



Hand Crafted Perfection!!



Wow! Talk about a masterpiece! No....your eyes are not playing tricks on you. This life like hand-carved pair of Buff Cochins is truly a magnificent work of art, the pride and joy of Buff Cochin breeder, Ed Thompson of Barrie, Ontario. Half in size of a normal Buff Cochin bantam, the male stands 5 1/2 inches high and the female, 4 1/2 inches on a wooden base measuring approximately 16 inches across. It took artist and poultry fancier, Al Forler of Kitchener, Ontario approximately 156 hours to complete this hardwood poultry masterpiece, complete with glass eyes and detailed shading in every area of the plumage. At \$10 an hour, it was well worth it for an avid Buff Cochin Breeder like Ed. Al "borrowed" a pair of Buffs from Ed and equipped with them, a Standard of Perfection and a natural love and interest in poultry, he hand crafted these two birds into a most ideal pair of Buff Cochin Bantams. Ed says, "the only thing not quite up to standard are the glass eyes, which are darker than the required reddish-bay, but these were the only ones available." 
Send all submissions to the editor at least two weeks prior to the printing date.





Letter to the Editor:

In response to problems I alluded to with our Silver and Golden Laced Birds Ardjan Warnhuis sent me a possible solution

Dear Tom,

....I don't know exactly what the problems are, but I think I can help a little bit to improve the type with the following lines.

We, trying to breed out porcelain (jubilee)? Cochins, had the problem with type too, as I wrote two years ago in the newsletter. How to improve type, by crossing with Cochin, without losing colour and markings?

The answer is: cross a cuckoo male into, in this case, silver and golden laced. Find the best typed cuckoo male you can get. Cuckoo is a colour where you can "park" your colour for a year without losing color and markings.

The F1-generation will be cuckoo with more or less red in the cockerels neck and shoulders. From here you can take two ways to get gold and/or silver laced with better type and fluffy feathers of the cuckoo.

First mate the F1 birds brother to sister. This way you will get cuckoo (both sexes) and gold or silver laced (latest 25%). The second way is to cross and F1-cockerel out of a gold laced hen to the best gold laced female you have got. Cross an F1-cockerel out of a silver laced hen to the best silver laced female you have. This way you will have some cuckoo (only male) and the percentage of gold and/or silver laced will be much higher (some 50 – 75%).


Among these F2-birds some will have the better type and the fluffier feathers of the cuckoo and the laced colour. Then in the next years breed a lot of them and select for type and lacing.

Be aware: this only works out if you start with a MALE cuckoo bird to cross in. We did the same last year with our porcelain (jubilee). I'll let you know how it worked out later. This method can also be used for partridge and mottled. Be sure the male cuckoo is heterozygote (light) for cuckoo. So don't use a cuckoo male from a black parent. This won't work. Only by getting in fresh blood the birds will be bigger and stronger and lay better than the originals.

Hoping to help John (Thyssen) and the others to improve the lovely gold and silver laced.

The 1999 District Meet for the Northeast II District has been granted to the Virginia Poultry Breeders Association, Richmond, VA, November 20-21, 1999. Regional meets have been placed with Uniontown (PA) Fairgrounds (October 15), York County Poultry Fanciers Association, York, PA (October 23-24), Blue Ridge Poultry Club, Galax, VA (October 30), and with the Maryland State Breeders Association, Frederick, MD (November 6). John DiNatale won BB on a large black pullet, with Kay St. Amour taking RB on a large black hen. In the bantam classes, BV blue went to William Lewis on a single entry, BV and RV black went to Donald Wright out of 11 blacks shown on a cock and hen, BV and RV buff went to Donald Wright out of 14 buffs shown on a cockerel and hen, BV and RV mottled went to Kay St. Amour out of 5 mottleds shown on a cock and hen, BV partridge went to Robert and Shirley Downes on a single entry cock, BV red went to a single entry cock by Artie Cosner, and BV and RV white went to Kenny Merrill out of 6 whites shown on two cocks. Further recognition should go to Donald Wright for a successful day with his black and buff bantams. Donald exhibited a very nice buff cockerel of good color, type and quality of feather. In the large class, BV black went to John DiNatale on a pullet; RV black went to Kay St. Amour out of 5 shown. BV and RV buff went to Kenny Merrill on the only two shown.

Best wishes to each of you this summer and fall. If I can be of any service to you please do not hesitate to contact me and as always let's have a strong contingent of Cochin breeders/exhibitors at all shows within the Northeast II District.

"The Land of Lincoln Gathering....Poultry Show"

Springfield, Illinois, Oct 9-10, 1976
A little Cochin historyby Mason Benn

The show was organized by the late Marion Nash. It was held in a beautiful building on the Illinois State Fair Grounds. All 2,000 birds were single decked. There was a mezzanine level where you could overlook the entire exhibit.

The building was open all night Friday night for cooping in; believe it was the Stover's who had an RV parked right at the entrance to help out exhibitors (I arrived at 11 pm).


Upon checking in you were presented with a booklet that listed each coop number and the bird and its owner....I was impressed. I believe it was organized in a manner much like the Madison Square Garden shows of years ago. All judging was completed on Saturday.

There was informative meetings on poultry subjects throughout the two days. Also, there was a Sunday morning program by a local singing group...something for everyone.

I had the opportunity to meet many Cochin Breeders; Claire Hicks, Bob Enslen, and Kay St. Amour to name a few. Of course Mr. Nash had some quality large Black and Buff Cochins. I believe Alex Duffy attended.

In the 1970's, Buff Cochin Bantams were not seen in large numbers, so 45 Buffs was a very large class. My birds were from Bob Enslen and Scott Adams breedings.

For me the "Land of Lincoln Gathering" was an experience which I have long remembered.




Champion of Show, Champion Cochin – Mottled Hen, Ted Schwabrow




Reserve of Breed – Black Cockerel by Donald Wright




Best of Variety – White Cockerel William Sirrine




Best of Variety – Blue Cockerel Charles Anderson




Best of Variety – Splash Cockerel Trevor Greene




Best of Variety – Blue Mottled Cockerel by Norman Rau




Best of Variety – Columbian Cockerel by Emily Fox




Best of Variety – Buff Hen Bob Hawes



Reserve of Variety – Buff Cock Jeff Ryan




Reserve of Variety – Black Cock Tom and Kathy Roebuck Sr.




Reserve of Variety – Mottled Hen Karl Rau




Reserve of Breed - (Std) Black Cock by William West




Best of Variety - (Std) Blue Hen Jay & Nancy Birden




Cochins International Members gather at the Rip Van Winkle Poultry Association Show, Altamont, NY, June 13th, 1999











Columbian Cochin Bantams

By Raymond K Price (from the American Cochin Bantam Club 1946 Year Book)

These rare and beautiful birds will add to any fancier's flock, and always attract the attention of all who see them. The combination of the familiar Columbian color pattern with Cochin shape cannot help produce a beautiful bantam.

They don't always breed true to color, black or nearly black birds often turning up. For the true fancier, however, this should only serve to add interest.

In breeding them, I consider it safe to use five or six females to one male, provided they are all well trimmed out. First, throw out all birds that show a lack of vigor. Then pick out your best female, looking especially for type and feathering (get as broad a cushion as you can, because that is a weakness of many Columbians), and choose a male to fit her. The males are inclined to have legs a little longer than a Cochin should, so try to get one that is as close to the ground as possible. Never overlook undercolor in either sex, as this is importance in color breeding. Don't worry about the vulture hocks-they all have them. When choosing the male, be careful not to duplicate any defects the female may have. Look for a good hackle and a well striped saddle, but try not to get the heavy black markings found under the surface of the back, and also guard against white at the base of the main tail feathers. Try to use birds with good loose feathering and a broad saddle, and be sure he has a good head. Next, pick the rest of your females, one by one, until you have made up you pen. Match the male as well as possible. If you can and do mate your birds up in this manner, some good chicks should result. The breeder can sell as many of these as he can raise, because the supply does not even come near the demand. Here is a golden opportunity for someone. Start with some good stock, and give the Columbians a try. Once you've had this variety, you won't drop it.

Editor's note: Karl Rau, Dennis Wollard, Bob Hawes, and Jamie Matts to name a few can attest to the fact that the Columbians do not always breed true to color. I have seen some interesting offspring form Columbian to Columbian matings! I would have to say that the Columbians that are being bred now are much better type than what Mr. Price describes. He does however, make an excellent point in his description of color traits to look for in your breeders. I echo his concern to pay attention to the undercolor and white at the base of the tail.

How about one of our Columbian Breeders putting together an article on their current breeding experiences and practices??



GIVE BEGINNERS A CHANCE

In my few years as a breeder-exhibitor, I have taken some real good gyps. To begin with I didn't know my bantams and took the other fellow's word for quality and price. But after a couple of years in the show rooms and with a Standard, I've learned a lot-something new every day. Some fellows will advertise bantams of top quality with a line of winnings listed, but don't kid yourself- none of those winners are in the "For sale" category. I set up my own plan for explaining to inquiries. First, I state what I have for sale, then quality and price. I usually minutely describe the bird in question, faults, characteristics, good points, so the fellow can, from a word picture, see just about what he might buy from my pens. I spend more time with a beginner than with a veteran. The veteran usually knows what he wants and has full knowledge of the breed, whereas has to take your word for same. My policy in bantams has been "Give as you would like to receive." Give the beginner a chance, encourage them if they falter and, above all, sell the bird you described or promised them. Never ship a common run bantam for a show winner; sometimes it may backfire, and not in the crate either. A satisfied customer is the best advertising a breeder can buy. To the beginner my honest, sincere plea: buy the best you can afford and study their good and bad points, borrow a Standard of Perfection, read it and remember what you read. In breeding, eliminate faults, do not adhere to them. Never keep an off type or disqualified bird in your breeding pens. Best of luck with all the success to fellow fanciers everywhere.

WANTED:

Mottle Cochins

By Pat Bloomer

Our mutual friend, your enthusiastic secretary, has asked me to write some notes on Mottles, and I am most honored to do so, although I feel it is "sticking my neck out" to write anything about Cochins in a publication primarily for American Cochin breeders for whose ability I have nothing but the greatest admiration.

I have been breeding Mottles (sometimes called Spangleds) for a little over ten years and find them a very interesting colour, but for some unknown reason they do not attract a great deal of support in England, in spite of the fact that they are always admired on the few occasions on which they are shown. It has been difficult to keep them going during the war, but by disposing of a few to one or two friends, this strain (the only one in Europe) has been maintained and the type and feather quality are as good as ever. The originator of the colour over here, Fred Worsley, was a great enthusiast about the quality of feather, and I have managed to maintain it to such an extent that it is usually superior to that of more popular colours shown in England; in fact, as it has been possible during these past seven years only to breed a few birds each year, I have concen

trated on type and quality of feather more than on correct markings. The good lightly marked Mottle is, so far, in my experience, a pretty rare thing, and one has to breed a good many in order to get one or two to suit the fads and fancies of the judges. In this strain I have found that those which are most heavily marked with white are usually the best birds; the reason for this is that birds with wide feathers usually have bigger white tips to the feathers than those with narrower, shorter feather.

Occasionally, in order to improve a certain point, such as eye colour, I have introduced a black hen into the pen and from her products, which have always been black in the first generation, I usually produce some reasonably good birds. One ought to produce some lightly marked birds from this mating, but I cannot say that it always happens! One watches the chicks develop with even greater interest than usual, for the mottling starts coming on the breast in the adult feathering stage and then spreads all over after the black feathering has almost finished growing, and with all this extra care and handling they don't need much more training to be ready for the show.

I send my very best wishes to the A.C.B.C. members and am most happy to be in such good company....
