The 2015-16 Breeder Directories were all mailed November 30th. I want to thank everyone who participated, and a special thank you to those who supported the Directory with your advertising. Two new features were added to the Directory this year: 1) Preferred method of contact for Breeders; and 2) Members that have indicated they are available to help mentor someone. While the Directories are available to members only, all ads purchased for the Directory are on the CI website for public viewing, as are links to member websites that were submitted in the breeder listings. (See 'Member Links/Ads') We have 500 Directories printed – approximately one-half are mailed out to current members when the Directory is published; the remaining are distributed over the next two years in new member packets. Our Online Shows are back this winter – we are cooping in the February entries as I write this. For those of you familiar with the shows, you know they have proven to be a great learning tool. For those of you that are unfamiliar with the shows, I urge you to take a look at them on the Club website. These are NOT photo contests. The highlight of every show is the Judge's Commentary. This winter, we are proud to have Judge Michael Sayre join us!

In November, the Board of Directors approved two new award programs. John Burgess brought to us a fantastic concept to honor our Master Breeders who, for health or other reasons, have been forced to retire. The "Legacy Awards" will be made annually in the honorees' home District for the Variety in which they earned MB status. Honorees are subject to nomination and Board approval on an individual case by case basis. Should a duplicate award situation arise, it will be addressed by the BOD at that time. The following were unanimously approved as the first honorees, beginning with their respective District shows in 2016:

- a) Jimmie Currens Legacy Award / Annually at the North Central District Meet for Best Bantam White
- b) Otes Ray, Sr. Legacy Award / Annually at the Southeast District Meet for Best Bantam Black

c) Bill Ziehm Legacy Award / Annually at the Northeast 1 District Meet for Best Bantam Black

The second new award program is the Annual Exhibitor Awards. While they are based on Master Breeder points earned during each calendar year, it is important to know that they do NOT affect the Master Breeder Program. Below is the text of the award program, which will kick off with calendar year 2016:

Cochins International Annual Exhibitor Awards:

Cochins International recognizes those Exhibitors that have demonstrated outstanding achievement by earning the most Master Breeder Points ⁽¹⁾ on an annual basis (January 1 thru December 31) of every year. Certificates for "Exhibitor of the Year" will be awarded in the following categories ⁽³⁾:

Exhibitors earning the most MB points in every Standardized (2) Bantam Variety

Example: Exhibitor of the Year – Black Bantam Cochins

Example: Exhibitor of the Year – Silver Laced Bantam Cochins Example: Exhibitor of the Year – Mottled Bantam Cochins

***** Exhibitors earning the most MB points in every Standardized (2) Large Fowl Variety

Example: Exhibitor of the Year – White Large Fowl Cochins Example: Exhibitor of the Year – Partridge Large Fowl Cochin Example: Exhibitor of the Year – Barred Large Fowl Cochins

- **Exhibitor earning the most combined MB points in all Standardized** (2) Bantam Varieties combined Example: Exhibitor of the Year Bantam Cochins
- **Exhibitor earning the most combined MB points in all Standardized** (2) Large Fowl Varieties combined Example: Exhibitor of the Year Large Fowl Cochins
- 1) Master Breeder Points earned based on existing Cochins International Master Breeder Point Program.
- 2) Non-Standard Varieties, and any MB points earned in Non-Standard Varieties, are not eligible toward Annual Exhibitor Awards.
- 3) In the event of a tie in MB points earned, dual awards will be given.

The Cochins International website (<u>www.CochinsInt.com</u>) continues to have 800 – 1000 visitors every month. We receive good reviews and recommendations in the social media forums for our Educational Articles, Variety Photos Page, Show Albums, and Online Shows. Did you know we even have a page dedicated to all our Club Merchandise? Official Club News is always available to you in-between Newsletters on our News Page. One of my goals for 2016 is to add a Video Library to our Education page.

I have on my list of things to include in this article a reminder to all of you to renew your 2016 dues, but I'm sure that is being said by every other Director, so I'll just remind you that YES - you can renew via PayPal, and YES - you can pay for more than one year at a time!

One other important bit of business I want to point out is that 2016 is an election year for Cochins International – **ALL Officers and Director Positions will be up for election this fall.** This is YOUR club – whether you want to get more involved by running for a Board position or just by volunteering at a Meet near you, our Club is only as good as our member participation. Club ambassadors are always welcome to help man our tables at our District Meets, and we can always use more photographers and reporters to send us photos and results from shows you are attending.

I am tentatively planning on attending the Heart of America Show in Hutchinson, Kansas in April. I went two years ago for the APA Semi-National, and had a fantastic time! It's a double show, and I hope to see you there!

After focusing for the past few years on Golden Laced Bantams, I expanded my horizons a bit this past year by adding Lemon Blues and Brown Reds, with many thanks to Ivy Young! I'm looking forward to the challenges these beautiful Varieties are sure to bring!


Cochins International Winter Online Show:

NE II Report - Rich Barczewski

Avian influenza is still a topic on many poultry fanciers' minds as we move forward into the Spring Show Season. The recent outbreak in Indiana has put a lot of states on edge and we have heard of several states in our region having more restrictive rules in place regarding testing and exhibitions. The major thing for all of us in the fancy to remember is that we are responsible for our own biosecurity and as individuals we need to do everything in our power to protect our birds and those of our fellow exhibitors.

Each of us has to be careful and make our own decisions as to when we decide that going to a show or swap or sale isn't worth it anymore because of the risk. As an exhibitor, be especially mindful of your own birds and if you are having health problems in your flock, regardless of what they might be, don't take them to any shows. Avoid places that other bird folks frequent and make sure you are not the one who spreads any disease. We all have an obligation to prevent the spread of this and any other disease.

In talking to some of my state animal health folks, I learned that the reason this last small outbreak was contained was because the department of Ag folks in Indiana jumped on it and depopulated the flocks as soon as they found out they had the disease. They didn't wait for confirmation of the diagnosis as was the case last fall, but depopulated the flocks immediately, that action was key to preventing the spread of AI this winter.

Now onto other items in the district: the NE II district meet will be held at the Delmarva Poultry Fanciers 40th Annual Show which will be held on April 2 and 3, 2016 in Harrington, Delaware. This show will also be the Semi-Annual meet of the American Poultry Association. If you have never been to this show, it is worth the trip. Health requirements include AI testing within 30 days of the show in addition to the standard Pullorum testing. For complete information on the show, you can download a copy of the premium list from the clubs website at www.delmarvapoultryfanciers.com. Click on the forms heading and then the premium list section.

With spring fast approaching I'm sure that some of you are getting the incubators up and running and putting your breeding pens together if you haven't already done so. For me, this time of year is always the most exciting as we look forward to the improvements that we hope to make in the next generation of our birds. I certainly wish you the best in your breeding programs and look forward to seeing your accomplishments at an upcoming show this fall.



This report was due for submission just days after Alberta's first poultry show of the year, the 14th Annual Show hosted by North Central Alberta Poultry Association. This year's show was held in Wetaskiwin on January 30th and 31st and was judged by Jonathan Patterson from Indiana. Exhibiting at mid-winter shows sometimes requires a bit more effort and the weather can be chancy, but this year the temperatures made it feel like spring. I always have a good time there and look forward to attending. The Large Cochins came out on top amongst some tough competition, with Kathy Stevenson's Black Cochin hen winning Champion Large Fowl, as well as Reserve Overall Show Champion.

In other show news, the Colwyn Championship Showcase took place at Fergus Ontario on September 26th. There was an excellent showing of 69 Cochins at this CI Meet including 51 Bantams and 18 Large Fowl. Bantam varieties included Black, Blue, Buff, Golden Laced, Splash and White. EDUCATION PIECE

Poultry - This articles comes from the HOBBY FARMS annul issue March/April 2011.

As a species, poultry are fairly resistant to worms, and problems lonely occur when their immune systems are overwhelmed by a high number of parasites.

Large roundworms are most problematic in backyard flocks. Severe infestations can cause nutrition malabsorption, intestinal blockage and death. The parasites' eggs are passed in the droppings, which infect birds when they eat feces and contaminated feed and water. Cleanliness is important of safeguard against roundworms.

The ceca worm is another common parasite seen in small flocks. The worm lives in the bird's cecum and can transmit the organism that causes blackhead disease in turkeys. Earthworms ingest the parasite's egg, and turkeys eat the worms and become infected with this disease. This is why turkeys and chickens shouldn't be kept together, and turkeys should never follow chickens in pasture rotation.

Coccidia are common protozoan parasites, and there are several species that affect chickens and turkeys. Coccidia causes bloody diarrhea. "Many chickens will develop immunity to Coccidia," says Patricia Wakenell, DVM, PhD, associate professor of avian diagnostics at Purdue University. "But if the area is overstocked and eggs from this parasite build up, even the immunity can become overwhelmed. To reduce the pathogen load, till the soil over ever month, pour bleach on top, and let it dry before putting the birds back. You may have to reduce the number of poultry on that piece of ground if you continue to have a problem."

Deworming livestock is a big subject, and it's one that veterinarians and researchers study closely. Parasites are ever evolving and developing resistance. "It is important that animal owners understand that there is no recommendation or treatment plan that can fit all of their individual needs and circumstances, "says Dr. Hawkins. For the best results and a healthy barnyard work with your veterinarian to create a parasite-management plan.

Code of Conduct Disciplinary Action:

The Board of Directors recently took action to remove a member from our rolls. A formal hearing, as prescribed by ARTICLE VI, Section 4, of the Disciplinary Actions of the Constitution was held concerning the conduct of a COCHIN

member. Evidence was presented and discussed followed by an oral vote of Board of Directors. The member in question was permanently expelled from the organization.

The Board of Directors of Cochins International takes issues of member conduct very seriously and feels that only in the most extreme circumstances should a member be sanctioned or removed from the club. Unfortunately, recent occurrences by one of our members have resulted in the Board taking action to remove that member from our rolls. A formal hearing, as prescribed in Article VI, Section 4 of the Disciplinary Actions of the Constitution was held concerning the conduct of one of our members.

Evidence was presented and discussed and followed by an oral vote of the Board of Directors. The vote resulted in the member in question being permanently removed from our organization. No member should ever have to worry about being barred from an organization, however, when individuals act in such a way that is contrary to the purpose and function of the organization, or negatively impacts other members, action must be taken to preserve the integrity of the organization.

CODE OF CONDUCT - Article VI of Cochins International By-Laws

In order to promote values such as integrity, service and friendship, education in promoting purebred poultry and to maintain consistency throughout the poultry fancy, Cochins International will adopt the American Bantam Association (ABA) Code of Conduct as follows:

Purpose:

- 1. Provides a democratic and orderly process to address activities that may have a negative impact to the integrity, operation and long term health of Cochins International.
- 2. Promotes values that maintain the strength and longevity of Cochins International.

Grounds for Disciplinary Actions:

- 1. Theft or any other actions that impact or compromise the financial integrity of Cochins International.
- 2. Organized or individual attempts to purposely slander or discredit the integrity or stature of Cochins International, its Officers, Regional Directors and/or the general membership.
- 3. Misrepresentation of Cochins International credentials, logo, property, etc., for the purpose of personal gain.
- 4. Discrimination and harassment based on race, color, religion, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, or any other class.
- 5. Violence or threats of violence.
- 6. Any additional actions that result in significant negative impact to Cochins International.

Procedures for Addressing Code of Conduct Violations:

- 1. The Board of Directors will conduct an appropriate hearing to validate or disprove any of the above violations.
- 2. The discussion/hearing shall be held at the next scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors. (If there is an immediate need to discuss or address an urgent issue, other forms of Cochins International / May, 2014 Page 7 communication/discussion may be used including e-mail, phone, conference, etc.)
- 3. Recommended disciplinary actions must be passed by a majority vote of the Board of Directors of Cochins International.
- 4. Disciplinary steps as agreed upon by majority vote will be communicated by the President of Cochins International.

Disciplinary Actions:

Any member who fails to maintain adherence to the Cochins International Code of Conduct is subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to the following in any order or combination:

- 1. Verbal warning issued by any member of the Executive Board of Cochins International.
- 2. Written warning issued by Cochins International.
- 3. Membership suspension for six months or greater.
- 4. Permanent membership suspension.

All final disciplinary actions and decisions are up to the complete discretion of the Board of Directors of Cochins International

Master Breeder and Merit Awards

 Members earn Master Breeder points based on the number of Cochins exhibited at shows which host Cochins International meets. There are currently three Master Breeder point total recognition levels:

Gold: 500 Points Earned in One Variety / Master Breeder Status and Plaque
 Silver: 250 Points Earned in One Variety / Merit Certificate of Achievement
 Bronze: 100 Points Earned in One Variety / Merit Certificate of Achievement:

- Master Breeder points will be allowed for all recognized and non-recognized color Varieties of Cochins and points can only be gained within the breed. The program is based on one point for every five birds shown.
- The ultimate goal is 500 points in not less than five years in any one variety.
- Membership must be current to qualify for Master Breeder points. If an individual has lapsed membership for one
 year or more, the points will be removed from the records unless all absent years' of outstanding membership dues
 are paid back in full.
- NOTE: For historical purposes, former members achieving 100 or more points in a variety will be recorded and maintained indefinitely (See ARTICLE IV, By-Laws).
