, properly used.

If cockerels develop a little rust or brass in the neck hackle, select a white sport from your best pen of Mottled Cochins, mate him to a couple of black females (not sports of any kind, but bred from purebred straight Black Cochins). In breeding in foreign color always endeavor to improve type. For this reason you must not use cull blacks that you don't want in your straight Black Cochin pens, but use the best black females you have, or can get, in regard to type, station and feather. In

color they should be as free from sheen as possible; but don't go to the other extreme and use purple or rusty blacks. A dull black is right. The chicks from this mating will throw a lot of wasters, but you will get a few mottled cockerels free from off-colored hackles, and if the female side of the mating is correct, they will not lose out in type and feather. Breed these cockerels right in with your straight Mottled females. They will produce the same percentage of Mottled chicks as before.

Some youngsters from this straight black to mottled-bred white mating will come almost black. If they are slightly mottled in surface, not too light in undercolor, have a good sheen to their black, and are absolutely free from foreign color, the females can be mated to a good straight white male and produce a few good Mottled chicks. I would not advise this mating for an amateur, because of the small number of correctly colored chicks it will produce. Some of these chicks will be a dirty slate color that some people call blue, and they are absolutely worthless for either showing or breeding.

You can get the best Mottled Cochins there are, from straight Mottled to Mottled mating, if your foundation stock is right.

#### Want to make a Splash??

I recently saw the most beautiful Splash Cochin at the North Iowa Poultry show. I was not aware that it is a recognized color. What is a recognized? A color that breeds true (splash to splash) without having to periodically add another color. This is determined by 3 breeders breeding a new breed/variety for 5 years and then having the results shown and judged by the APA or ABA acceptance.

Back to the Splash. It is made out of all of the typey Cochins. White, Black, and Blue. I am no geneticist, that's why I had help from Scott Adams, A. M. Armstrong, and John Badhaw.

Blue X Blue = 25% Splash, 25% Black, and 50% Blue

(those splash bred to each other make more splash)

Splash X Black = 100% Blue

Splash X White = 50% White, 50% Splash

They are very striking in their soft tones. Think about it. Might be a good winter project. Maybe we will see more Splash.





Two more sites that are worth exploring are:







And generally speaking, in a filthy, half-starved, vermin-infested, or roupy condition, - in consequence of their long confinement, and the neglect and hard these are nine times in ten the fowls "imported from China direct" that we get both in America and England, or read of in the poultry and other journals of the day. It is not always thus, however, as I will show by and by. But this is the rule. The others are the exceptional cases.

Pleasant in Roxbury, Mass., known as "Williams' Garden," - a fine large estate, then belonging to the late Aaron gathered together during those years), upon leased premises, some few acres In the years of grace 1843-'44, I had in my possession a goodly quantity of domostic fowls, five or six hundred in number (which I had bred and D. Williams, now entirely covered over with handsome dwelling-houses.

I had bred fowls some years prior to this time, on a limited scale, but at this period was angaged in the then hopeful attempt to breed poultry to profit, within limited space, in large numbers, successfully, -- an experiment which, I need bardly announce at this day, proved futile and ineffectual.

In 1846-'47 I removed to more retired quarters, and, with my flocks of poultry reduced to less than a hundred good birds, on an estate upon which I erected a cottage house, I went on more successfully. I resided upon Williams Street, Roxbury (now Shawmut Avenue extension), until late and early in 1850 removed my greatly improved stock of fowls to this town; in 1849, when I purchased the place in Molrose, Mass., where I now live, where I have since resided, now a quarter of a century.

From 1843-'49 down to the present year (1874), for the most part I have constantly had the Chinese fowls upon my premises, in large or lesser quantities; and my long experience with this race has afforded me ample opportunity to judge of their good quality, and to make myself - through almost numberless practical experiments with thom - thoroughly acquainted with thoir habits, their characteristics, their points, and their general qualities.

The China fowl is a good bird; and the funcious of this country and Great Britain have shown their preference largely in favor of this breed, in some of its various colors, by cultivating and improving the size, and increasing the intrinsic value of this fowl, until the modernized "Brahma" or "Cochin," as it is at this time denominated, bas-come to be known deservedly as the most desirable of all the poultry we have among us.

Other breeders of course have their favorites, and justly so. But the


majority of fanciers prefer some of the varieties of the Chinese, fowl, . And the "Brahmas" or the "Cochina" - all of which come from Shanghae originally, as we shall see -now lead the van in the estimation of the mass of American or English breeders. The two illustrations preceding portray the shape and general forms of an early-imported cock and hen of the Chinese race. They are neither so comely or so attractive in shape or features as are those subsequently received, or which were bred from the first stock had in America. Both of these are coarse, unguinly, and dumpy. But we give these drawings of original birds here, for comparison with the "improved" samples of the race to be found in these pages farther on.

From the evidence at hand, however, it is very clear, whatever may be the theory of one or two late writers upon this subject, that all our large, flue, so-called "Asiatic varieties" of domesticated fowls belong to but one race, of whatever color we breed them; and the entire testimony in modern works on poultry goes directly to this point, as to the origin whence they come into our hands, in every instance. And that origin is China.

I am not now speaking of any of the still coarser grades of the Malny species, the Javas, or even the Chittagongs, about which early authors used to write so fluently without knowing any details as to the nativity of this style of bird, except what they casually learned from some stray sailor, who was not to be easily disputed, perhaps, in whatever yarn he might choose to spin regarding the birds he brought home accidentally "from the E-Stingies." But my present pages will comprise a monograph of the Chinese fowl; of whence I proceed to show descend all the pure "Cochins" and "Brahmas," of every shade we possess to-day, either in England or the United States.

In Great Britain, since the advent of the Queen's famous so-called "Cochin Chinas," and more especially within the past twelve or fifteen years, perhaps, the old China fowl has been manifestly improved, by careful mating and judicious breeding, in the hands of the experienced fanciers who have long maintained their sacendency over us in America, in a general way, in their treatment of poultry, as we all very well understand.

The "importations" made into the United States in late years come from this source principally; and very good fowls they send us too, as the midority of American importations of "Cochins," &c., of all colors, which have been since 1865-36 received thence into the United States, and which are now arriving here every month, from some of the leading broaders in England, amply demonstrate; the different classes of which we now propose to describe in detail in the future pages of this volume, with the single additional remark, here, that the English style of breeding the China fowl (as evinced in the latest specimens of the Light and Dark "Brahmas" we have received thence) is not uniformly to American taste.

The Shanghae fowl, first brought from the Chinese port of that name, and thus called by the early possessors of those birds in England or America, usually with us upon this side of the Atlantic also, took the name of the importer or owner of such birds, in the early days; as, for example, in the instances of the Bailies', the Forbes', the Marsh, the Cushing, or the Burnham Shanghaes; which exact types of fowls are, however, in accordance with poultry society "Standard" rules at the present time, denominated "Cochins." Of the "Cochin Chinas" we shall speak at langth in another chapter: we simply mention this "convertible term" here, in order that the reader of this volume may not confound the two names, as we proceed.

We will describe the old Shanghae fowl first, therefore, because through priority in date we received in America - in Salem, Mass., in Philadelphis,

Ponn., at Now York City, and elsewhere (so it has been frequently stated) - from Shanghas, China, the earliest consignments of this stock.

It has been said that as early as in 1843, such hirds came both into Salem and Philadelphia, though I deem this announcement problematical. The well-known stock of Messra. Sturgeon and Moody of England was received

from China by those gentlemen in 1847, -- so they inform us; and these were

extraordinary fowls, bought them, on his own responsibility, at what Mr. among the very first accredited Shanghass we heard of. They were cortainly very early birds. Mr. Sturgeon writes to Mr. Tegetmeier of London that he got his fewls in 1847, from a ship in the West India docks. A clork of his chanced to go on board, who, struck by the appearance of these Sturgeon considered and denounced as a most extravagant price, - six or eight shillings (less than two dollars) each ! A younger brother of Mr. Sturgeon's unwittingly killed two of the five birds on their arrival, leaving him but a cock and two pullets. He took little interest in them at that time; but he subsequently raised from these the finest buff Shanghaes ever produced in England. "All our birds," he adds, "came from Shanghas, and were featherod-legged."

It is stated by those who have observed the fact in Chinese ports, that the Shanghues (or now se-called "Cochins") of all colors, are seen quite as frequently upon their native soil, without any feathering upon the shank below the hooks, as with this feature. But the style in this country is, to breed them besyily feathered upon the legs. The early importations; spoken of, were all feathered-legged, some strains showing this more markedly than others, though my own imported birds were thus generously feathered. 3293 11

The result was, that, though all the true characteristics of progeny, the color became uncertain and various, - from rich golden yellow to dark brown, with the intermediate shadings and markings of partridge and grouse-colored birds, first and last. They were large, well-formed, magnificent specimens of the China, variety, nevertheless, and enjoyed for many years a reputation which subsequent importations did not interfere with, however fine they came.

A. Drake, known as the Rev. Mr. Missionary Brown's stock. They bred pullets and light reddish dominique cocks, almost invariably. The Forber the full-feathered leg uniformly, and for a long period enjoyed a deservedly high reputation as first-class stock, in all respects.

The Cushing importation also came into America from Shanghae. These were of a bright golden color, hens and cocks; the latter being the most brilliant, truly "flame-colored", cast of plumage I ever met with, in my experience with the Shanghae race. They ran out shortly, however, or were crossed with others, and were seen but for a year or two in their purity, when the old stock disappeared altogether, as did the Palmer, and Cope strains.

A general description given in 1849, 1850, of the best Shanghae fewls, will be found to closely correspond with the character of the birds at the present time universally called "Cochius," of which the drawing (page 23) is an admirable commonly given to the Gray Shanghace, is a misnomer, as I shall show as we representation, but which name, as in the instance of "Brahma," in late years proceed; albeit there is no valid objection to the establishment of both these later cognomens, nevertheless, since it is the fashion now-a-days; and everybody assents to those changes from the original true title.

Their legs, in the early time, "were uniformly stout, usually of a bright reddish yellow, sometimes nearly flesh-colored; and, for the most part, the limbs below the hock were very heavily feathered. Their general plumage was of a brilliant yellow or gold-color, variegated and 'pencilled' with black, dark brown, or red. The tail was short and upright; body squarely formed; wings small and tucked up high; legs, when, young, rather long for beauty; head full sized; comb single, upright, and serrated; feathers rather fine and downy than otherwise, — and, altogether, they were a large, fine, showy fowl, as then described by Boment, Dixon, Kerr, and Dr. Bennett."
