





I've imposed a deadline on myself to get out all of the certificates for 100 points and District meets that I have sitting in a box. They are all done, just need to mail them! I was able to attend both of our 2003 National meets, and I have to say that once again we have made a good impression for the strength of our breed. Both shows had Cochins of high quality with some varieties that we do not see too often in the show halls.

The Western National was held on October 25-26, 2003, in Hutchinson, MN, and was hosted by the Minnesota State Poultry Association. They have outstanding facilities and if you have never attended this show, you should mark it on your calendar as one of the shows to attend. I will not get too involved in going over the classes since I already did a write up in the December 2003 Poultry Press, but I will say that the Black Bantam hen that took Overall Champion Cochin honors was a beautiful bird! Congratulations Dave Laatsch!!

I left for the Western National on a Thursday and flew into Minneapolis, picked up my rental car and drove down to Amboy to stay with Mark Peterson. I had a great time! We took some time Thursday afternoon and looked over some of their Light Brahmas, Buff Rocks, and let's not forget Black and Buff Cochins! After breakfast on Friday morning we drove around the Amboy area and visited one of Mark's neighbors who has quite a large flock of Large Black Cochins. There were several in that group that would make great additions to anyone's breeding program! Mark had already washed all of his birds for the show before I got there, and he let me go through his Black Cochin bantams. I really liked those cockerels of his. They looked even better in the show hall! By late morning we were ready to head up to the show, and from there on out I was certainly busy! I took a bunch of pictures of the birds, but more importantly we were able to sign up seven new members at the show! If you look farther back in this newsletter you will see that our membership grew quite impressively since last newsletter! Cochins are popular and the more members we can round up the better we'll be!

I had a good time meeting a bunch of new people, and visiting with those that I already knew! It was nice to finally put faces to the names that I regularly see in print! Congratulations to all of the members that showed at the Western National! There were some really nice examples of our breed! Thanks Mark, for your hospitality!

One of the neat things that the MSPA did was to hold an auction on Saturday afternoon, complete with auctioneer Dave Laatsch (a man of many talents). I attended the event because they were auctioning off an original picture by A.O. Schilling. It was an example of the process he used to make copper plates for making duplicate prints. They waited until almost last to auction it off and I threw my hand in the air right from the start. It proved to be more popular of an item than I thought it would be, but I prevailed! I was pretty determined to take that home with me! What is really interesting about the photo is that you can see all of his touch ups that he did before he was satisfied with it enough to start making copies. He added feather outlines to provide more definition and whited out background areas that weren't wanted etc. It is a print from 1933 of a Black Cochin Bantam Trio bred and owned by Empire Bantam Yards. Poughkeepsie, NY. If anyone happens to know who was the proprietor of Empire Bantam Yards, I'd be interested to know, since that is the neck of the woods where I grew up!

The Eastern National took place in Greensboro, NC, on December 6-7, 2003, and was hosted by the Guil-Rand Fowl Fanciers. This was a somewhat smaller show than the MSPA show, but there were a large number of Cochins. In fact there were 76 Large Cochins in attendance! It seems that 2003 was the year for Black Cochin Bantams to sweep the top honors at our Nationals. Otes Ray's Black Bantam hen was selected as the Overall Champion Cochin and she went on to take the Super Grand Champion of the Show honors! A very nice bird! Congratulations Otes! The Black and White Bantam classes were very deep with quality birds throughout and Melody Jonas had her ands full choosing the top birds in each class! There were also nice classes in the Buff, Brown Red, Birchen, Mottled, and Columbian Bantams, but was really strange was that there was not a single Blue Cochin Bantam at the show! The large Cochin class was exceptional! When I walked in the show hall and saw that Bill West was there, I knew I was going to see some outstanding big Buffs! I was not disappointed! Although his were the only Buffs there, he entered an impressive display, and his Buff Cockerel went on to take the Reserve of Breed. So what was Best of Breed? A top-notch Black Hen by Beth and Jerry Smith. She truly was a great Cochin! Nice head, good depth of body, broad across the back, with a full cushion and full tail! She went on to take the Champion Large Fowl of the Show honors as well! Congratulations Beth and Jerry, and to all of our members who took the time to travel the extra distances it sometimes takes to make our National meets!

I met Dennis at the airport in Raleigh and we drove over to the show together. It was great to get together again! I've been to his house before, but we haven't visited in person in a couple of years! We had a real nice dinner at a Soup and Salad buffet place on the way to Greensboro, and of course talked chicken! He is making some real good progress with his big Buffs!

It is nice to see more interest in our Large Cochins lately! The show numbers are up and the varieties being shown are increasing! I appear to have filled up another full page so, will cut this short for now. As you may have guessed, I can talk about Cochins until the cows come home!

Secretary's Notes:

SO YOU WANT A COCHINS INTERNATIONAL MEET AT THE SHOW YOU ATTEND AND THERE IS NOT ONE!!!

First don't panic nor get mad. What do you do? There may be many reasons why a show is not "placed" or show up in the Premium List. Paper work delayed in the mail or maybe even lost, I am not going to address why the show is not placed, however will suggest what to do. First, Cochins International has three types of meets: REGIONAL, DISTRICT, AND NATIONAL. The club places one Eastern National and one Western National each year where points and trophies are awarded. Only one meet is labeled as a District meet in a given area where points and trophies also are awarded. Remember that a District meet may not also be awarded where there is a national show. All shows which have at least two Cochins International members showing in the show may have a National, District or Regional meet. Encourage your District Director to send paper work for show placement to the respective show secretaries well in advance of the shows for the Regional shows. I know some District Directors look in Poultry Press or other areas where shows are advertised and will send the paper work before it is requested, this is an excellent way to promote the Cochin breed. Remember that this is great free advertising for the club and a great way for you to earn points. What, you don't know what district you are in or your director? Well, just look inside the cover of this and each newsletter, Tom Roebuck Jr. has a permanent page which lists the districts, directors, officers and additional information. kindly send your District Director an e-mail or call and ask if paper work has been sent to the shows you plan to attend. Please be prepared to furnish some information to the District Director in the event they are not familiar with the show. To start this process all needed is the name of show, show location, show dates, and the name of person and address the show report is to be submitted to. Naturally a phone number would be nice in case the show report is returned. After this and in the event you receive a Premium List which does not have the Cochins International placement, contact the District Director again to make sure the information was sent and request that the Director follows up with the respective show secretaries. Finally in the event you arrive at the show and there appears to be no Cochins International Meet placed, kindly ask the show secretary if they have received the paper work. If they have not received the paper work ask them if they would fill one out if sent to them by the Cochins International secretary. Immediately contact me (see inside cover of newsletter) within one week of the show and I will send a REGIONAL MEET form directly to the show secre-I do need the name and address of the secretary of the show along with the name of the show and date of show. Some of the show secretaries work two shows so it is important to have the additional information since this will be filled out the week following the show. I truly hope this helps with placement of meets. Cochins International wants to promote the breed and one way to do it is to place meets at shows. Cochins International members speak up so each open show has a Cochins International Regional Meet.

A Fresh Perspective:

I received the following email from one of our new members. Tina Evans. I met her at the Guil-Rand show and we spent some time going through a couple of the Cochin classes. She is new to exhibition poultry but has experience with other show animals. Not only has she joined our breed club, but she is also involved at the regional poultry club level as well. I already answered her questions she posed in her email, but I did not include my answers here, since they are my opinion for the most part and everyone's opinion differs. I'll let you all ponder what she says and come up with your own answers. If you would like to weigh in on the topics below, feel free to drop me a letter! Tina brings up some interesting questions and observations. I tend to agree with her idea of an additional fee per entry to help offset the judging costs. Maybe not .75 cents, but .25 cents per entry at a 1000 bird show would raise an extra \$250.00 dollars that would go directly to the cost of hiring the judges. Food for thought! She is right though, if we don't take an active interest in the host poultry clubs, we are going to have less and less places to show our birds! There are lots of ways to raise funds to run a show. If you have an idea that you want to share, let us know! ~ter

Tom,

I attended a meeting of the Guil-Rand Fowl Fanciers last night. I was allowed to view the latest financial report which showed expenses and income. It raised some questions of the practices of fowl clubs.

When a club "sponsors" other Breed clubs to come, why doesn't the Breed Club offset the judge expenses by contributing to the fees?

Forgive me referencing to the horse world, but the goals are not much different realistically, and entry fee plus a judge's fee is included in every entry- at least in the horse world. With the National Reining Horse Association, thousands of dollars are collected and prized out but there is a separate judge's fee in the entry for the class.

With the poultry show, the sponsoring (hosting) club could get help from the Breed organizations by having a little financial assist in the way of judge's cap fee or breed club participation contributions.

For example, the judges this time were \$1100.00 (flights and fees) but not including hotel stays. If 1500 birds showed up then a judges fee of say .75 cents a bird could be added to the entries to cover the expense of the judges OR the Breed club could pick up a portion of the judges' tabs with the other Breed clubs. For example 31 clubs were present (at this particular show) so \$35.48 could have been paid by each Breed Club from their respective budgets.

Since Breed clubs are national, it would allow for a larger pooling of resources to raise money than the local clubs can muster. This would allow local clubs to use their entry fees to improve the facilities and accommodations of the incoming show folks. The more generous the host, the more likely people will come to the next shows and such; AND if I'm already traveling a couple of states away to show, what's .75 cents more per entry? Or better yet, my membership dues increased a little to compensate the judging of my birds each year is NO PROBLEM for me! And it makes the Breed Clubs look more appeal-

ing to the Hosts! Scratching each others backs, so to speak. Just look what an opening of invitation you would have if you say to the Sponsors, "We'll offset the judges fees with our own contribution." You should see more and more hosts cropping up for this kind of generosity.

I was very surprised to see that this was not the case. It is in the best interest of the Breed clubs to have the judges, so why aren't they using their funds to pay for them?

I can see how this could impact the smaller local clubs to fizzle out. There seems to be a commonality to have 60 or 90 members and 15 that show up and do the work. This is happening in both NC and Virginia, too bad! When the club chokes out due to trophy purchases and accommodating the birds, what is the point? It's in the Breed Clubs' interest to help these hosts survive.

What has been your experience with the Cochins International Association? How do you raise money and how is the money spent? Prizes alone? Do we pay for your trips to represent the club at theses shows? I would hope.

Can you point me in the direction of some very successful bird fancier clubs? I'd like to see their practices. Thanks for any information. Not trying to be a bull in a China Shop, I just have much energy and a busy mind.

Northeast II District Update:

First of all, let me say thanks to all the Eastern National Exhibitors and the Guil-Rand Poultry Club for a very nice Eastern National. No show is perfect and there were definitely some problems as many of the club members were sick with the flu, but all in all it was a very nice show with some outstanding Cochins being exhibited. Congratulations to all the winners.

The North East District II is still in flux with the Avian Influenza testing requirements that have been imposed by both Pennsylvania and Virginia. I'm currently serving on a committee of the APA to help put together some suggestions on how we should deal with these types of regulations. I've recently heard that in spite of the meeting that was held in PA between the State Animal Health people and the fanciers that the testing reauirement still stands. Many of those in attendance at the meeting felt that there may have been a lessening of the testing requirement; however, the State Veterinarian has decided that all birds coming to shows within that state need to be A.I. tested within a 10 day window of the show. A similar ruling still is in effect in Virginia. Not a good thing for the fancy.

Considering the fact that many states do not have the capability to test for Avian Influenza, it makes it almost impossible for individuals from other states to travel to states that have the requirement. Consider also that the rulings are not laws, voted on by the legislators, but are regulations that were put in place by the administrators of the Animal Health Departments in each of these states.

I've talked with quite a few people about this situation and it may have to become a legal matter to get resolved. If you consider that the most recent A.I. outbreak that occurred in Virginia occurred in commercial poultry operations, why are they requiring that the burden of proof be placed on the fancier and the hobbyist, and not on the commercial industry? I've been informed that despite numerous tests on backyard flocks, in Virginia, the only positive tests for A.I. came from commercial houses! If that is the case, why are we being singled out?

A recourse individuals within these states have, is to contact their state legislators and let them know of their concerns. If enough fanciers speak out, perhaps some common ground can be found to make the requirements more practical.


I know of no fancier that would deliberately spread a disease. As a group, fanciers will go out of their way to protect their birds and are willing to individually treat any birds in their flocks that become sick. How many commercial poultry producers would individually treat a sick bird? I'm not trying to be inflammatory here, but only wanting to point out that the fancy has been inaccurately blamed for the spread of A.I.

On another note, the 2004 district meet will be placed at the Uniontown Poultry Show in the fall in Pennsylvania. I've been assured that birds can be brought into the show on Saturday for two days of the three day event. Regional meets will be placed at spring shows as I get requests.

I certainly hope you have put together some nice breeding pens and that your hatches are plentiful and of high quality.

Bantam Culture Course Lesson on Mating the Columbian Color Pattern

This was actually written for Columbian Wyandottes, so I omitted the portions that were Wyandotte specific. The information on the Columbian pattern is relevant no matter what the breed. ~ter

...For the male, the Standard demands a white neck with a black stripe on the hackle feathers. To breed this in the offspring, there must be as much of it as possible in the male selected for the breeding pen; his wing flights must be black, with an edge of white about the lower web; the small, or pinion feathers, should be edged with white; the main tail feathers, black; the tail coverts black, the lesser coverts edged with white; the under plumage white or slate color. The light slate undercolor is standard.

The female should have a hackle of black with a narrow lacing of silvery white. The wing flights should be black and both the primaries and secondaries should be edged with white. When the wings are folded, the white should hide the black in the secondaries, the main tail feathers should be black except the two top feathers, which are slightly laced with white. The tail coverts, black with a narrow lacing of white. Back is white.

Common to both male and female, the comb, face, wattles and ear-lobes should be red; beak is yellow with a dark stripe down the upper mandible; eyes are reddish-bay and the shanks and toes are yellow.

To breed exhibition offspring that will be strong in color, a light bluish slate undercolor will be best in the parents. Clear surface plumage will come from females having pure white surface and undercolor throughout. An extreme mating consists of a male that has intense black in the main tail feathers and coverts edged with white. The undercolor should have so much blue or slate as almost to show through the surface plumage. The wing flights should be black. Such males mated with females that have perfect black markings in neck, tail coverts, and wings with strong color in the under plumage, very dark wings and an intensely black tail, will produce dark colored chicks, many of which will be culls and a few will be high class exhibition birds. It is important that the comb on both the male and female be standard in all respects and certainly not beefy...

Sex-Linked Plumage Colors (Silver-Gold)

Originally printed in the Poultry Press and titled "Observations" By Leroy Classen

Sex-linked plumage colors in birds - the females have the sex determinate gene. This is different from mammals - where the males have the sex determinate gene. Therefore, in poultry, the genotype and phenotype of the females are the same, as far as sex-linked plumage colors are concerned. Phenotype refers to what you see.

In Silver varieties, the females have one gene for Silver color. Silver males have 2 genes for sex-linked color. Both of them may be Silver of on Silver and the other Gold. This can be determined by breeding the Silver male to a Gold female. If all offspring are Silver, then the male has 2 genes for Silver. You need about 8 chicks to be sure about this and 12 would be more conclusive.

If some of the chicks of this mating are Gold (red) then you are sure that this particular Silver male does not breed true and that he has both a Gold and a Silver Gene for sex-linked plumage color. His genotype and phenotype are not the same. The Silver female breeds true for the Silver color because she only had one gene for sex-linked color. She can only pass this Silver color gene to her male offspring. The other gene that she possesses of the pair of genes is the sex determinate gene and she passes that gene to her daughters with no color attached. They inherit their sex-linked color from their father and that is why we call this color factor sex-linked.

All of the male offspring out of a Silver female will be Silver regardless of the color male she is mated with. We know this to be true because Silver is dominant to Gold (red). If a chick receives one Silver gene from either parent then its sex-linked color will be Silver.

There are Gold and Silver plumage genes that are not linked to sex. These are called Autosomal genes.

Gold and Silver Sebrights have sex-linked colors, as do BB Red and Silver Duckwings of various breeds. There is also a Silver version of the Creole color pattern.

The Gold female breeds true for Gold sex-linked color. The Gold male also breeds true for Gold as both of his sex-linked color genes are Gold. Therefore, his phenotype and genotype are the same.







Bantam Culture Course Lesson on Black Cochin Bantams

The Black Cochin Bantams of today stand out as one of the most popular in the whole bantam family. The bantam fan who is looking for a variety that nearly approaches perfection can find that variety in the Black Cochin.

In some strains of Black Cochins the color is way off inasmuch as it has a distinct purple sheen instead of the lustrous green sheen. Color is very important in Black Cochins because those that do not have it are just left out of the ribbons in any show where there is a bit of real competition. There has been a decided improvement in the color since the under color was changed from black to a slate.

The single mating can be used to produce good Black Cochins, however where space permits and one can properly house sufficient birds for the double mating it is most always advisable to use the double mating method. There are some breeders who do not agree but those who have attained the most success use the double mating system. A double mating can be developed from any single mating bred birds, and once the producers of tip top cockerels and those that produce tip top pullets are identified, they should be separated and the line breeding system adopted. There is no solid set rule as to what the type and color must be for either the single or double mating. Care must be taken to have color that is of the greenish black type and with under color not too light in slate color. Don't expect to mate one season and do wonders with them because in most cases you will not. Study the birds and their offspring and then start the real breeding. Remember you do not need blue ribbon winners to produce birds of like quality. If that were true, very few winners would be sold.

Shape is very important in Cochins. A bird too high on legs is no good while on the other hand one too low on legs is equally as bad. Legs of medium length combined with proper feather will be the first step to a good Black Cochin. A bird with a high head carriage and the tail low is a funny sight seen often in the

exhibition pen of the beginner. The head and tail should almost be of equal height.

Black Cochins like all other Cochins should have a broad deep and well rounded body with legs of medium length. Feathering loose and plentiful and they should be well feathered in cushion, fluff, hocks, shanks and down to the end of the middle toe. Remember that the one main thing that is characteristic of all Cochins is long, soft and fluffy plumage. Head is short and broad and furnished with a neat but rather small single comb. A large comb on a Cochin detracts from its other good qualities, so the smaller the comb the better. Face is smooth and fine texture of skin. A good healthy Cochin will have a bright red comb, wattles and ear lobes. The neck is rather short and thick and neatly arched, with an abundance of hackle plumage. The breast is broad and well rounded. The back should be short and broad. The hackle feathers and tail almost meet on a good bird. Wings short and well tucked up. Improper wing carriage (low carriage, not tucked up) is a fault often found in seemingly otherwise good birds. This is a breeding point that can be helped by careful selection. The tail is full and spreading at the base. The coverts sort of come up and help build up the tail while the feathers in the main tail come up and bend over to give that nice roundness without having to break the feathers to get it. Watch out for the pinched tailed birds as they will pop up most unexpectedly. The thighs are set moderately wide apart and well feathered. Those legs and toes must be well feathered right down to the tip of the middle toe. Legs and toes are yellow in color including the bottom of the feet.

A bird with a vulture hock is not classed as a Cochin in this day and age.

A good Black Cochin is a pretty sight on the lawn and in the show pen. They do well in small runs and are ideal for the city fancier.

Breeding Season Tips

It's that time of year again, and since we have a number of new members who are not only new to the club, but new to the fancy, I thought I would pass on a few helpful hints for the breeding season.


Make sure to keep your cage bedding dry and your housing for your birds draft free. This will promote good health. Feed a good breeder crumble or pellet. The breeder mix has a higher protein content to help the birds along through the rigors of breeding season. In tandem with the quality feed, make sure your birds get plenty of fresh water. In the areas of the U.S. where your Cochins are exposed to freezing temperatures try to give them fresh water twice a day or at least during a time of day where there is ample light left to allow them to drink their fill of water. Water is an important factor in healthy, vigorous birds and good fertility.

If you are breeding your Cochins the natural way vice Artificial Insemination, you are going to need to remove some feathers from around the vent areas of both the male and females. On the males if you decide to clip the feathers, do so around the vent and down a couple inches down toward his abdomen. On the females, trim around the vent and above the vent area. Some breeders trim the tail completely on the female. The general idea is to remove the feathers enough to allow successful mating to take place. Many breeders pluck the feathers instead of clipping them. If this is the method you choose, don't pluck the feathers all at the same time, do it over the course of a couple days, so you don't irritate the skin.

Collect your eggs every day and mark them to identify which cage they came out of. A pencil works well for this. Good record keeping will allow you to track the results of your breeding efforts, once the birds are mature. If you have the room in your incubator, separate your eggs in compartments (these can be made of small gauge mesh wire) at hatching time. This will be a sure fire method of identify your chicks if you have eggs from several pens of the same variety coming off on the same day.

You can toe punch your chicks to keep track of them until they are old enough to band. Some breeders also use parakeet leg bands on the new-born chicks, but you have to keep an eye on them so that they don't cut into the chick's leg as they get older. These small bands can be used until they are old enough to wing band if that is the method you choose.

COCHINS

The Chinese Shanghai fowl came to England and America in 1845. The name of this Asiatic breed was later changed to Cochin. The earliest Cochins were more or less buff in color. Its striking appearance, due to great size and profuse soft feathering, distinguished it from all other known breeds at that early period. Cochins created a sensation in England, resulting in a great boom for the "Cochin China" as it was called in the days of "Cochin Craze".

At that time, four varieties were recognized; namely Buff, White, Black and Partridge, all being admitted to the Standard in 1874.

Both male and female are massive in appearance, with an extraordinary profusion of long, soft plumage and a great abundance of down fiber in the under-fluff, producing a rather bulky appearance, and conveying the idea of even greater weight than actually exists. Hard or closely-fitting plumage is a very serious defect also specimens lacking greatly in size and cushion.

ECONOMIC QUALITIES

Although primarily bred for exhibition, the Cochin is capable of being bred as a meat type fowl. Color of skin; yellow, color of eggshells; brown.

DISQUALIFICATIONS

Vulture hocks, shanks not feathered down the outer sides, outer toes not feathered to last joint, bare middle toes (See General Disqualifications and Cutting for Defects)

SHAPE - MALE

COMB: Single; of medium size, set firmly on head, stout at base, straight from front to rear, low in front; serrations moderately deep, dividing comb into five regular points the middle one highest; free from wrinkles, fine in texture.

BEAK: Short, stout at base, curving to point.

FACE: Smooth, fine in texture.

EYES: Moderately large.

WATTLES: Rather long, well-rounded at lower edges, thin and fine in texture.

EAR LOBES: Smooth, well-defined, about two-thirds as long as wattles.

HEAD: Rather short, broad, deep, prominent over eyes; juncture with neck well defined.

NECK: Short, full, well-proportioned, well arched from rear of head to back. <u>Hackle</u> -- very long and abundant, flowing well over shoulders and cape.

BACK: Short in appearance, very broad and well-rounded; shoulders, very broad, flat under hackle; saddle or cushion rising at base of hackle or cape, long; saddle feathers, flowing over tips of wings and mingling with fluff and under-plumage of tail.

TAIL: Main Tail -- short, well spread at base, filled underneath with profusion of soft feathers. Main Tail Feathers -- broad and overlapping.

Sickles -- short, well-rounded and enveloped by coverts and lesser sickles, showing as little of the stiff feathers as possible; saddle and tail to have soft, round, bulky appearance.

WINGS: Small, carried well-up and well-folded; fronts embedded in plumage of breast; tips nicely tucked under saddle plumage. Wing-Bows -- smooth and exceedingly well rounded. Primaries and Secondaries -- broad and overlapping in natural order when wing is folded.

BREAST: Carried forward, very full, well rounded, of great breadth

and depth.

BODY AND FLUFF: Body -- moderate in length, broad, deep, well-rounded from point of breast to abdomen, well let down between the legs, broad and well-rounded from breast bone to tail, depending more on length of feathers for fullness than on muscular development. Fluff -- soft, full, abundant.

LEGS AND TOES: Legs, set well apart, straight when viewed from front.

Lower thighs -- medium length; large, straight; the more long, soft, outstanding plumage, extending well down the shanks and covering hack joints, the better, having the appearance of two great globes of feathers concealing the legs from view.

Hocks -- covered with flexible feathers, curving inward about the joints; free from vulture like feathering.

Shanks -- short, stout in bone; plumage, long beginning just below hocks and covering front and outer side of shanks, from which it should be outstanding, the upper part growing out from under thigh plumage and continuing into foot feathering. There should be no marked break in the outlines between the plumage of these sections; they should merge naturally into each other and blend together.

Toes -- four on each foot, straight, stout, well spread; middle and outer toes, heavily feathered to ends.

SHAPE - FEMALE

COMB: Single; small, straight and upright; nicely rounded to conform to shape of head; divided into five points; free from wrinkles, fine in texture.

BEAK: Short, stout at base, curving to point.

FACE: Smooth, fine in texture.

EYES: Medium in size.

WATTLES: Small, nicely rounded; fine in texture. **EAR LOBES:** Oblong, fairly well defined, fine in texture.

HEAD: Neat, fairly full in skull, fashioned after that of male, except finer in form.

NECK: Short, nicely arched, plumage, very full, slowing well over shoulders and cape.

BACK: Short in appearance, very broad, well-rounded; shoulders, broad, flat under neck feathers; cushion rising from cape. large, full and round; plumage; profuse, flowing over tips of wings well into thigh plumage and almost covering tail feathers.

TAIL: Short, broad at base, carried rather low; well filled underneath with profusion of soft feathers and nearly enveloped by tail coverts, which help to form the cushion.

Main Tail Feathers -- broad and overlapping.

WINGS: Small, well-folded and carried without drooping; fronts embedded in plumage of breast; tips, concealed between cushion and thigh plumage; wingbows smooth and exceedingly well-rounded. Primaries and Secondaries -- broad and overlapping in natural order when wing is folded.

BREAST: Carried low in front, full, well rounded, of great breadth and depth.

BODY AND FLUFF: Body -- medium in length, broad, deep, full and well rounded from point of breast to abdomen, well let down between legs, full and round from breast bone to tail, with great length and fullness of feather.

Fluff -- full soft profuse.

LEGS AND TOES: Legs set well apart, straight when viewed from front

Lower thighs -- medium length, moderately large, straight; with great profusion of long, soft, outstanding fluff plumage, completely hiding hock and covering shanks almost to feet.

Hocks -- should be well-covered with profusion of soft flexible feathers, curving inward about joints free from vulture-like feathers. Shanks -- short, stout in bone, covered profusely with long plumage.

Toes -- four on each foot, straight, well-spread; middle and outer toes, heavily feathered to ends.
