

Eastern National 2006

As everyone knows our Eastern National was held at the Crossroads of America show on 17-19 November. It was a poultry extravaganza if I've ever seen one! We held a club meeting on Saturday the 18th that was well attended by somewhere in the neighborhood of 60 members. The following are brief notes on what was discussed during the meeting.

Item #1: Perpetual listing of breeders that have passed away. A motion was brought in front of the group that we in some way recognize breeders who were members of Cochins International but have passed away. Several ideas were discussed and the final decision was that we would keep a perpetual list of breeders that have passed away and recognize them in each edition of our Breeders Directory. Passed by majority vote.

Item #2: Change constitution to allow two District Meets per year per district. A motion was made by Kim Aldrich to make a change to the constitution to allow two district meet per year in each district (fall and spring). Motion seconded by Elton Minnich.

Passed by majority vote.

Item #3: Change name of Regional Meet to Special Meet. A motion was made to change the name of our Regional Meet to Special Meet to bring it more in line with the APA/ABA meet naming format to avoid confusion. Passed by majority vote. Item #4: Junior Master Breeder Points were a considerable topic of discussion. The point that was made during the meeting was that we need some sort of MB points system for the junior exhibitors to encourage them to breed, and enter Cochins in the shows, and as recognition of sorts for their hard work. This is not as easy as it sounds and while there is merit to developing our junior program to a greater degree we could not come to solution at the meeting but agreed to explore different ways in which we could enhance our junior membership program.

The changes to our constitution will be made and copies of our by-laws, constitutions and show report forms will be distributed to the current and incoming Officers and Directors. The constitution and by-laws will be published on our web-site once updated.

The final bit of business was to recognize Jimmie Currens for his hard work and dedication to the

fancy and Cochins. Bruce Robinson sponsored a laser engraved wood plaque that was presented to Jimmie by Bruce and myself.



District Report - Canada

2006 was certainly a year with ups and downs in regards to poultry shows in our district but leveled itself out at the end. On the downside, the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto cancelled the poultry show. My family and I always enjoyed a day at the Royal and this year was no exception. While walking through the various exhibits I overheard a conversation between two dairy cow exhibitors indicating Avian Influenza is a real concern it is a good thing none of those backyard bird keepers are allowed to show birds at this fair, I guess everybody is entitled to their opinion, but ironic part was that the commercial poultry industry was allowed to exhibit their birds at the very same fair.

On the upside, a new show opened its door to accommodate poultry exhibitors "The Great Lakes Poultry Classic" took place on Nov. 25th, 2006 in London, Ont. The show earned high marks from exhibitors; some of whom traveled a great distance to attend this show. Impressive was the computerized coop tag system, exhibitor check-in system and the detailed exhibitor list. The Junior exhibitors sure made a strong showing.

Well the show season is over here, the last Regional meet was on Dec.9th, in Woodstock, Ont. I have attended more shows this year than ever before and it as been very satisfying to notice that visitors at the shows asking questions and showing interest in our Cochins. It is great to see large numbers of Standard Cochins been exhibited and the quality of birds is improving. Breeders should be congratulated for the never ending challenge to

produce birds that meet the American Standard of Perfection.

While on the subject of standards, I have noticed several Cochin Bantams on Champion's Row that are, in my opinion, simply on the large side. Let's remember the standard weight for Bantam Cochins are: COCK BIRD - 32 oz., HEN - 28oz., COCKEREL - 28oz., and PULLET - 26 oz. In some cases Judges are having a difficult time removing and re-entering birds back into the Bantam Type Cage, an issue we should be aware of. This Year I was instrumental in arranging a total of eight Cochin meets within our district including one district meet. The number of new Cochin entries are increasing and the quality of birds is improving.

All the best in 2007 and hope to see you at the shows.

District Report – International

I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season! The majority of the focus in our hobby for the last several months of 2006 was the great Crossroads of America Show, Indianapolis, Indiana. Twelve thousand (12,000) entries!! A show hall that was three (3) football fields long and cochin isles that went forever. All I can say is WOW and CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL THE WINNERS!!!!!!

One important thing to remember as we get back to raising poultry and planning for the coming year is the H5N1 Avian Influenza (bird flu). Recently, World Bank and U.N. Experts have stated that \$1.3 billion more is needed to fight this disease. This is in addition to the almost \$2 billion pledged at a conference in Beijing, China in January this year. Since January, more than fifty (50) countries have experienced outbreaks of the Avian Influenza. There is mounting concern over outbreaks in some of the poorest nations in Africa, i.e., Uganda, Niger, Nigeria, the Ivory Coast, Burkina Faso and Djibouti. Here in the Americas, we have been very fortunate to date. There have been isolated instances in the Great Lakes Area and Maryland (continued on page 10)





where a weaker strain(s) of the H5N1 has been located in waterfowl but has not been deemed a serious threat. Bottom line, it's lurking, so don't neglect your bio-security practices.

This article provides some interesting thoughts on the lighter undercoat, yellow legs, etc., which brought a lot of interest recently on the Cochin Forum. Other articles of interest include "Breeding White Pekin/Bantams" by Art V. Granger, Breeding Blue Pekin/Bantams" by David Plant (Australia), and Breeding Buffs" by Bob Stough (USA). NOTE: Permission to reprint this article was given by the American Bantam Assoc. (ABA) which I only coordinated for the Pekin Bantam.Com Website.] There are also other articles on White, Brown-Red, Lavender, Birchen, Mealy Grey, Porcelain, Blue-Red, Cuckoo and Mottled. This website also has an excellent "Image Gallery". For example, after you open the website, direct your attention to the "pekin bantam pictures" on the left side of the page, click on "barred" and then scroll down to the four (4) thumb nail images. If you then click on the # 2 image, you will see a magnificent specimen of a barred pullet. She is a beauty and certainly worth the time!

Things in the North East II District are moving onward, but we are still plagued by inconsistencies in the A.I. Testing requirements for some of our states. While some areas are accepting the once every 90 day testing, others are holding to the 10 days before entry into the state and this is causing a big mess with some of the shows. I am happy to announce that the Delmarva Poultry Fanciers will be teaming up with the Virginia Poultry Breeders Association in hosting the 2007 ABA National in Harrington, Delaware on November 17 and 18. The Delmarva Club will still be holding their spring show on March 30 and April 1, 2007 but the fall show will be a combined effort.

Delaware does not have an A.I. testing requirement, but only requires the same Pullorum test required by most states. This will make it easier for exhibitors to travel into the state. 



District Update - Pacific

Winter in the West is usually a time when it's pretty quiet. The Fall Shows are over & winter conditions with the distance one would have to travel would make shows held at this time of year, a local event. But this year we managed to pull together the birds AND the folks to hold the 2007 Western National at the PPBA Show, the end of January, in Stockton. I'll write more in the next newsletter about the show, and we'll have more results. But for now, you can see some of the great birds and read the overall champions list earlier in this newsletter.

What I find interesting about this year is the increase in the numbers of Cochins being shown Coast to Coast. At the PPBA Show held every January, this spring's show had 402 birds in the Featherleg Class. More than half of those were Cochins, something that hasn't happened in a very long time. While OE continues to be the biggest class with 451, the gap appears to be getting smaller. The SCCL Class has normally held the distinction as the second largest class, but the fact that there were 216 Cochins helped the featherleg group surpass that tradition. With the higher numbers we are also seeing Cochins more often on Champ Row, an event I hope to see repeated — frequently.

All our birds are in the "wait & see" stage. Young birds are maturing & older ones are finishing their annual molt. I showed some of these young birds in November & while the birds placed well conversation with the Judge afterward indicated the birds still need more time to finish. It was a completely correct observation, addressing the challenges of shoeing young birds. An editorial in Poultry Press mentions the weather as being a factor, not only in lower numbers being shown, but also in the delay that is being seen in finishing. While it is surely a factor, my birds are behind because of a later hatching time. They do appear to be maturing as normal & to be basically on track to finish at the same time they always have. By January they should be ready for spring shows.

With this "wait & see" period I find myself thinking ahead to next years breeding pens. While it may be a bit early to be thinking of such thing, I can always blame it on the Weather.

Hope everyone has raised a great bunch of "Stars" that prove Cochins are the birds to beat at the upcoming shows.

Purely my personal impressions of what I would like to take home: Tom Roebuck's buff large




